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Introduction

This sewing pattern was obtained by reverse engineering an MPPP Verity plushie produced by Olyfactory.

Is it legal? Yes. Is it a dick move? Not really, Olyfactory already agreed to share sewing patterns with MPPP. Apparently, the sharing part was delayed a bit, so we took the matter into our own hands. We have to do it now because the USA-China trade wars might put the MPPP collaboration with Olyfactory at risk, and we might have to provide this pattern to someone else.


The Sewing Pattern Templates


The following pages contain the templates for the pieces required to make a Verity plushie. The template pages are scaled 1:1 to A4 paper size. They can be printed as a full-page photo.


- "Cut X pieces Y reverse": cut X Y pieces like that and Y mirrored pieces (flip the template)
- "[COLOR]": use the fabric of this color
- "{EMBROIDERY}": embroider fabric before cutting
- "{THREAD_COLOR}": use the threads of this color for embroidering








Sewing the pieces together


This sewing instruction uses staples and safety pins for sewing, and steel wool for mane & tail stuffing because they provide better visibility for the instruction steps, but they are not recommended for regular plushies.

Here is the legend for the sewing steps:




Tail

Take the tail pieces and align them so that the front sides face each other, then sew them together, leaving a gap.






Turn the tail inside out through the gap and stuff it.






Head

Take the forehead piece and sew it to the head gusset piece from the back side.






Fold the head gusset piece in half so that its front sides face each other, then sew it to itself.






Take the head pieces and sew together the small gaps in

their template from the back side.






Take the ear pieces and align them so that the front sides face each other, then sew them together, leaving gaps.






Turn them inside out through the gaps.






Take one of the head pieces and the head gusset piece, align them so that their front sides face each other, and partially sew them together.






Take one of the ears, place it between the head piece and the head gusset piece (pointing inside the head), and then complete sewing the head piece to the head gusset piece.






Repeat this with the other head piece and sew together the






Body

Take the body pieces and align them so that their front sides face each other, then partially sew them together.






Take one of the belly pieces, align it so that its front side faces one of the body pieces' front side, then partially sew them together.






Take one of the front leg pieces, align it so that its front side faces the body piece's front side, and sew them together.






Sew the front leg piece to the belly piece.






Take one of the hoof pieces, align it so that its front side faces the body piece's front side and the front leg piece's front side, then sew them together.







Take one of the back leg pieces, align it so that its front side faces the body piece's front side, and sew them together.








Sew the back leg piece to the belly piece.




Take one of the hoof pieces, align it so that its front side faces the body piece's front side and the back leg piece's front side, then sew them together.






Sew the remaining part of the belly piece to the body piece and repeat the previous Body steps for the other body






Take the sewn head and sew it to the body pieces and the belly pieces.






Turn the sewn head inside out.





Take the sewn tail, put it between the body pieces, and





Align the body pieces so that their front sides face each

other, and sew them together.




Align the belly pieces so that their front sides face each other, and partially sew them together.





Turn the sewn body and the legs inside out.





Stuffing

(Optional) Put a small flashlight in the head.

Start with stuffing the head.



(Optional) Stick felt pads to the hooves from the inside.

Proceed with stuffing the legs.



(Optional) Put "bones" (e.g. bamboo sticks wrapped in electrical tape) inside the legs after stuffing. The ends of the "bones" located inside the body can be stuck together for more durability.



Proceed with stuffing the body until the plushie can stand. Fix any holes appearing due to the increased pressure.




Sew the belly after the stuffing is finished.






Mane

Take the Mane A pieces and align them so that the front sides face each other, then sew them together, leaving a gap.






Turn this part inside out through the gap and stuff it.






Sew the gap to close it.






Take the Mane B pieces and align them so that the front sides face each other, then sew them together, leaving a gap.






Turn this part inside out through the gap and stuff it.






Sew the gap to close it.






Take the sewn Mane A piece and pin it to the body.






Proceed with pinning the Mane A piece to the head.













Take the Mane B part and pin it to the head.










Sew the Mane A and Mane B parts together.





And it's done! (You) have a Verity plushie now!
