



DELHI CM NOD TO CAB AGGREGATOR SCHEME

Bike taxis can ply only the electric kind

EXPRESS NEWS SERVICE NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 17

DELHI CHIEF Minister Arvind Kejriwal has approved the much awaited 'Delhi Motor Vehicle Aggregator and Delivery Service Provider Scheme', which legalises bike taxis and outlines comprehensive regulation and licensing of appbased aggregators and delivery service providers.

Bike taxis. however, have to be completely electric, with the policy curtailing the presence of petrol or diesel-fuelled bikes. Apart from this, the government has also set timelines for other modes of vehicles — both passenger service providers and delivery service providers — to convert to electric. The file now awaits the Lt-Governor's approval, following which the policy will be notified.

Kejriwal, in a statement shared by the government, said the scheme "marks a significant milestone in Delhi's fight against pollution". He said Delhi has become the first state/UT in India, and among very few cities globally, "to mandate a time-bound

transition of commercial vehicle fleet of aggregators, delivery service providers and e-commerce entities to zero-emission electric vehicles".

Transport Minister Kailash Gahlot said it is the first time in the country "that any aggregator scheme has defined targets for them to convert their fleet into e-vehicles, promoting green and sustainable mobility in the city".

"... this scheme is poised to usher in a new era of transportation services in Delhi," he said, adding that the scheme "holds the potential to not only safeguard our environment but more significantly, enhance the well-being of citizens of Delhi".

The government, through this policy, aims to convert fleets of all aggregators and delivery service providers to electric by

The policy, however, does not mention anything about surge pricing. Sources in the government said, "Aggregators will have to follow the price set by the government for taxis in Delhi."

The scheme also prevents operators /e-commerce entities running delivery and passenger services from getting licences to operate buses, limiting them to two-, three- and four-wheelers. Once notified, the scheme

mandates that all existing or new operators obtain a licence within 90 days of notification or before commencing operations. Licences will be valid for five years, with annual fees applicable, and zero fees in case of electric vehicles. A 50% rebate is also provided for vehicles that are less than two years old.

"The scheme is stringent in enforcing compliance, with violations attracting monetary penalties ranging from Rs 5,000 up to Rs 1,00,000 per instance,"

'Botched probe', torture claims: Behind the acquittal of accused in the Nithari killings

UNSATISFACTORY 'EVIDENCE', procedural loopholes, improbable possibilities, alleged tutoring and torture — the Allahabad High Court judgment in the Nithari case comes down heavily on both the Uttar Pradesh Police and the CBI's investigation which began in the mid-2000s.

In acquitting Surinder Koli and Moninder Singh Pandher accused of raping, killing and dismembering several minors and a domestic help — the court pointed to a brazen violation of basic norms of collecting evidence. But the most crucial of them all was "failure" to probe the "possible" angle of organ trade.

In its judgment, the court noted that the house of the accused was adjacent to one belonging to a doctor who "apparently was a suspect in a case of organ trade (kidney transplant)". It said that despite specific recommendations made by the high-level committee constituted by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, investigators did not look into the matter, calling it a "betrayal of public

trust by responsible agencies". The court also pointed to the



testimony of a local resident, saying he saw a human hand with flesh covered in polythene when he jumped the wall towards the drain in March 2005 - from where skeletal remains were recovered — to recover a cricket ball. "He claims that on enquiry from elders, he was informed that police had come and assured that there is nothing to worry (about)," the order stated.

While Koli was acquitted in 12 cases, Pandher was acquitted in two cases. Both had been awarded the death penalty in these cases relating to rape, murder, destruction of evidence among other charges by a CBI court in Ghaziabad. In 10 of the cases, Koli was the sole accused while in two cases, he was accused along with Pandher.

Calling the prosecution's case circumstantial, the court highlighted several procedural lapses.

On arrest

While the defence alleged the arrest was made on December 27, 2006, the prosecution said it was made two days later. The court said the prosecution had failed to prove the circumstance of the arrest and there was no arrest memo on record.

Disclosure statement

The court noted that the accused's disclosure statement was not placed on record and prosecution evidence regarding the place and time of making the alleged disclosure statement is "full of contradictions". It is for this reason, the court stated, that discovery of bones, skull, or skeletons recovered from the drain behind the house can't be placed in evidence.

The sole independent prosecution witness said a large crowd had already gathered at the spot when he arrived, which the court when his confession was being

says suggests "some incriminating material had already been found". The witness also admitted digging at the spot had already started by the time he arrived.

Confession

Calling the failure to comply with requirements of recording confessions "shocking", the court raised questions about the 60day-long police and CBI custody for Koli. It said that CBI's explanation that there were different investigating officers in the 16 separate FIRs lodged against him was "not convincing" and that if Koli had already confessed to the police on December 29, 2006, "there is no reason as to why he was not produced before the Magistrate before March 1, 2007, for recording of his confessional statement".

"Accused, at the first opportunity, retracted from confession and alleged he was brutally tortured while in police custody. He offered to be medically examined as his genitals were burnt and his nails had been extracted but the accused was not examined medically," the court said.

"There was no legal aid given to the accused and legal aid given for 5 minutes by the ACMM, Delhi on March 1, 2007, amounts to its denial... no legal aid was given to the accused... at the time video-graphed," it said, adding that there was no independent corroboration of murder, rape or cannibalism in the confession with other evidence and that the events mentioned in the confession were "highly improbable".

Slamming the investigators the court said the "casual and perfunctory manner" in which important aspects were dealt with "is most disheartening." The court also said it appeared the investigation opted for the easy course of "implicating a poor servant" of the house by "demonising him" without probing aspects of possible organ trading.

Speaking about Pandher's

to walk free, Koli will remain in prison as he is serving life sentence in another case related to the killings. His lawyer, Payoshi Roy, said, "... We will approach the SC in the light of this judgment. He has been acquitted on the basis of the same evidence

Yamuna revival: NGT seeks fresh **CPCB** report

New Delhi: Terming the status reports on the rejuvenation of the Yamuna submitted by states and authorities "deficient" and "cryptic," the National Green Tribunal Tuesday directed the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) to to verify the facts and figures in them, and to "file a comprehensive report reflecting the correct position".

The CPCB informed the tribunal that 44 drains discharge waste water into the Yamuna and that sewage flowing into Yamuna exceeds the treatment capacity.

The Delhi government said, the "water quality of river Yamuna has improved in the period of January 2023 to September 2023," compared to the corresponding period in 2022.

The matter was being heard by the Tribunal's Principal Bench headed by Chairperson Prakash Shrivastava. ENS

Rai's suggestions for NCR to fight pollution

POSSIBILITY OF allowing the entry of only electric or CNG public transport vehicles from NCR states into Delhi is among the suggestions that Environment Minister Gopal Rai seeks to discuss with his counterparts in NCR states to control pollution levels in the national capital.

Rai wrote to Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change Bhupender Yadav Tuesday, requesting a meeting be held of all environment ministers in the NCR, urging them to "take effective steps".

Other points Rai had listed to be discussed with other NCR states include putting a stop to instances of stubble burning; ensuring all industrial units in NCR that still run on dirty fuel switch to PNG; ensuring brick kilns use zigzag technology; providing electricity in all housing societies in the NCR to prevent use of diesel generator sets; a complete ban on firecrackers in the NCR like the one that is in place in Delhi; and diverting traffic that is not destined for Delhi through the Eastern and Western Peripheral Expressways.

"In the winter, pollution levels turn severe. The Delhi government is taking various measures under the winter action plan like an anti-dust campaign, efforts to control pollution levels at the hotspots... But till sources of pollution in the NCR states are not controlled, these steps that are

BLURRED FOOTAGE from a local eatery, a stolen phone, and fingerprints on utensils — this is how the Delhi Police caught seven people, including two juveniles, for allegedly murdering realtor Sanjay Kumar (50), his wife Jyoti (48) and their son Pawan (23), inside their house in Rajinder Nagar in 2016.

The murders came as a shock to residents of the Central Delhi locality as the bodies were found hidden inside the house — in a cupboard. Jewellery and cash were missing.

A team led by Joint Commissioner Parmaditya (who was then DCP) had initially found the son's

body, wrapped in a blanket to make it look like he was sleeping. "We thought he had been murdered by his parents who fled. It was then found that

his parents were also killed," he said. "It was a complete blind case.

Later we found Sanjay's call records; there was an unknown number in the call logs," said ICP Parmaditya. The investigating officer,

CRACKING

Inspector Rajvir (currently posted as SHO Vikaspuri), said: "The accused had meticulously planned the murder. It was a near-perfect plan since they used a stolen phone and SIM to contact Sanjay and gain entry to his house.'

Police also found leftover food at the house and traced it to a local eatery. Witness statements and blurred camera footage from

cused. Further, fingerprints on the utensils that matched with those of the accused cemented the case.

The accused — Rajan Singh, Rajendra Singh, Sanjay Kumar, Harender, Ram Kishore and the two iuveniles — al-

legedly committed the crime on January 9, 2016, and were arrested a week later. According to po-

lice, three years before the murder, Rajan, the mastermind, was in Tihar jail for a

rape-murder case while Sanjay was also jailed for cheating. "Sanjay had bragged about making big deals... Even after they were released, he kept in touch with Rajan and told him once he earned lakhs for a house. Rajan, thinking Sanjay had stored cash at his house, formed a gang (to target him)," said an officer.

They met Sanjay on the pretext of buying property. Some among the accused took Sanjay to his room where they strangled him to death. The accused then strangled Pawan with his mother's dupatta. Police said

the shop helped police nail the ac- Ivoti, who was also strangled, was the last to be killed.

However, the accused were "disappointed" to find only Rs 46,000 cash and some jewellery. It was after the crime, police said, that they went out to buy food and liquor which they consumed at the victim's house. The probe also revealed one of the accused was using a phone with an automatic call-recording feature. "Their entire plan was captured

HC allows plea against trial court order

AAP MP Raghav Chadha won't have to vacate his bungalow for now after the Delhi High Court Tuesday allowed his plea against the trial court order that had paved the way for the Rajya Sabha Secretariat to dispossess him of it.

Allowing Chadha's plea, Justice Anup Jairam Bhambhani revived the April 18 interim order which stopped the Secretariat from evicting him, observing that it will stay in force until Chadha's application for interim relief before the trial court is decided.

Chadha had moved the High Court against the October 5 order of the Additional District Judge (ADJ) of Patiala house courts, who had vacated an April 18 interim order. Against this interim order, the Secretariat filed a review that was allowed by the ADJ, holding that Chadha had not shown urgency as sought and returned the plaint (a pleading in a lawsuit) to him, asking him to serve a notice to the Secretariat.

The HC Tuesday directed Chadha to re-present the plaint within three days of today's pronouncement. It also directed the trial court to first decide the application and then hear the main lawsuit as per law.

Justice Bhambhani observed that Chadha had sued only the Rajya Sabha Secretariat "as an institution or body" and not its secretary general, who is a person.

As per Section 80(1) of the Civil Procedure Code (CPC), a suit against a public officer or government cannot be filed without giving a two-month notice. However, under Section 80(2), a suit for urgent relief can be filed without giving notice after getting the court's permission; an interim order cannot be passed without hearing the public of-

Rockets were falling as we approached the hospital... we also came to know that there were Hamas attackers at large, but we made it in quick time," he said.

Before October 7, the Barzilai Medical Centre, officially designated as a rural hospital in southern Israel, would see about one gunshot injury in a week. "That day, we suddenly got people with gunshot wounds, fractures, shrapnel injuries in hordes...we got about 60 patients per hour in the first few hours... on the first day itself, we got 250 patients within 10 hours," Dr Lubovsky

Explaining why the right to

marry is not a fundamental right, CJI Chandrachud wrote that "in pursuance of the power conferred by Articles 245 and 246 read with Entry 5 of the Concurrent List, Parliament has enacted laws creating and regulating the socio-legal institution of marriage. The State legislatures have made amendments to such laws with the assent of the President since the subject of marriage is in the Concurrent List. The petitioners seek that the Court recognise the right to marry

Though it concluded that there is no fundamental right to marry, the CJI's ruling said "there is a right or freedom to enter into a union" as laid down in various judgments of the court – Navtej Johar, K S Puttaswamy, NALSA, Shakti Vahini, Shafin Jahan etc – "and that having regard to our constitutional values, which entail respect to the choice of a person whether or when to enter into marriage and the right to choose a marital partner". The three judges, who formed

the majority view, called this the "right to relationship".

Justice Bhat said, "While we agree that there is a right – which we will characterise as a 'right to relationship' to avoid confusion we squarely recognise it to fall within Article 21, as already recognised in the aforecited cases. The right to relationship here includes the right to choose a partner, cohabit and enjoy physical intimacy with them, to live the way they wish to, and other rights that flow from the right to privacy, autonomy and dignity. Justice Narasimha wrote that "it would not be constitutionally permissible to identify a right to a union or an abiding cohabitational relationship mirroring the institution of marriage". Justice Bhat said, "It is reiter-

ated that all queer persons have the right to relationship and choice of partner, cohabit and live together, as an integral part of choice, which is linked to their privacy and dignity. Any further discussion on the rights which consenting partners may exercise, is unnecessary."

Another point of disagreement between the CJI ruling and that of Justices Bhat, Kohli and Narasimha was on the right of queer couples to adopt.

Justice Bhat's ruling, however, said "they "are unable to concur".

It said that if the CJI's view is to be adopted, it "would have disastrous outcomes because the ecosystem of law, as it exists, would be unable to guarantee protection to the said child in the case of breakdown of an unmarried couple, adopting jointly. This, therefore, would not be in the best interest of the child".

"This is not to say that unmarried couples – whether queer or heterosexual – are not capable or suitable to be adoptive parents. However, once the law permits, as it has done – adoption by both single individuals, the likelihood of their joining and cohabiting cannot be ruled out. In such an event,

• PM spells out ISRO goals: Space station 2035, Indian on Moon 2040

The Prime Minister also called on the scientists to work towards a Venus Orbiter Mission and a Mars Lander Mission.

The directions came at a high-level meeting chaired by Modi to assess the progress of Gaganyaan Mission, India's human space flight programme under which the first test vehicle is slated to fly on October 21. The meeting had also been called to outline the future of India's space exploration initiatives, the Prime Minister's Office said in a statement.

"The Department of Space presented a comprehensive overview of Gaganyaan Mission, including various technologies developed so far such as humanrated launch vehicles and system qualification," the PMO said.

"It was noted that around 20 major tests, including 3 uncrewed missions of the Human Rated Launch Vehicle, are planned. First demonstration flight of the Crew Escape System Test Vehicle is scheduled on October 21. The meeting evaluated the mission's readiness, affirming its launch in 2025," it said.

The announcement of three uncrewed missions is significant as previously it was known that there will be two such missions before the final one carrying the astronauts to space.

"Building on the success of the Indian space initiatives, including the recent Chandrayaan-3 and Aditya L1 Missions, the Prime Minister directed that India should now aim for new and ambitious goals, including setting up 'Bharatiya Antariksha Station' (Indian Space Station) by 2035 and sending first Indian to the Moon by 2040," the PMO statement said.

To achieve the ambitious space missions, the Department of Space has been tasked with developing a roadmap for Moon exploration, including a series of Chandrayaan missions, the PMO statement said. The next Chandrayaan mission is likely to

bring back Moon samples.

work on a next generation launch vehicle, a new launch pad, and human-centric laboratories and technologies. Many technologies such as the human-rated launch vehicle, crew escape system, space suit, and the system to maintain the environment inside the crew module are being developed for the first time for the Gaganyaan mission.

"Prime Minister Modi ex pressed confidence in India's capabilities and affirmed the nation's commitment to scaling new heights in space exploration," the PMO said.

The first indication of a sustained human programme and an eventual space station came in 2019 from the then ISRO chief K Sivan. He said the Indian space station is likely to be much smaller, built by combining a couple of modules similar to the current crew module, weighing only 20 tonnes as compared to 450 tonnes of the International Space Station and 100 tonnes of the Chinese Tiangong Space

Station. Preparations for a Venus mission are also underway, with the current ISRO chief S Somanath recently stating that it has already been configured. While he did not provide details of the scientific experiments on the mission, a 2019 proposal had said that there would be 12 payloads, including a thermal camera mass spectrometer and a cloud-

monitoring camera.

In the Mars Mission, India has already sent an orbiter that collected data between 2014 and 2022. The next step would be to send a lander, which the US and China have already achieved Russia also has successfully landed on Mars but their lander stopped working soon after India, on the other hand, did not have lander technology before the Chandrayaan 2 mission; the lander was indigenously developed after Russia backed out following the failure of one of their landers to the Martian moon Phobos.

queer community is not discriminated against because of gender identity or sexual orientation; that there is no discrimination against them while accessing goods and services available to the public; take steps to sensitise the public about queer identity including that it is natural and not a mental disorder; establish hotline numbers which members of the community can contact when they face harassment and violence in any form.

It also directed them to ensure that "treatments" offered by doctors or other persons, which aim to change gender identity or sexual orientation, cease with immediate effect, and that inter-sex children are not forced to undergo operations with regard only to their sex, especially at an age at which they are unable to fully comprehend and consent to such operations.

CJI Chandrachud said police should not force queer persons to return to their natal families if they do not wish to do so and when queer persons file a complaint against the families, police must verify and ensure their freedom is not curtailed.

"Often, instruments of the State which are tasked with protecting human rights, perpetuate violence. Police and prison officials exhibit violence towards the queer community. Lesbian and gay couples often approach the police for protection from family violence... However, instead of granting protection to the couple,

their families," the CJI observed. His ruling directed that "before registering an FIR against a queer couple or one of the parties in a gueer relationship (where the FIR is sought to be registered in relation to their relationship), they shall conduct a preliminary investigation... to ensure that the complaint discloses a cognizable

7 kids injured after van hit by mini bus at Delhi Cantt

AT LEAST seven school children along with their van driver were injured after their vehicle was hit by a mini school bus Tuesday afternoon. The incident took place in Delhi Cantonment when the children, who study at Kendriya Vidyalaya, were returning home.

According to police, the driver of the mini bus, belonging to a private school, was allegedly speeding and driving on the wrong side when he hit the van in front of Radha Krishna Mandir, Sadar Bazaar road.

DCP (Southwest) Manoj C said, "We received a PCR call at 1.18 pm. The van was ferrying students, aged six to seven years. The investigation officer, along with other staff, rushed to the spot... The van was completely damaged from the front and its driver and children were injured."

Police said the children were rushed to Army Cantt Hospital and their parents were informed, who took them to other hospitals. All children were out of danger. "They study at KV No. 1 in Delhi Cantt. The van driver. Balvir Singh (21), was taken to DDU Hospital for further treatment. He is severely injured and is undergoing treatment," said an officer.

The mini school bus driver, Naveen Singh (25), who fled the spot after the incident, has been apprehended, police said.

Police said he is a contractual employee and legal action has been initiated against him.

KILLED 2 LABOURERS TO FAKE HIS DEATH: POLICE

Declared dead in 2004, former Navy man shows up in Delhi, arrested

TILL A few weeks back, former Indian Navy steward Balesh Kumar was considered "dead' by both the Rajasthan and Delhi Police and his family alike. In 2004, he and another person were purportedly charred to death in a truck in Jodhpur. Balesh's father, Chandrabhan (he died in 2021) even identified the body, which was burnt beyond recognition, as that of his son.

In the second week of September this year, however, a Delhi Police team received a tipoff that Balesh may not be dead after all and was living under a different name – Aman Singh – in Najafgarh. Balesh, in fact, was wanted in a murder and a burglary case. The team, comprising inspector Devendra Kumar and sub-inspector Mahak Singh, under the supervision of DCP (Crime) Ankit Kumar, swooped in and arrested the 63-year-old.

According to Special CP (Crime) Ravindra Yadav, Balesh retired from the Navy in 1996 and took to transporting cargo inter-state in a truck, registered in the name of his brother.

In 2000, Balesh, his father and one Rajesh alias Khushiram were involved in a high-profile burglary at Kota House on Shahjahan Road where high-end crockery and other valuable items were stolen from the officer's mess. The trio were arrested and subsequently granted bail.

In 2004, Balesh, along with his brother Sunder Lal, allegedly murdered Rajesh at Samaypur Badli Transport Nagar and disposed of the body in Outer Delhi's Bawana. A police source said, "On the day of the incident, the three men were consuming alcohol. Disappointment, resignation after SC verdict: 'Expected it to be on our side'

SOME SAT in huddles, others anxiously paced about the lawns, and all had phones raised to their ears intently listening to the live stream of the Supreme Court's proceedings. The morning's earlier hubbub had simmered to a hushed, tense silence. After a point, the court's

lengthy verdict was met with confusion. "Are they approving it or not?" one person asked. Eventually, an air of resignation set in once it became clear that the apex court had declined to legalise same-sex marriage.

Aadi, the founder of the Ramjas queer collective, was among those sitting outside the court, eagerly waiting for the five-judge bench's judgment. "This is regressive... I don't have words to express how I feel right now... we were expecting the verdict to be on our side, we need to stop looking down on homosexuality," he cried later.

Amrita Tripathi, partner of

petitioner Rituparna Borah, was attentively listening to the judgment with her headphones on. "I am very disappointed; there is some progress but I don't think it's enough... Apart from marriage rights, there were other things in this petition like adoption rights and the right to have a chosen family, but queer couples should also have the right to marry the person of their choice," she said.

Tripathi also expressed her disappointment in the verdict not getting passed due to the lack of one vote: "The CJI and Justice (Sanjay Kishan) Kaul had come up with some great advice but it

always boils down to one vote." Suhail Abbasi, co-founder of Humsafar Trust and chairperson of the Integrated Network for Sexual Minorities (INFOSEM), said it was time to go back to the drawing board and re-strategise. INFOSEM, a coalition of 110 community organisations, was also a petitioner for equality in marriage rights. Added Abbasi, "We will keep at our fight... we'll have to do stronger advocacy with the parliamentarians somewhere down the line."

Petitioner Aditi Anand said: "The petition (Aditi Anand ANR vs. the UOI) had demanded the right to be included in the Special Marriage Act and the right to marry... The judgment was disappointing, but we have only reached this far due to the judgment five years ago and we recognise constitutional and legal challenges."

For some, not all hope was lost. "Personally I feel grateful to the generations before us, the lawyers and activists who have gone through so much to achieve basic rights for us," said Jayne, from the youth wing of Humsafar Trust. "I agree to a certain degree, that the Supreme Court can't make laws. This is a part of the process and it is not a full stop but a comma," they said.

Others expressed their anger at the verdict. Ankur, a Master's student from JNU, said, "They've put the ball in the legislature's court but how can you expect us to beg the state for our rights when the state has vehemently made a case against it in court?"

Cong's 'modern' vision for MP: IPL team to metro trains to AI centre

Party promises caste census, 27% OBC quota in government jobs and schemes

MADHYA PRADESH'S own Indian Premier League (IPL) team, an artificial intelligence centre, a promise to conduct the caste census, 27% OBC reservation, and sops for women, farmers and the unemployed youth. These are some of the big promises the Congress has made in its manifesto released on Tuesday.

The 106-page document, which lists 59 promises and 101 main guarantees, was unveiled by former Chief Minister Kamal Nath in Bhopal. The manifesto has sops for farmers and unemployed youth, the two major vote banks on which the party has staked its bets. It has also announced a series of promises for women in hopes of eroding the BJP's support base.

Mirroring the pro-women policies of the Shivraj Singh Chouhan government, the Congress has promised to provide women a monthly stipend of Rs 1,500, and LPG gas cylinders for Rs 500. Chouhan routinely attacks Kamal Nath, claiming the Congress leader stopped the Kanya Vivah Yojana in which financial assistance was provided to poor families for their daughters' marriage.

Nath announced the Beti Vivah Yojana under which assistance of Rs 1.1 lakh will be provided. Similarly, on the lines of the Ladli Laxmi Yojana that earned Chouhan the "Mama" tag, the Congress promises to provide Rs 2.51 lakh to girls from birth to their marriage under the "Meri Bitiya Rani Yojana". For farmers, the party has promised loan waivers, free five horsepower electricity for irrigation, waiver of electricity bills, and support price of Rs 2,600 for wheat and Rs 2,500 for paddy, promising to increase it up to Rs 3,000. Under the Nandani Gau Dhan Yojana, the party has promised to purchase cow dung at Rs 2 per kg.

The announcement of an IPL team and the artificial intelligence centre were made to present the party's vision of Madhya Pradesh as a modern state, said party insiders.

Nath rued that the state has no metro or IPL team of its own. "It is a matter of sadness and I feel ashamed that when I was a central minister I helped other states with metro. In Madhya Pradesh, nobody even got a proposal for a metro. We will make full effort to get our own IPL also," said the state Congress president.

With the Congress's hopes resting on state president Kamal Nath and ex-chief minister Digvijaya pulling their weight together, the two made light of the video at a press conference here, where the party released its manifesto.

The video featured supporters of former Kolaras BJP MLAturned-Congress leader Virendra Raghuvanshi, angry over Raghuvanshi not getting a ticket. When they confronted Kamal Nath over this on Monday night in Bhopal, he was caught on video saying that Digvijaya was handling ticket distribution and that "they should tear his as well as his son (Jaivardhan Singh's) clothes" to vent their anger. "Don't tell him (Digvijaya) I said this," Kamal Nath says in the video.

The BIP said the video indicated the tension within the Congress, which has so far been more fleet-footed than its rival this election. CM Shivraj Singh Chouhan also commented, saying: "This is the real face of the Congress. A former CM is saying this about another former CM."

What fanned the rumours was Digvijaya's cryptic post on X: "When a family grows large, there is both collective happiness and collective conflict. Wisdom says that elders should patiently find a solution."

On Tuesday, with Digvijaya sitting beside him on the dais for the manifesto launch, Kamal Nath said he first wanted to clear the air over the video. Having just shared

For a long time, they were also aligned against their common enemy, Jyotiraditya Scindia. During the 2018 elections too, Digvijaya and Kamal Nath are said to have ganged up to sideline Scindia, ensuring that Kamal Nath was picked as CM ahead of the Gwalior royal family scion. A Congress leader acknowledged the role of Digvijaya, who belongs to the rival Raghogarh erstwhile royal family, in keeping Scindia out.

MNF and ZPM are entry points for RSS, Rahul says in Mizoram

ON THE second day of his Mizoram visit, Congress leader Rahul Gandhi sharpened his pitch against the two main regional parties in the fray — the Mizo National Front (MNF) and the Zoram People's Movement(ZPM)—saying that both parties are entry points into the state for the RSS.

Rahul reiterated this point on Tuesday at a media interaction in Aizawl and a public meeting in Lunglei, the second largest town in Mizoram. During the course of the two days of his visit, his attack has largely been against the BJP and, through that, against the MNF and ZPM for their existing and potential alliance with the saffron party, which by itself does not have a sizeable presence in the state. It's largely being seen as a three-cornered fight in Mizoram among the Congress, the ruling MNF and the ZPM, which is the second largest party

Taking an aim at Assam CM and North East Democratic Alliance convener Himanta Biswa Sarma for his role in expanding the reach of the BJP in the northeastern region, especially through alliances with regional parties, Rahul said in Aizawl, "Different states in the Northeast are being attacked by the BJP and the RSS. The RSS believes that India should be ruled by one ideology and one organisation... We want the people of Mizoram to take decisions for their future... The Chief Minister of Assam is acting to help them [BJP] with the cultural annihilation of the Northeast... We believe that culture, religions and traditions of the Northeast are

central to the idea of India." At Lunglei, the Congress MP said both the MNF and the ZPM are open to allying with the BIP and are acting as "entry points

for the RSS into the state". "The BJP has no problem with the ZPM or the MNF. It is perfectly happy if either of these parties rule Mizoram," he said.

THE CHHATTISGARH contest will pit the Congress government's welfare schemes, including direct cash transfer and loan waiver, and its regional identity card, against the BJP's corruption allegations against Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel and its Hindutva plank.

On paper, the BJP has a tough climb. Having ruled for 15 years, the party came crashing down in 2018 to 15 seats out of 90 and 32.9% vote share (from 49 seats and 40.04% votes in 2013). The Congress surged to 68 seats and 43.04% of the votes (from 39 seats, and 40.29% votes in 2013).

The 10.1% vote difference between them in 2018 was a huge leap from the usual 3% separating the winner and the runnerup since the state was formed.

The Congress has also won all the five bypolls held in Chhattisgarh since, taking its tally to 71. The BJP goes in with only 13 sitting MLAs, having lost a seat in a bypoll while another constituency is vacant since an MLA's death.

First Phase

Of the five states going to elections, only Chhattisgarh, with its Maoist problem, is voting in more than one phase.

Of the 20 constituencies voting in the first phase on November 7, eight fall in the Durg division and 12 in Bastar. All these 20 seats, barring former CM Raman Singh's Rajnandgaon, are held by the Congress.

In 2013 too, the Congress had done better than the BJP in these 20 seats, winning 12 seats to the BJP's 8. Hoping to retain its hold, the Congress is stressing on the

Baghel government's hike in MSP coverage to 67 forest produce from 60, apart from that for millets, as well as its funds for developing a religious site for tribals, Devgudi, and organisation of a 'national tribal dance festival'.

Congress leaders talk of other benefits, for tribals as well as villagers, such as haat bazar bus clinics, higher price for paddy, implementation of PESA (Panchavat Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act, release of tribals arrested in "fake" Maoist cases, and government-run English schools.

The BJP is invoking the communal violence in Kawardha in 2021, as well as alleged religious conversions in Bastar. Party leaders claim gains in Narayanpur and Kondagaon, which have reported incidents of tribal Christians being targeted.

The BJP, which claims to be tough on national security compared to the Congress, accuses the Baghel government of "going slow" on the Maoist issue. Corruption is another constant in the BIP attacks against the Baghel government, with several leaders in the CM's inner circle under investigation in alleged coal and liquor scams.

What is also worrying for the Congress is the proliferation of smaller parties in the run-up to the elections, which might end up splitting the anti-BJP vote. Among the new parties in the fray are the Sarva Adi Dal, formed by Christian tribals who claim to have suffered violence over conversion allegations, and Hamar Raj, a tribal party formed by former Union minister and Congress leader Arvind Netam.

Eventually, it was decided at a panchayat meeting that Yadav would contest as an Independent. Since then, the former legislator has been busy touring the constituency, drawing crowds and reminding people that the only election the BIP won in Tijara was with him as the candidate. Yadav was denied a ticket in 2018, too, but he didn't

contest the elections. "Baba ji is not going to win

the elections under any circumstances. If you help me, I will make Baba ji lose his deposit. No person can make him win. I have seen the public's mood," Yadav said while campaigning in the area on Sunday. The communities that are

electorally significant in Tijara are Meo Muslims (around 65,00-70,000 voters), Yadavs (52,000-55,000 voters), and Scheduled Castes (30,000-35,000 voters).

The BIP is hoping to placate Yadav and convince him to withdraw. "Maman Singh Yadav is still in the BJP and we hope that after talking to the high command he will respect their opinion and won't contest the elections," Alwar North BJP president Umed Singh Bhaya told The Indian Express.

However, at the moment, Yadav seems unpacified as he keeps publicly attacking Balak Nath and labelling him an outsider. "If you bring Baba, then don't dream of your own MLA in the future. Do you want to stop the political future of Tijara's youth? I will become older before the next elections and from then onwards it will be the youth. For the future of the youth, it was decided by all communities in Tijara that I contest the elections," Yadav said.

Balak Nath, who was born in a Yadav family in Alwar district, is also the Chancellor of the Baba Mastnath University in Rohtak

Meanwhile, BJP's Jaipur Rural MP Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore was shown black flags by supporters of an overlooked ticketseeker from his party as he started his campaign in Ihotwara. 'Full of sound and fury, signifying nothing'

Same-sex marriage petitioners say SC verdict disheartening

IT WOULD have been a perfect fourth anniversary celebration for Kajal and Bhawna. They have been together since October 17, 2019. They have been in hiding since then, hounded by Bhawna's parents, moving in and out of shelter homes, changing cities and jobs to ensure safety. They are among the 21 petitioners, including same-sex couples, trans people and organisations, who are seeking marriage equality in India. A special bench of the Supreme Court on Tuesday didn't grant legal recognition to same-sex marriages. "We had planned a lot of things. We had decided we would get married immediately after and come out and tell our parents that they can't separate us anymore. The legal sanction of our union would have changed our lives, but now we have to go back in hiding," says Kajal.

Pooja Srivastava and Nibedita Dutta met on Facebook almost five years ago and have since married, but are forced to write 'single' on government documents which don't provide for same-sex couples. They own an apparel business and live together but can't nominate each other in health and life insurance policies. Srivastava says, "This verdict was very disheartening. It's 2023 but the SC is giving such a judgment. They've left everything to a government which says our marriage is against culture, ethos, only for the elite... the government won't do anything. This was just a two hour-long lecture."

"There has been no change [in our legal status | since Nibedita and I got married. Why is it a third party's concern what my relation to my spouse is, or what inheritance I get from my family? They shouldn't have entertained the case, because today, the people [against our marriage] are just happier. I am feeling less human,"

Maya Sharma, an LGBTQ+ activist from Vadodara and a petitioner in the case, echoes the sentiment. "It's full of sound and fury signifying nothing. What the judges said has already been stated in the NALSA verdict and the 2018 verdict, there is nothing new in it. The ball is back in the court of the central government and we all know what they feel about it," says Sharma.

Sharma doesn't believe in the institution of marriage but she believed that a favourable verdict would have been a strong step towards equality. "One of the judges said that this will adversely affect women. Are we not women? Don't rights of lesbian women count?" asks Sharma. Udit Sood took a 20-hour long

flight from Los Angeles to hear the judgement on Tuesday, managed to reach the Supreme Court on time, but he wasn't prepared for the disappointment. "I was optimistic. But this is devastating,' says Sood, who practises law in the US. Fellow petitioner, Saattvic, an economist settled in Canada, feels his decision to leave the country in 2020 stands vindicated now. "It's heartbreaking that my own country doesn't take me as I am," he says. Malobika, a lesbian activist

from Kolkata who is a veteran of over three decades in the queer activism field, however, chooses to focus on the positives. "As a petitioner, I am disappointed. But I want to focus on the fact that there were a lot of things that were highlighted in the verdict that had not been talked about before. The CJI, for the first time, spoke about the violence of natal family and said that there is not only one kind of family. He recognised that there is migration due to discrimination and persecution in the queer community. I feel this give us a platform to regroup and strategise our next course of action," says

Malabika.

Experts should examine rights of queer couples: SC

UNDERLINING THAT "genuine human concerns" of queer couples will be addressed administratively, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta had told the Supreme Court in May that the Centre will set up a high-level committee to look into the issue.

These administrative "concerns" range from allowing a same-sex couple to jointly open a bank account to ensuring the right to access the remains of the spouse from the natal family.

Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud in his minority opinion on Tuesday noted Mehta's assurance that the Central Government will constitute a committee chaired by the Cabinet Secretary to "define and elucidate" the scope of entitlements of queer couples in unions.

The SC said the panel shall include experts with domain knowledge and experience in dealing with the social, psychological and emotional needs of persons be-

read out. The CJI said that the reg-

ulation shall be read down to ex-

clude the word "marital" so that it

includes both married and un-

longing to the queer community. The CJI said the committee, before finalising its decision,

shall conduct a wide stakeholder consultation with persons belonging to queer community, including those from marginalised groups and also state governments and Union Territories. The panel is required to con-

sider enabling the partners in queer relationships to be treated as part of the same family to avail ration cards and facility of joint bank account, with option to name partners as nominee in case of death of either person. The panel report shall be im-

plemented at the administrative level by the Centre, state governments and UTs, the CJI noted. S-G Mehta, during the hearing in May, had that the Centre

will form such a panel to examine suggestions by the LGBTQIA community related to issues faced by them in cohabitation with persons of the same gender. The five-judge bench had

termed it a "very fair suggestion" and had remarked that it will be a "substantial advancement" from the present status.

Justice S K Kaul, part of the five-judge Constitutional bench which unanimously ruled against legalising same-sex marriages, made the observation about the need for a separate

anti-discrimination law. "Presently, there are several laws that have an anti-discrimination aspect to them. However they are fragmented and may fail to capture the multitudinous

Article 15 of the Constitution prohibits discrimination on grounds of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth and is a fundamental right of every citizen. In previous judgments, the Supreme Court has given an expansive interpretation to the term "sex" in Article 15, to in-

The J S Verma Committee formed to review laws on sexual crimes too had recommended that the interpretation include sexual orientation, to address discrimination faced by many.

On Tuesday, Justice Kaul said that while Article 15 prohibits discrimination by state and private persons, there are significant challenges for marginalised communities to access courts through writ petitions to safeguard their rights. He said an anti-discrimination statute can be a fitting solution to this. Such a law should recognise discrimination in an 'in-

AGREEING UNANIMOUSLY that one's sexual orientation cannot decide the capability or suitability of being adoptive parents, the Supreme Court in a 3:2 split verdict on Tuesday, however, held as valid the existing regulations that deny unmarried couples, including queer, the right to adopt a child as a couple. The five-bench Constitution

bench headed by Chief Justice of India (CJI) D Y Chandrachud, which declined to recognise same-sex marriages, also considered the issue of adoption by nonheterosexual couples.

The current adoption rules of the country under the Central Adoption Resource Authority

(CARA) allow unmarried persons to adopt children only in an individual capacity. Unmarried couples, including queer couples, cannot jointly adopt a child. The eligibility criteria for prospective adoptive parents under Regulation 5 (3) require a couple to have been in at least two years

of "stable marital relationship". CJI Chandrachud said that this

Regulation was discriminating against the queer community and hence was violating the Article 15 of the Constitution. The majority view by Justices S Ravindra Bhat, Hima Kohli and P S Narasimha acknowledged that the needs of such couples to have and raise family in every sense of the term has to be accommodated within the framework of

the law, but held that the regulation cannot be held void.

"This exclusion has the effect of reinforcing the disadvantage already faced by the queer community. Law cannot make an assumption on good and bad parenting based on the sexuality of individuals. Such an assumption perpetuates a stereotype based on sexuality that only heterosex-

Silence to 'studying verdict': BJP, Opp on same page a Bill in Parliament.

THE POLITICAL class was hoping that the Supreme Court takes a final view on the question of legalisation of same-sex marriage and not put the "politically uncomfortable" and "inconvenient" ball in Parliament's court. On Tuesday, the court did precisely that as a five-judge Constitution Bench headed by Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud declined to recognise same-sex marriage, ruling that it is for Parliament to decide.

Most political parties either chose to remain silent on the top court's judgment or took a stance that it has to be studied in detail. Without commenting on the verdict, the Congress said it has always stood in favour of protecting the freedoms, choices, liberties

and rights of citizens. Significantly,

Congress-ruled Rajasthan was

among the states which opposed the pleas for same-sex marriages. While the RSS and VHP welcomed the top court's verdict, the

ruling BJP remained silent, which was predictable given that the government was opposed to the pleas. The Centre had earlier told the court that it was willing to form a Cabinet Secretary-headed committee to consider administrative measures for addressing "genuine, human concerns" faced by same-sex couples, stopping short of accepting the pleas.

The Opposition voices that ar-

gue in favour of same-sex marriage believe the government is simply shilly-shallying. "I have no doubt that the government neither intends nor will bring in the desired legislation for such a purpose," Abhishek Singhvi, senior Congress leader and one of the key lawyers in the case, told *The Indian Express.* Congress MP Shashi Tharoor said, "We know the ruling party is the least likely to do so. At least the court heard all the arguments on both sides. I doubt the BJP will even want the issue discussed in Parliament, let alone bringing a law."

Officially, Congress communication head Jairam Ramesh said, "On the same-sex marriage and related issues we are studying the different and differing judgments delivered in the Supreme Court today and will have a detailed response subsequently. Indian National Congress has always stood with all our citizens to protect their freedoms, choices, liberties and rights. We, as a party of inclusion, firmly believe in non discriminatory processes — judi-

cial, social, and political." While the JD(U) said it was not in support of same-sex marriage, the SP and BSP said they were

studying the judgment. ID(U) spokesperson K C Tyagi told The Indian Express that while no one was against anybody's freedom, his party was not in support of same-sex marriage. He said the JD(U) will not stand in support if the government brings

Calling the issue a "legal matter", SP MP Javed Ali Khan declined to comment. BSPMPRamji Gautam said he will comment only after studying the judgment.

The CPI(M) and CPI did not issue statements. It is another matter that they were the only parties that took a clear position supporting decriminalisation of same-sex relations when Delhi High Court first ruled in 2009 that consensual intercourse between two adults was not illegal.

Senior CPI(M) leader Brinda Karat told *The Indian Express*, "I agree with the approach of the Chief Justice of India in a minority judgment. Jurisdictional issues as far as not having a law which is why they did not want to legalise it leaving it to Parliament... but at least the acceptance of a union which the CJI has spoken about... that should have at least been the major gain.... But unfortunately it was only a minority opinion. But there is still a way before there can be justice for those with alternative sexuality."

Special Marriage Act: SC says smaller bench can look into issues


DRAWING THE curtain on the question of same-sex marriage under the Special Marriage Act (SMA), 1954, the five-judge Constitution Bench, led by Chief Iustice of India DY Chandrachud and comprising Justices S K Kaul, S.Ravindra Bhat, Hima Kohli and PS Narasimha, also ruled against "civil unions" for non-heterosexual couples in a 3:2 verdict.

During the course of the hearing, from April to May, some senior advocates like Abhishek Singhvi and Raju Ramachandran attempted to address the "notice and objections regime" in the SMA, under Sections 5-9, which stipulate a set of procedural preconditions for solemnisation of marriages under the Act.

In its 366-page ruling, the Supreme Court indicated that this was not a question of law that necessitated a five-judge bench ruling. "Hence this issue was to be left for consideration by a numerically smaller bench," the court said.

On May 10, when the court was examining the arguments for a neutral reading of the SMA to allow recognition of marriage between any two persons, Singhvi, appearing for a petitioner, said that personal laws in the country "don't discriminate unlike the SMA", while arguing against the mandatory 30-day notice period in it.

To this, the court responded that the mandatory 30-day notice inviting public objections to an intended marriage under the SMA is "patriarchal" and makes it "open for invasion by society". While Justice Bhat said these patriarchal laws were made "when women did not have an agency", CJI Chandrachud noted that "this

Reminding the court that it had earlier said it wouldn't consider this aspect, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, on behalf of the Centre, said, "We didn't re-

This led the CJI to say that the notice-period aspect "will be dealt with separately". However, Singhvi reminded the court that petitions filed by him and Ramachandran were already pending before the court on this aspect. The CJI said the "notice applies to those who are entitled to marry undoubtedly", thereby hinting at its irrelevance in the present case owing to the petitioner's absence of such a right to marry in the first place.

Dalit Woman On Daughter's Same-Sex Marriage

'If two people are happy, why should anyone object?'

PRITI RANI, a 44-year-old Dalit woman who works as a help in a Bathinda office, was not evev aware of LGBTQ+, let alone know about same-sex marriage until two years ago. But on Tuesday, Rani, who studied till Class 12, waited impatiently for the Supreme Court decision on the same-sex marriage issue.

What was at stake for her was not just a matter of legal recognition but the life of her daughter, 21-year-old Manisha. Manisha, a graduate, married

her partner, Dimple (27) from Mansa at Gurdwara Kalgidhar Sahib on September 18, as per the rituals performed under Anand Karaj (wedding ceremony). It was a momentous occasion.

The families of both the women were present and the marriage was solemnised after their consent. The women, ahead of the wedding, had submitted their Aadhaar cards, mentioning their genders as female. A marriage certificate issued under the letterhead of the gurdwara allegedly described one of the partners as male. Dimple had arrived at the gurdwara dressed as a traditional Sikh groom, wearing a turban.

MINORITY VOICE

THE CHIEF Justice of India being in the minority in a crucial Constitution bench verdict has been a rare occurrence in the Supreme Court. So far this has happened only in a dozen instances in the 1,500-odd Constitution bench rulings that the CJI has been a part of. The idea is that the CJI, who picks the bench, would persuade his colleagues to join him in the majority. However, both CJI DY Chandrachud and his predecessor U U Lalit have found themselves in the minority despite setting up the benches. While CJI Chandrachud and Justice Sanjay Kaul were in the minority in the marriage equality verdict on Tuesday, in November last year, former CJI Lalit and Justice Ravindra Bhat were in the minority in the 3:2 verdict upholding the EWS quota.

"Banks should verify the identity of the person and seek information about the sources of funds before accepting the PEP as a customer. The decision to open an account for PEP should be taken at a senior level which should be clearly spelt out in Customer Acceptance policy. Banks should also subject such accounts to enhanced monitoring on an ongoing basis. The above norms may also be applied to the accounts of the familv members or close relatives of PEPs," it said.

Woman's brother, father held for killing inter-faith couple

THE MUMBAI Police has arrested three persons and apprehended three minors in connection with the murder of a couple who married from different communities last year, on October 14.

According to police, the family members of Gulnaz Khan (20) were unhappy with her marriage to Karan Ramesh Chandra (22) in 2022, following which her father and brother allegedly murdered the couple with the help of a few friends. Both the families reside in Banda of Uttar Pradesh.

An officer said that the murders came to light when personnel of RCF police station were investigating the case of an unidentified body of a man found in a well at an isolated telecom factory area in Govandi on October 14. Police registered a murder case after the body was found with throat slit. Police also published his photograph asking for information on him.

Inspector Pramod Kokate said that with the help of technical evidence, they managed to establish that the body belonged to Chandra, a resident of Uttar

few days ago with his wife. "When we started looking for his wife, Gulnaz, she was also missing," Kokate said.

After preliminary investigation, police found that Gulnaz's family had been unhappy about her marrying outside their religion and had called them to the

city to resolve the issue. "We began questioning Gulnaz's father Gora Raisuddin Khan (50) and brother Salman Khan (22) and found that they murdered the couple," said DCP (zone VI) Hemraj Rajput.

Police arrested the duo, along with Salman's friend Mohammad Kaif, and detained three other minors alleged to be involved in the murder.

Gora and Salman who were into garment business would often come to Dharavi in Mumbai for work and stay for long periods. Last year, Gulnaz told her family about her relationship with Chandra. Despite the family's opposition, the couple got married.

"When relatives came to know, the girl's father and brother decided to kill Chandra," the officer said. An officer said that they arrested the accused on Monday and produced them before the court on Tuesday when they were remanded in police custody

In a strong signal to its INDIA alliance partner, the SP then declared a list of nine more candidates. SP state president for Madhya Pradesh Ramayan Singh Patel told The Indian Express that "all possibilities of an alliance with the Congress are over now".

A senior SP leader considered close to Akhilesh Yadav accused the Congress of not being interested in defeating the BJP.

Madhya Pradesh Congress spokesperson Piyush Babele said the final call on seat sharing would be taken by the party's high command. Meanwhile, a Congress leader said the SP was trying to get more seats than it

was capable of winning. Alleging that a person from

the Sikh community was gravely injured by BJP workers in Kanpur, Akhilesh said the ruling party was "so arrogant that they aren't

treating humans like humans".

"Injustice and atrocities are at their peak in the BJP government. BJP has become very arrogant... The BIP government, which talks about zero tolerance towards crime, has given a free hand to its workers to beat up anyone and even take away their eyesight. Students to Asha workers: On frontlines of Assam's fight against child marriage

SCHOOL-GOING CHILDREN and the elderly made up most of the audience gathered under the shamiana pitched in the small

town of Kaki in Assam last week. As two young men moved among the audience distributing black gram as the afternoon's refreshments, local leader Monwar Hussain spoke into a mic, "There are not many people who are not aware of the law against child marriage... Parents, don't give your young daughters in marriage. Our little sisters, if you hear of a friend or classmate about to get forcefully married off, tell your teacher or quietly call 1098. If everybody and all students work together, we should be able to aim to end child marriage by 2026."

This public meeting, organised by the All Assam Minority Students' Union (AAMSU) in an area where the population largely comprises Bengali-origin Muslims, was being held a week after 31 people from the district, Hojai, were arrested overnight in a police crackdown against child marriage. 13 of those arrested were men who had allegedly married underage girls and 18

were relatives booked for al-

legedly facilitating the marriages. In February, 219 people were arrested from the district over the course of a few days in an unprecedented crackdown on child marriage in the state. While Assam's punitive anti-child marriage drive has largely been viewed as affecting the state's Bengali-Muslim community, for long, campaigns such as the one AAMSU held in Hojai's Kaki last week and community-led initiatives have worked to push back

against the problem. On its part, at each of its meetings, AAMSU has been specifically underlining education — girls' education in particular — as the only way forward. But they also claim to have intervened and stopped several child marriages. Fakhrulin Islam, an AAMSU activist from Islam

Nagar village in the district, said he personally intervened and stopped two marriages: one in 2019, and the other, that of a Class 9 student, last December.

"When we first started, there was so much resentment against us. One good thing that came out of the government's drive is that many people were thankful to us and told us that if we hadn't in-

tervened, they would have been in jail," he laughed. A provincial school in the dis-

trict too has been advocating against child marriage over the past few years. Badrul Islam Beg, the principal of Doboka Higher Secondary School, said the school has been talking about the issue during parent-teacher meetings, and health and hygiene workshops. However, he said, all efforts have been disparate and disorganised due to lack of institutional intervention.

Beg added, "Ideally, there should be intervention by the (education) department so that campaigns at the grassroots level can be organised at the school level on the lines of those conducted by anti-tobacco and ecoclubs. The arrests are preventing child marriages because of fear, not awareness. At the end of the day, without awareness, young girls will still be seen as a burden by their families."

The government, however, said it has been doing its bit to change mindsets. The administration held awareness meetings and appointed Gaon Panchayat secretaries as village-level Child Marriage Prohibition Officers

(CMPOs). At Islam Nagar, Gaon Secretary Shahabuddin said he had at-

Panchayat tended a meeting at the District Collector's office a few months ago with other secretaries. At the meeting, he said, they had been told that they should check age certificates to issue no-objection certificates for marriages in their

respective villages. Since no written order or notification was issued regarding the new responsibilities, Shahabuddin said the panchayat too has not taken any steps towards building awareness. At Ashinagar, a village in the same district, panchavat members said an awareness meeting had been held by block-

level officials earlier this year. ASHA workers too have been roped in. At the village level, ASHA workers work most consistently to spread the message and as grassroots health workers, they also have their ears closest to the ground.

An ASHA worker in a village in Hojai district says that before the February crackdown, she attended a training session at a local hospital. "Earlier, while maintaining our records on pregnant women, we would just ask their age and write whatever they told us. Now, we have been told to check their Aadhaar cards and write down their date of birth instead," she said.

But this advocacy, she said, has resulted in suspicion and wariness from the village community. Thanks to the crackdown on child marriages, the community assumes that she will use the information she collects on the job to point the police in their direction.

Appearing for the Speaker, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta urged the court to grant him some more time to have "one to one" conversation with the Speaker. At this, the CJI said "he has to decide... He has been giving interviews. He is not doing his iob. He is amenable to the jurisdiction of this court. We are not controlling what is happening on

the floor of the House which is absolutely supreme. But while hearing a disqualification proceedings, he is a tribunal and amenable to the court's jurisdiction." Stating that he had no knowledge of the interviews, the SG conveyed his apology.

The CJI reminded that disqualification proceedings are summary proceedings and said "we want to set down our time frame for him to come to a final conclusion". He added the Speaker "must first deal with the petition filed by the Uddhav Thackeray faction" last year and also with the NCP matter. The court will hear the matter on October 30.

DISMISSES FORMER PUNE POLICE COMMISSIONER'S CLAIM

Yerawada project was nixed as firm was facing ED probe: Ajit

MANOJ MORE PUNE, OCTOBER 17

Denying allegations that he has put pressure for the sale of a prime police land in Yerawada area to a private builder, Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar Tuesday said that the project cancelled by the state government as the private party which was supposed to implement it got embroiled in an ED case.

He denied claims by former Pune Police Commissioner Meeran Borwankar who said the deal did not go ahead because she opposed it.

Borwankar in her book claimed that as the Guardian Minister of Pune district in 2010. Pawar allegedly asked her to hand over three acres of land belonging to the police because it had been auctioned to a builder.

Without naming Borwankar, Pawar, at a press conference in Mumbai, said, "Some people are claiming that because they opposed the project, it was cancelled. The claim was made in a book and at a press conference in Delhi Monday. This is not true. The ED had taken action against the company in a particular case and therefore, the state government had decided to cancel the

project." Conceding that he had indeed met Borwankar, as claimed, Pawar said, "As the District Guardian Minister, I am suppos-

ed to review the implementation of various projects in the district. When the district officials told me that the police commissioner had opposed the Yerawada project, I called her for a meeting. At the meeting, she (Borwankar) said she did not agree with the project. I then said that it is fine.'

In the same breath, Pawar said, "I might be strict but I am never rude to IAS and IPS officers. You can get it verified from the officers."

Borwankar had alleged that Pawar had lost his cool and had thrown the map of the project on the glass table placed before

"The decision about any land transfer is taken by the state cabinet and revenue department. The guardian minister had nothing to do with it," he said.

Emphasising that the project is in the jurisdiction of the home department, Pawar said, "I neither held any meeting nor signed any paper. It was done as per the policy of the state government which has issued a GR (government resolution) for using vacant police land in Pune for the benefit of the police personnel. It was the home department which had appointed a sixmember committee... I was nowhere in the picture."

Pawar added, "Even the then Divisional Commissioner, Dilip Band, has told the media in Pune that Ajit Pawar was not involved in the case. He has said that it was entirely the decision of the home department." Pawar alleged the IPS officer

might have written about the deal to get publicity for the book. "I am told that some retired

officers do such things to get publicity for their books. Also, I am told that before publishing the book, the retired IPS and IAS officers have to take permission from their departments."

He added, "I want to once again like to emphasise that I have nothing to do with the project. I never put any pressure on former home minister R R Patil. I first became a minister 32 years back. Since then, I have never done anything which will cause loss to the state government. Even regarding transfers, I never issue any instructions to the top officials.'

Modi also dedicated, inaugurated and laid foundation stone for 21 projects worth Rs 18,000 crore. The projects included Rs 4,539-crore all-weather, deep draft container terminal of Deendayal Port Trust (DPT) at Tuna Tekra in Gujarat that was described as an "international trade hub as part of the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor" at the inaugural event of the summit. However, the Prime Minister did not touch upon the greenfield container terminal in his speech.

He said the capacity of major ports have doubled in the last decade. "The turnaround time for container vessels in 2014 was about 42 hours. This has reduced to less than 24 hours in 2023," he added. SC fails to seize the moment on marriage equality. But its verdict opens up some valuable space for a vulnerable minority

HE SUPREME COURT'S judgment on legalising same-sex marriage in India shifts the onus of the decision on to the legislature, leaves the door ajar for change. Asserting that "there is no unqualified right to marry", the five-judge bench of the Supreme Court, headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, ruled against granting constitutional validity to same-sex marriage. But if the outcome stopped well short of the expectations of a landmark judicial decision that would expand the ambit of individual rights and freedoms, in its recognition that "homosexuality or queerness" is not an "urban" or "elite" concept, that there is a pressing need for an anti-discrimination law and necessary protections, and that members of the LGBTQIA+ community have "the right to choose one's partner", the judgment has opened up valuable room for finding a way forward. The bench, comprising the CJI, Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Justice S Ravindra Bhat, Justice Hima Kohli, and Justice PS Narasimha, had reserved its judgment on May 11 after a 10-day hearing in April.

In 2018, in its ground-breaking reading down of the provisions of Section 377 of the Indian Penal Code, a colonial-era legislation that had effectively criminalised homosexual relations in India, the Supreme Court had drawn upon landmark decisions such as the 2014 NALSA judgment that recognised transgender individuals as the "third gender", and the 2017 right to privacy verdict, to uphold the rights of the LGBTQIA+ community. In these last five years, there has been a slow but steady shift in attitudes, emanating from the essential spirit of emancipation underlined and reinforced by that judgment. In June this year, for instance, a Pew Research Centre survey on attitudes to same-sex marriage in 24 countries around the world showed that 53 per cent Indians are in favour of legalising same-sex marriages. Despite the Centre's discomfort with the petitions and its argument in a 56-page-long affidavit in March that "the notion of marriage itself necessarily and inevitably presupposes a union between two persons of the opposite sex", hopes had been raised that the apex court would seize the moment to take a less conservative stance. But while the 3:2 judgment makes a strong case for building in safeguards for protection from discrimination — at home and by the State — it stops short of making the institution of marriage more equal by extending the provisions of the Special Marriage Act 1954 to LGBTQIA+ unions. By accepting the government's proposal of an expert committee to look into the matter of rights for the community, the court has kept its role limited to an advisory framework, pushing the ball back into the Centre's court for addressing the concerns of citizens seeking redress for a continuing injustice.

The court did not go far enough even as it has prised open some space and widened the room for manoeuvre for an embattled minority. Its categorical no to same sex marriage can also be said to make many of its empathetic observations on rights and discrimination seem like tokenism. In the end, therefore, the verdict points at the larger battles that still remain to be fought - the necessity of safeguards both within the home and outside, the recognition of civil unions as a possibility for the community, and the realisation, above all, that like all battles for equal rights, this, too, has a long and arduous road ahead.

A FERRY TO JAFFNA

Resumption of sea travel between India and Sri Lanka is welcome. New Delhi must make it more viable

AST SATURDAY, 50 people boarded a ferry, Cheriyapani, from Nagapattinam in Tamil Nadu to cross the Palk Strait and travel to Kankesanthurai in Jaffna, Sri Lanka. The maritime service, begun in the early 1900s, was discontinued in the 1980s in the wake of ethnic strife in Sri Lanka. Reactivating the sea route had been on the agenda of governments of both countries for more than 12 years. India and Sri Lanka signed an MoU for sea connectivity in 2011 and a ferry service between Tuticorin and Colombo began that year. It was discontinued in less than six months, because of logistical reasons. Cheriyapani will take about 3.5 hours to travel 110 km. The sea-route rejuvenation will give a much-needed fillip to commerce between India and Sri Lanka, and encourage people-to-people contact between the two neighbours.

The Narendra Modi government has located India-Sri Lanka ties within its Neighbourhood First policy. In July, during Sri Lankan President Ranil Wickremesinghe's visit to India, the two governments came out with a vision document that emphasised maritime connectivity, including the development of ports at Colombo, Kankesanthurai and Trincomalee and the revival of sea routes. Besides improving business ties between the Indian Ocean neighbours, Cheriyapani is likely to bring pilgrims to religious centres in southern Sri Lanka and temple towns in south India.

In recent decades, Beijing has loomed large over Delhi-Colombo ties. China is Sri Lanka's biggest bilateral creditor and has roped in the island nation in its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI). Besides a \$4-billion aid package, Delhi has sought to counter Beijing's influence by underlining the civilisational aspects of its ties with Colombo, that involved the movement of people and ideas over centuries. It is significant, therefore, that the ferry service was launched a day before President Wickremesinghe left for China for a BRI meet. However, there are early concerns that at more than Rs 7,600, the one-way ticket is priced a little too steep, and booking facilities are not available on popular tourist portals. The government must address these worries and remove the glitches. It must also expedite resumption of the Rameshwaram-Talaimannar ferry service, mooted during President Wickremesinghe's visit.

Baby animals snuggling with their mothers, or frolicking in the water — what's not to like

N THE FRENZIED times of 24/7 news, social media slug fests and what feels like the permanent anxiety of living on a planet buffeted by disasters, man-made and natural, there's something deeply relaxing about watching baby animals be their adorable, bumbling selves. Few things can soothe frayed nerves as effectively as watching an orangutan infant snuggling with its mother or a bevy of otter toddlers frolicking in the water. This may be why Netflix has launched a show called Baby Animal Cam, on which the interested viewer can watch, once a week, for two hours straight, live feeds of animal toddlers going about their business in Cleveland Metroparks Zoo.

Cynics may suggest that this is one way for the OTT platform to cope with the labour dispute that rocked Hollywood in recent months. It's also true that there is little that is dramatically compelling in watching animals on a live camera feed, in enclosures where they are safe and well-fed — unlike documentaries which craft narratives of survival, conflict and sexual politics in the wild. But that is precisely the point of animal cams — to of-

fer a break from drama, lulling an over-stimulated nervous system into a meditative calm. It comes down to the innate homo sapien urge for connection, whether intra-species or cross species. This is why even as humans have domesticated animals for food and other purposes, they've also nurtured relationships that are more akin to companionships. Watching animals go through the rhythms of birth, feeding, mating and death is a gentle reminder that even as controversies and conflicts shake the human world, the business of life goes quietly on.

Court stops short

In marriage equality case, it enunciates principle of discrimination, only to limit its applicability

IN ITS LATEST judgment, the Supreme Court of India has taken some steps to protect same sex unions from discrimination, and granted those unions some legal rights. But in the final analysis, the Court limited itself to providing a mere modus vivendi: Protecting a few rights, but stopping well short of granting full recognition to same sex marriage.

The Chief Justice was not aligned with at least three of his colleagues, but what is odd about his judgment is that it was not allied with its own logic. This judgment will only prolong the long and arduous struggle to create the conditions where same sex couples could live a life without fear, in the sweet elixir of freedom, and the imprimatur of equal recognition.

The Chief Justice's judgment begins with a profound reiteration of the values that protect the dignity of individuals: A regard for their autonomy, privacy, freedom to choose and their well-being. The basic thread around which it constructs an argument is this: No one can be denied a human good that should be available to them solely on account of their sexual orientation. It then gives a series of directions to protect same sex unions from interference by the state, or in some cases, parents. But it stops well short of extending the provisions of the Special Marriage Act to same sex unions. It could be argued that this was a wise

course of action given two background features of this case. The first is whether this is a matter for the judiciary or Parliament to decide. I am very sympathetic to this question. The Court should not wade into policy. But here the issue is whether a statute discriminates against a class of people with no reasonable nexus for that classification.

The Court argued that it could neither invalidate the Special Marriage Act nor read it in a more inclusive non-discriminatory way. This, to be honest, is a very odd position to take, if what is at stake is discrimination. In effect, the Court is saying that, for the moment, a certain institutional practice, marriage, that this society recognises as a central pivot around which to publicly express unions between two people, is not available to same sex couples. All judges seem to agree that the institution of marriage flows from the statutes created by

and that such an institution cannot be modified by the Courts. But surely this is to miss the Court's own logic twice over. First the issue is not whether marriage is a statutory right. It is whether an

that there is no fundamental right to marriage,

important institution can be denied to two people wanting to create a union solely on account of their sexual orientation, which is what the Special Marriage Act does. So the CJI enunciated the principle of discrimination with one hand, only to limit its applicability to the real issue at stake. And second, as Justice Ravindra Bhat pointed out, if the Court is reluctant to employ the discrimination logic to the Special Marriage Act, why apply it to regulations regarding parenting etc? Is the Court saying the question of discrimination cannot apply to something that is not a fundamental right?

The second is a tricky issue of how far society should proceed without a deep consensus. To what extent can courts instigate moral change, without incurring a backlash? As Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul said rightly, constitutional morality cannot be shaped by social morality: That argument would equally apply to parenting practices that the Court seeks to modify, as it would to the institution of marriage. The current law embodies a discriminatory assumption that only heterosexual parents can, as a couple, be appropriate parents. The Chief Justice's opinion rightly questions this. But why not wait for Parliament on this question as well?

If one is sympathetic to the courts, one can say this. They have followed an incrementally ameliorative logic. They do not feel confident about the administrative and social consequences of reinterpreting the Special Marriage Act and they are letting the social debate play out. But this would be very charitable. The genius of the strategy to use the Special Marriage Act to grant same sex unions recognition was that it, for the moment, leaves the whole wider gamut of personal laws intact. It was not a whole-scale transformation of marriage practices as much as the recognition of discrimination.

Why is the non-recognition of marriage discriminatory? Whether we like it or not,

marriage is a privileged social institution. Justice Kaul seems to think some of the aims of marriage can be achieved by a form of civil union. Justice Chandrachud wants to grant some rights, like those of a civil union, without quite specifying what kind of a union it is. Again, this relegates same sex union to a fugitive identity that cannot even be clearly

named, let alone fully recognised. The meaning of marriage, the conception of the goods it supports, has undergone a profound transformation, But two related ideas remain central. The first is its "publicness". It is a social institution. It has to be publicly affirmed and recognised by society. The second element is commitment. The idea behind commitment is not that a bond cannot be dissolved: That depends on circumstances. It is the idea that this relationship is meant to be non-instrumental: The parties are committing not merely to use each other as means, but to treat each other's well-being as an end in itself.

It is not merely a transactional existence, but comes with a deeper set of rights and obligations, which at their best, are an expression of that non-instrumentality. It is true that this non-instrumentality can be expressed in non-legal forms. But society's recognition of marriage is a public recognition of that form of commitment that is being denied here. The point of overlapping consensus that could be crafted between different ideologies is that granting recognition to same sex marriage would have signalled a society commitment to the publicness and non-instrumentality embodied in that relationship. Same sex marriage is an affirmation of the value of marriage, not a departure from it.

There is a quip going around about the current Court: They proclaim values with the high-mindedness of philosophers, thread fine lines on process with the ingenuity of lawyers, give history lessons with an erudition that shames historians. But ultimately, the directions cause the executive no discomfort. Alas, in its ameliorative confusion, the Court has done nothing to dispel that notion.

KHUSRUPUR, A SMALL village near Patna, was in the news recently as a woman from the Dalit community was made to suffer the insufferable. Last month, she was reportedly stripped, and subject to unprintable humiliations because her husband had taken a loan worth Rs 1,500 and had not paid the interest to a local moneylender who belonged to the dominant OBC community. This unfortunate event did not receive the attention it deserved. On meeting the victim, I experienced a deep sense of anxiety as the aggrieved was seemingly in a state of shock, unable to speak or comprehend the horrors she underwent.

An equally unfortunate incident happened on the streets of Ujjain in Madhya Pradesh where a young girl was spotted on the move seeking help in a severely disturbing state. Rightfully, this was tweeted and discussed by leaders across the political spectrum. The accused in this case has been nabbed by the Madhya Pradesh police. The worrying distinction between Khusrupur and Ujjain is the lack of empathy from a section of our political establishment. There are stark memories of the photo-op visit of the first family of the Congress party to Hathras, and the narrative paraphernalia that accompanied the trip. This can be a template for more progressive reforms in the future where long-pending reforms are transformed into legislation at such an encouraging pace. A caste-wise, party-wise analysis shows that the BIP has had the highest share (30.9 per cent) of OBC CMs, while this number is the lowest for Congress (17.2 per cent). The share of non-Congress non-BJP parties among OBC chief ministers is 28 per cent.

For long, the unvoiced and the unheard

were treated as a commodity in the political discourse. The elevation of Droupadi Murmu, the first woman from a marginalised community, to the highest constitutional office in the country, has brought a fundamental transformation in the aspirations of marginalised communities. Arjun Ram Meghwal is the only Dalit after B R Ambedkar to become Law Minister. These elevations have had a massive impact. Ilaiyaraaja is the first Dalit person to reach the Upper House of the Bharatiya Parliament as a presidential nominee — and this too has sent a message.

The day after, a disquiet

In same-sex marriage verdict, principles on which majority on bench has proceeded suggest a narrow, technical approach, which could have been avoided on a minority right

AT AROUND 11 am on Tuesday, all eyes were on the Supreme Court where the Chief Justice and four of his colleagues had convened to pronounce the judgment in the batch of cases concerning what is now popularly known as "same sex marriage". Over several weeks, lawyers had traded punches on the scope of marriage laws in India, and of whether they could include in their compass relationships among members of the LGBTQ+ community. Stemming from this were questions of other civil rights made available through the recognition of the institution of marriage — those of inheritance, adoption and property rights, as well as more run-of-the mill matters that many of us take for granted, nominees for insurance. bank accounts, medical claims, etc.

The central questions framed by the Court included: (a) whether there is a fundamental right to marriage; (b) whether the words in the Special Marriage Act could be given a gender-neutral meaning; (c) whether a civil union could be recognised under Indian law, and (d) whether an obligation could be placed on the State to recognise the relationship (and hence the rights) by law.

As Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud com-

menced reading his judgment, hope sprang from the petitioners' benches. He reiterated the authority of the Court to examine the issues at hand and rejected the government's opposition to it. The nature of queerness was the next foray, and the Court found that it had sound Indian roots, and was neither urban nor elite. Most significantly, while holding that the right to marriage was not a fundamental right, the verdict declared that the right to enter into a union was unrelated to sexual orientation and was a feature of the fundamental rights in Articles 19 and 21 of the Constitution. He then proceeded to issue a slew of directions to the various authorities to ensure that discrimination against the community could be averted.

In a brief 17 page judgment of his own, Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul agreed with the views of the Chief Justice, and while concluding that the Special Marriage Act was in fact discriminatory as its objective to regulate only heterosexual relationships was illegitimate, he also refrained from making any interpretation that would benefit the community, noting the cascading effect it could have across various laws.

By this point, it had begun to dawn on all assembled that there were differences on the Bench as both Justices Chandrachud and Kaul had expressed their disagreements with the draft opinion that had been circulated by Justice S R Bhat.

Justice Bhat, speaking for himself and Justice Kohli, agreed with the Chief Justice that there is no fundamental right to marriage, but proceeded to conclude that a right

to relationship enures under Article 21 of the Constitution. He found himself unable to go further (as the Chief Justice did) to locate a right of self-development in Articles 19, 21 and 25, or to place an obligation on the State to give recognition to civil unions by law. He aligned with the Chief Justice on the validity of the Special Marriage Act but did not believe a right of adoption and other rights could be afforded to LGBTQ+ couples through judicial diktat. In all of this, Justice Narasimha joined Justices Bhat and Kohli, who thereby constituted the majority.

For lawyers and academics, there is much material in this judgment to chew on — the rarity of the Chief Justice being a part of the minority, the deference to a government committee to consider how the community's rights could be given effect to, the interplay of religion and sexual choice while interpreting core provisions of our Constitution, and the general nature of judicial restraint.

However, as the dust settles on the heated television debates of the evening and a new day dawns, there is a grim sense of disquiet. This group of five judges are quite easily among our most erudite, sensitive, intelligent and empathetic individuals in the Supreme Court. Yet, even here, there were differences of opinion on how a practical solution could be provided to those of the LGBTQ+ community who wished to live normal lives without harassment and unpleasant obstacles. To have a spouse, to be a parent, to entrust and to align are some of the most basic needs of a human being. It is unfortunate that the syntax of another age has made it difficult for

When the right to have a family, to live with dignity and the right to privacy have been read as fundamental rights under Article 21 of the Constitution, it is a little hard to believe that non-heterosexual couples (and even unmarried heterosexual ones) need to prove that the right to marriage is a fundamental right for them to have a mechanism in place to enjoy their civil rights. The principles on which the majority has proceeded suggests a narrow, technical approach which could have been well avoided when a minority right was in contemplation. In this, the Court has lost an opportunity – one that has been availed by this very institution on innumerable occasions, with less to lose.

Marriage equality verdict was not what we had hoped for. But a change is underway

IT HAS BEEN over five months since the Supreme Court hearings on marriage equality in which we were one among many petitioners. A recurring argument, both within and outside the courtroom, was whether Indian society was ready for marriage equality. We cannot claim to know the answer to this but we can offer our experience over the last five months to perhaps further this debate.

like the calm after the storm, we had a few thundershowers of our own. In what is universally recognised as a significant and difficult event, we moved homes. We have moved many homes in our 11-yearrelationship but this one felt different. We have always been in a city surrounded by our friends and colleagues. For the first time, we were in a new city not knowing what to expect. Curious neighbours, judgemental building uncles, cooks who give us the side eye? But overwhelmingly, our family of four, including our child and dog, was welcomed by our new neighbours and community wholeheartedly. Without any legal recognition, one of us still lives in this home as a tenant of the other. But socially we are recognised as the family unit that we are.

In what is also universally recognised as significant and perhaps more difficult, our son started school. We selected a school that we felt best matched our values. But we were the first same-sex couple to enrol their child there and we were hesitant as we scratched out "Father's Name" to write one of ours in their admission form.

Six months into his school life though, our son has learned to hold his family up with pride, just like his classmates. Recently, we saw our son and his friends huddled around an art board where each child's family tree was displayed. They were deep in discussion with one of them explaining to the others: "Kisi kisi ke ghar main mama papa hote hain, kisi kisi main

mama mama aur kisi kisi main papa papa." (Some homes have a mother and a father, some two mothers and some two fathers).

To which our son added, "Kisi kisi ghar main Bombil bhi hota hai." (Some homes have Bombil, too). Bombil is our dog.

These children are the society of tomorrow and that they will grow up without inherent homophobia means everything to us. As does the fact that the school management and fellow parents are complicit in effecting this change.

Finally, less significantly, but more visibly, we grew a year older during these months. If time, experience, and our new greys have taught us anything, it is that change is all around us. Since the hearings, we have got to know many other petitioners and learned of their lives leading up to the petition. These are a diverse set of people whose commonality is not simply that they are LGBTQIA+ persons but that they are all thriving parts of Indian society. By living their lives with pride and dignity, they change society one day at a time.

There are many Indians who still do not accept non-heterosexual relation-Though the intervening months felt ships and strongly oppose their inclusion in the institution of marriage. But our biggest learning has been this: So long as there is a compassionate and continuous process of engagement, we will get there. Revolutions take many forms and the courage to live your truth will result in slow but sure change.

> This group of petitioners and all the lawyers representing them are testament to this. To see the best legal minds of our country argue for equality and inclusion has been humbling.

> There is still a lot of ground to be covered to make our country equitable and safe for LGBTQIA+ persons. But there are many good people fighting for this to happen both socially and legally. And so, for us and especially for young LGBTQIA+ Indians, there is help and hope for a life made better with rights and safeguards.

> When we filed our petition before the Supreme Court, we did so nervously, with what felt like the weight of the world on our shoulders. We were only looking ahead to what we hoped was a better future. The verdict has not been what we hoped for but as we write this, we are now able to look back and see the might of what has always stood behind us — our families, friends, colleagues, community, lawyers and we hope, our country. And along with them, we are ready for whatever tomorrow may bring.

With strings attached

Behind support for women's reservation, an ethical crisis of the political class

was made in that regard.

THE BIHAR CASTE survey highlights a factor that remains invisible in the women's reservation issue, that of caste, and the significance of the "quotas within quotas" position.

The Prime Minister claimed that God had chosen him to empower women by shepherding the passage of the Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam. Did God also suggest the stratagem of postponing its implementation to a distant future by imposing the two preconditions of census and delimitation? Or was the Prime Minister guided in this by shrewder mortals?

There are other issues such as the impropriety of claiming to be chosen by God in a space sanctified by the Constitution of a democracy that came out of an anti-imperialist struggle; the patronising title of the legislation that sets up women as idols receiving worship from men rather than as active citizens; and the patriarchal invocation in the Prime Minister's speech of women as "mothers, daughters and sisters" of presumably male citizens. Then the question of why the Nari Shakti of the wrestlers battling sexual harassment by a BJP MP was not worthy of vandana, and why the devotion to women expressed by this regime is matched by the impunity of widespread increase of violence against women all over the country during its tenure. Not to mention that delimitation is a politically charged strategy to increase the BJP's seats in the Hindi heartland into which it has now been corralled.

But let us focus on what one-third reserva-

tion for women in Parliament would actually

the Constituent Assembly but been rejected by women representatives as it was seen to underestimate the strength of women to compete as equals. In 1974, the Committee on the Status of Women in India (CSWI) considered the same question. Arguments in favour were mainly that generally patriarchal political parties fielded very few women candidates, and that reservation for women would enable them to act as a strong lobby. Arguments against were mainly that this violated the principle of equality in the Constitution; and that women cannot be equated to socially backward communities, not being a socially homogeneous group. Finally the CSWI by a majority decided to uphold the position taken in the Constituent Assembly and rejected reservation for women in Parliament and state assemblies.

In 1996, however, there appeared to be a general consensus across the political spectrum, including the women's movement, that the time for women's reservation had come.

Two developments explain this shift. One, the democratic upsurges of the 1980s and 1990s which transformed Parliament

from a largely upper-class and upper-caste body to one with a large OBC presence. Caste and social justice came to the forefront of Indian political discourse.

The other development was that women had emerged as a significant force in politics since the struggle against the Emergency, and from the 1980s feminist issues were firmly on the public agenda — dowry, equal wages, violence against women. At the same time it was clear that there were very few women in representative bodies. By 1996 then, the women's movement acknowledged that abstract citizenship was only a cover for male privilege.

Thus, the emergence of women as a significant grouping in Indian politics and the transformation of the caste composition of Parliament through the growing presence of backward castes through successive elections, produced two different, mutually opposed sets of concerns — feminist and dominant caste — that tied in at this particular conjuncture to produce the sudden general acceptability of women's reservation.

The opposition to the legislation, which held it up for so long, was not simply patriarchal. It expressed the legitimate apprehension that a blanket reservation of 33 per cent for women would replace non-dominant caste men with dominant caste women. An immediate reservation of one-third of the existing seats for women, is likely to benefit largely those women who already have the cultural and political capital to contest elections, and these are bound to be elite women. How else

to understand the BIP's determined opposition to the Mandal Commission reservations for OBCs and its equally fervent support for women's reservations?

The experience of reservation for women in Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI) since 1992 has been positive for many women, but another consequence is the strengthening of the entrenched power of dominant caste groups of the area. That is, men of less dominant castes in PRI have been replaced by women of dominant castes. Hence the opposition to the WRB had insisted on "quotas within quotas", demanding a further reservation within the 33 per cent, for OBC and Muslim women. (The SC/ST reservation is a constitutional requirement that comes into operation automatically.)

But quotas within quotas have been firmly resisted by all non-OBC parties across the political spectrum, which raises the suspicion that the objective of reservations for women is indeed to replace non-dominant caste men with dominant caste women. After all, the parties that have unanimously passed this legislation have fielded only 6.11 percent to 9 percent women from 1999 to 2019.

It seems that the sudden passing of this legislation after 27 years (its implementation indefinitely deferred, and with quotas within quotas off the table) reflects at some level the ethical crisis of the political elite as a whole.



Why Egypt is keeping Gaza's Rafah border crossing shut

THE RAFAH crossing between the Gaza Strip and Egypt is the sole route for aid to enter Gaza directly from outside Israel, and the only exit that does not lead to Israeli territory. It has become a focus in the intensifying conflict between Israel and the Palestinian militant group Hamas, as hundreds of thousands of Palestinians have headed towards south Gaza after Israel warned them to leave Gaza City and the enclave's north.

Where is the crossing?

The crossing is at the south of the Gaza Strip, a narrow slither of land home to 2.3 million people and wedged between Israel, Egypt and the Mediterranean Sea.

The crossing is controlled by Egypt.

Why is access across Rafah restricted?

Egypt is wary of insecurity near the border with Gaza in northeastern Sinai, where it faced an Islamist insurgency that peaked after 2013 and has now largely been suppressed.

Since Hamas took control in Gaza in 2007, Egypt has helped enforce a blockade of the enclave and heavily restricted the flow of people and goods. Like the main crossings with Israel, restrictions have sometimes been eased but not lifted, and travellers need security clearance and lengthy checks to pass.

In 2008, tens of thousands of Palestinians crossed into Sinai after Hamas blasted holes in border fortifications, prompting Egypt to build a stone and ce-

Egypt has acted as a mediator between



Israel and Palestinian factions during past conflicts and periods of unrest. But in those situations it has also locked down the border, allowing aid to enter and medical evacuees to leave but preventing any large-scale movement of people.

What efforts are being made to open the border?

The United Nations has urged Israel to avert a "humanitarian catastrophe" in Gaza, warning that food, fuel and even drinking water supplies are running dangerously low.

Hospitals say they are struggling to cope with the wounded as back-up generators run low on fuel. Egyptian aid trucks moved closer to the crossing on Tuesday but it was unclear when or whether they would be able to cross into Gaza.

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said on Tuesday the United States and Israel had agreed to develop a plan to get humanitarian aid to civilians in Gaza without benefiting Hamas.

The human brain has a dizzying array of mystery cells

PAPER

AN INTERNATIONAL team of scientists has mapped the human brain in much finer resolution than ever before. The brain atlas, a \$375 million effort started in 2017, has identified more than 3,300 types of brain cells, an order of magnitude more than was previously reported. The researchers have only a dim notion of what the newly discovered

The results were described in 21 papers published Thursday in Science

and several other journals. Ed Lein, a neuroscientist at the Allen Institute for Brain Science in Seattle who led five of the studies, said that the findings were made possible by new technologies that allowed the researchers to probe millions of human brain cells col-

lected from biopsied tissue or **NEW RESEARCH** cadavers. "It really shows what can be

done now," Lein said. "It opens up a whole new era of human neuroscience.'

Still, Lein said that the atlas was just a first draft. He and his colleagues have only sampled a tiny fraction of the 170 billion cells estimated to make up the human brain. Future surveys will certainly uncover more cell types, he said.

With funding from the National Institutes of Health, Lein and his colleagues set out to map the brain by inspecting how brain cells activated different genes. At least 16,000

genes are active in the brain, and they are turned on in different combinations in different types of cells.

The researchers collected brain tissue from several sources, including people who had recently died and those who were undergoing brain surgery.

Some of the newly identified cells were found in layers of cerebral cortex on the brain's outer surface. This region is essential

for complex mental tasks such as using language and making plans for the future.

> But the new studies reveal that much of the brain's diversity lies outside of the cerebral cortex. A vast number of the cell types uncovered in the project lie in the deeper regions of the brain, such as the brain stem that leads to the spinal cord.

The researchers found many

new types of neurons, cells that use electric signals and chemicals to process information. But neurons make up only about half the cells in the brain. The other half are far more mysterious.

Astrocytes, for example, appear to nurture neurons so that they can keep working properly. Microglia serve as immune cells, attacking foreign invaders and pruning some of the branches on neurons to improve their signaling. And the researchers found many new types of these cells as well.

Two views on four key issues

The Supreme Court has rejected the plea for same-sex marriage. The verdict unpacked: here are the majority and minority views on queer couples' right to marry, to adopt children, and to enter into civil unions, and on the Special Marriage Act

APURVA VISHWANATH NEW DELHI, OCTOBER 17

A FIVE-JUDGE Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court headed by Chief Justice of India (CJI) D Y Chandrachud on Tuesday refused to grant legal status to same-sex marriages. While two judges - the CJI and Justice Sanjay Kishan Kaul — recognised that queer couples can form "civil unions", they were in the minority. The majority of three judges said that the issue lay exclusively in the domain of the legislature.

Here's what the judges said on four key questions.

On the fundamental right to marry

The petitioners had argued that there exists a fundamental right to marry a person of one's own choice under the Constitution, and that the court must address the denial of that right. If the court recognised this as a fundamental right (like it did in the case of privacy in the 2017 Aadhaar ruling), then it would cast an obligation on the state to protect this right.

MINORITY VIEW: CJI Chandrachud did not agree with the petitioners' argument that marriage is an inherent right that the state only regulates. The minority view stated that marriage may not have attained the social and legal significance it currently has, if the state had not regulated it through law.

"Thus, while marriage is not fundamental in itself, it may have attained significance because of the benefits which are realised through regulation," the verdict said.

MAJORITY VIEW: Agreeing with the CJI on this issue, the majority view differentiated between what is "fundamentally important to an individual" from an enforceable fundamental right. "The fundamental importance of marriage remains that it is based on personal preference and confers social status. Importance of something to an individual does not per se justify considering it a fundamental right, even if that preference enjoys popular acceptance or support," Justice Bhat said.

The majority opinion also noted that the logic in many decisions by courts in the US that have underlined the rationale for declaring the right to marry a fundamental right as "being essential to the orderly pursuit of Happiness (as it appears in their Declaration of Independence) by free persons" may not be sound.

On the interpretation of **Special Marriage Act**

The key framing of how the court can recognise same-sex marriage was by allowing a gender-neutral interpretation of the

legislation that governs a civil marriage in which the state, rather than religion, sanctions the marriage.

The SMA was enacted in 1954 to enable marriage between inter-faith or inter-caste couples without them giving up their religious identity or resorting to conversion.

The petitioners had asked the SC to interpret the word marriage as between "spouses" instead of "man and woman". Alternatively, the petitioners had asked for striking down provisions of the SMA that are gender-restrictive.

MINORITY VIEW: On the expansive reading, CJI Chandrachud said the court could not allow that, because it would "in effect be entering into the realm of the legislature". If the court were to instead grant the second option to read down the SMA to the extent that it is gender restrictive, "it would take India back to the pre-Independence era where two persons of different religions and caste were unable to celebrate love in the form of marriage.'

MAJORITY VIEW: While arriving at the same conclusion, Justice Bhat stated that the court could not interpret the SMA to include same-sex couples since the objective of the legislation is not to include same-sex couples within the realm of marriage.

"The provisions and the objects of the SMA clearly point to the circumstance that

Parliament intended only one kind of couples, i.e., heterosexual couples belonging to different faiths, to be given the facility of a civil marriage," Justice Bhat said.

On queer couples' right to adopt a child

The petitioners had argued that the guidelines of the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA), which does not allow unmarried couples to jointly adopt children, is discriminatory against queer couples who cannot legally marry.

The guidelines allow only a couple who have been in at least two years of a stable marital relationship to be eligible to adopt Individually, queer persons can adopt as single people. However, a single male is not eligible to adopt a girl child — even though a single female is eligible to adopt a child of any gender.

MINORITY VIEW: The CJI in his opinion struck down certain CARA regulations on the grounds that the legislation's object is not to preclude unmarried couples from adopting a child. "In fact, all the other criteria ensure the child's best interests. The Union of India has not proved that precluding unmarried couples from adopting a child (even though the same people are eligible to adopt in their individual capacity) is in the child's best interests," the CJI wrote.

The minority view added that the exclusion of same-sex couples from adopting has the effect of "reinforcing the disadvantage already faced by the gueer community. Law cannot make an assumption on good and bad parenting based on the sexuality of individuals".

MAJORITY VIEW: The majority view largely agreed with the discriminatory aspects of preventing queer couples from adopting children. Justice Bhat termed this as having the "most visible" discriminatory impact on queer couples, and in principle agreed that a couple "tied together in marriage are not a 'morally superior choice', or per se make better parents".

Yet, the majority view said that this change cannot be "achieved by the judicial pen".

"...The fact that Parliament has made the legislative choice of including only 'married' couples for joint adoption (i.e., where two parents are legally responsible), arises from the reality of all other laws wherein protections and entitlements flow from the institution of marriage. To read down 'marital' status as proposed may have deleterious impacts that only the legislature and executive could remedy...," Justice Bhat wrote.

On the option of civil unions for queer couples

The halfway approach of recognising civil unions for queer couples was debated during the hearing. Before full marriage rights were recognised for same-sex couples by the US Supreme Court, several states had allowed civil unions.

However, the petitioners argued that civil unions are not an equal alternative to the legal and social institution of marriage, and "relegating non-heterosexual relationships to civil unions would send the queer community a message that their relationships were inferior to those of heterosexual

MINORITY VIEW: The CJI located the right to form intimate associations within the fundamental right to freedom of speech and expression. The CJI stated that for this right to have "real meaning", the state must recognise "a bouquet of entitlements which flow from an abiding relationship of this kind". The minority view noted Solicitor General Tushar Mehta's statement that a committee chaired by the Cabinet Secretary would be constituted to set out the rights which would be available to queer couples

MAJORITY VIEW: Justice Bhat disagreed with the view that the court can prescribe a "choice" of civil unions to queer couples. The majority opinion said that the state should facilitate this choice for those who wish to exercise it, is an outcome that the community may agree upon.

A looming invasion: Implications for Gaza, Hamas, Palestinian cause



AS PRESIDENT Joe Biden heads to Tel Aviv and Amman on Wednesday to meet with the leaders of Israel, Jordan, Egypt, and the Palestinian Authority, the US, while backing the overthrow of Hamas, has expressed concern over the massive destruction and civilian deaths that Israel's imminent ground invasion of Gaza will likely bring.

What are the implications of an Israeli

ground invasion for Gaza and Israel? If this were to happen, it would lead to one of the most horrific humanitarian catastrophes of the 21st century. Gaza is a narrow strip of land, among the mostly densely populated areas in the world. Hamas mili-

tary men will be hard to find, and innocent civilians will be easy targets, as we have seen in the past few days of the massive Israeli retaliation.

Politically and strategically, there does not seem to be a clear Israeli roadmap for what comes next after Hamas is supposedly destroyed. A direct Israeli reoccupation of Gaza will mean more loss of lives on both sides, and will encourage more resistance from Hamas splinters.

We hear of Hamas whenever it launches an attack on Israel. But Hamas is also a religious movement and political party. What other roles does it play in the everyday life of Palestinians?

Hamas is — and is seen by the Palestinians — as a multifaceted social, religious, political, and military organisation, not an isolated or marginal group that could be squashed by a security strike. Its mother organisation, the Palestinian Muslim Brotherhood, was founded during the British Mandate in the 1940s. It continued to exist after the creation

of Israel in 1948, but did not engage in resistance or confrontation like other nationalist or Marxist Palestinian organisations. Their focus was on charities, social services, mosques. universities, proselytising, etc.

In 1987, they changed their strategy and adopted resistance as their goal. The deep, multi-dimensional integration of the movement in Palestinian society sets it apart from other extremist groups on the fringes. After 2000, when peace talks between Israel and the Palestine Liberation Organisation became fruitless, Hamas and its strategy of resistance gained the support of more Palestinians, leading to its winning the Palestinian legislative elections in 2006.

Since then, Hamas has been caged in the Gaza Strip along with 2 million Palestinians, many of whom see the movement as their vehicle of resistance against Israeli occupation.

Some analysts say Israel, ironically, helped strengthen Hamas in order to ensure a continuing political rift

between Hamas and Fatah (the party of Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas).

Since 2005, the Israeli strategy has been to create splits within the Palestinians and secure an environment that sustains a deep Palestinian divide between the Gaza Strip and the West Bank. In line with the classical colonial strategy of divide and conquer, this succeeded — and was helped along by the rivalry and politics among Palestinian factions. Israel would monitor both parties, and if it observed the balance of power tilting to one side, it would ease some restrictions on the other to keep both strong enough to keep competing with each other.

What is the future of Hamas?

It is difficult to imagine how Israel could eliminate Hamas completely, because this is a movement that is deeply entrenched within the Palestinian people in the Gaza Strip and the West Bank, and enjoys support abroad. You could eliminate ISIS from this country or that because it was imposed on the people. and it never enjoyed internal support. Hamas

has been internally evolved; people see their sons, brothers, friends as part of it.

If Hamas is militarily destroyed in Gaza and its rule is removed, there will be longterm chaos, unless a broader political solution gives hope to the Palestinians. The alternative to Hamas would most likely be more extreme splinter groups.

What role can Fatah and President Mahmoud Abbas play in this crisis?

Fatah is divided internally, mostly between those who support the status quo of Mahmoud Abbas — and whoever would come when he is no longer there — in coordination with Israel, and those who want to change the entire game and stop functioning under the overarching Israeli control.

There were intense debates within Fatah recently, and the outcome of these debates including who would succeed Abbas will influence the future of the Palestinian Authority and its relations with Hamas. In the short term, it is difficult for Hamas to replace the PA in the West Bank because of the Israeli de facto

occupation of the West Bank.

What would be the implication of the October 7 attacks on the ongoing peace process between Israel and Arab nations?

In the short term, the [US-mediated] Abraham Accords have been discredited in the eyes of many Arabs because of the devastating scenes coming out of Gaza. Saudi Arabia has announced that talks for normalisation with Israel have been frozen. The events of October 7 have derailed or at least delayed the train of normalisation between some Arab states and Israel.

THE GAZA Health Ministry said an Israeli airstrike Tuesday hit a Gaza City hospital packed with wounded and other Palestinians seeking shelter, killing hundreds. If confirmed, the attack would be by far the deadliest Israeli airstrike in five wars fought since 2008. Photos from al-Ahli Hospital showed fire engulfing the hospital halls, shattered glass and body parts scattered across the area. The ministry said at least 500 people had been killed.

Several hospitals in Gaza City have become refuges for hundreds of people, hoping they would be spared bombardment after Israel ordered all residents of the city and surrounding areas to evacuate to the southern Gaza Strip.

Israeli military spokesman Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari said there were still no details on the hospital deaths: "We will get the details and update the public. I don't know to say whether it was an Israeli air strike."

Japan reaches out to Iran: Talk to Hamas, dial down tensions

JAPANESE FOREIGN Minister Yoko Kamikawa asked his Iranian counterpart on Tuesday to talk to the militant Palestinian group Hamas to try to ease tension in the conflict with Israel, the Japanese Foreign Ministry said. Kamikawa held a phone call with Hossein Abdollahian on Tuesday as Israel prepares to escalate an offensive against Hamas that has triggered a humanitarian crisis in Gaza and raised fears of a broader conflict with Iran.

Kamikawa and Abdollahian agreed to cooperate to improve humanitarian access to Gaza, a foreign ministry statement said.

Kamikawa said there were currently about 900 Japanese citizens in Israel and the Palestinian territories, and Deputy Chief Cabinet Secretary Hideki Murai later said the government planned to evacuate them with Japanese military aircraft this week.

Khamenei: Israel must halt Gaza assault

VIOLENCE ESCALATED on the Lebanese-Israeli border on Tuesday with five fighters from Lebanon's heavily armed Hezbollah group killed during operations against Israel, security sources in Lebanon said.

In the most serious flare-up at the frontier in 17 years, Iranbacked Hezbollah and Israeli forces have traded fire almost daily since Palestinian Islamist group Hamas attacked Israel on October 7 and Israel responded with fierce air strikes on Gaza.

The Israeli army, which said it would shoot anyone coming near the border or meddling with its fence, said it killed four people on Tuesday who had tried to cross the barrier and plant an explosive device. It did not say where this took place.

Hezbollah confirmed that five of its fighters had been killed

but it was not immediately clear if any of them were the same ones referred to by Israel.

Hezbollah, an ally of Hamas and Palestinian militant group Islamic Jihad which both have operatives in Lebanon, said it

carried out attacks including a guided-missile strike against an Israeli army vehicle in the Israeli border town of Metula. The al-Manar television channel run by Hezbollah reported "fierce Israeli shelling" on

Lebanese territory across the frontier from Metula. Israel's army reported attacks in three locations including

Metula. It said no Israeli army personnel had been injured. Canada told its citizens in

Lebanon on Tuesday to leave the country while commercial flights were still available. Lebanese carrier Middle East

Airlines (MEA) said it would keep five of its 24 planes in Turkey as a precaution in case of armed conflict.

Sikh assaulted in US for wearing turban

IN A SUSPECTED hate crime, a 19-year-old Sikh was assaulted and injured in New York for wearing a turban while travelling in a shuttle bus, the police

The attack took place early on Sunday when the Sikh teen was riding a shuttle bus in Queens, a borough of New York City, CBS News channel reported.

According to the police, the suspect approached the victim, asking him to remove his turban and said, "We don't wear that in this country and take that mask off!" The attacker then repeatedly punched the teen in his face, back, and the back of his head, causing minor cuts. He also tried to remove the victim's turban from his head before getting off the bus, the report said.

Police described the suspect as "a male, 25-35 years of age, dark complexion, slim build, ap-

proximately 5'9" tall, with brown eyes and black hair," and sought the public's help to find him.

The New York Police Department hate crime unit is investigating the incident, and the police department is calling it a hate crime assault, NBC New York TV channel reported.

No arrests have been made in the case yet, The Messenger news portal reported.

The victim, who was not named, refused further medical treatment at the scene, police said in the statement.

"Right now, the victim is very traumatised," community activist Japneet Singh was quoted as saying by ABC7 television station. "The family is very scared for him," Singh added.

Though he refused treatment at the scene, Singh says the victim was injured badly enough that he won't be able to work for the next few days. "We are in contact with the survivor and working with him to provide support as needed," police said.

US leaders should learn to respect: Putin

Moscow: Russian President Vladimir Putin on Tuesday rejected comments by US President Joe Biden, saying in an interview in Beijing that Moscow's interests could not be suppressed, and that US politicians should learn to respect others. Putin was responding to comments by US President Joe Biden in an interview with CBS News, where he said: "Imagine what happens if we, in fact, unite all of Europe and Putin is finally put down where he cannot cause the kind of trouble he's been causing".

In a brief interview, Putin said: "This is not about me personally. This is about the interests of the country. And it is impossible to suppress the interests of Russia. They have to be taken into account." Putin said that both Biden, and the wider American political elite needed to learn to "respect" Russia. AP

Man accused of killing Swedish football fans in Brussels shot dead

POLICE ON Tuesday shot dead a suspected Tunisian extremist accused of gunning down two Swedish soccer fans in a brazen assault on a Brussels street that sent shockwaves through

Belgium and Sweden. Hours after the suspect disappeared into the night and a manhunt was launched in the Belgian capital, Interior Minister Annelies Verlinden posted on X, formerly Twitter, that "the perpetrator of the terrorist attack in Brussels has been identified and has died." She thanked Belgium's intelligence and security services, as well as prosecutors, "for their swift and decisive action." The man was shot in the Schaerbeek neighbourhood near where the rampage took place.

The weapon used in the assault

was recovered.

Amateur videos posted on social media of Monday's attack showed a man wearing an orange fluorescent vest pull up on a scooter, take out a large weapon and open fire on people getting out of a taxi.

He chased them into a building to gun them down. He was also filmed calmly loading his weapon as cars drove slowly by.

Questions remain unanswered over how a man who was on police files, thought to be radicalised and being sought for deportation, was able to obtain a military weapon and launch such an attack. Not far from the scene of the

shooting, the Belgium-Sweden soccer match in the national stadium was suspended at halftime and over 35,000 fans were kept inside as a precaution while the attacker was at large. Caroline Lochs, a fan from Antwerp, said the alarm left her feeling "frustrated, confused, scared".



According to an official statement issued by the Indian government, the Prime Minister appreciated Google's partnership with Hewlett Packard (HP) to manufacture Chromebooks in India.

Google's manufacturing plans in India

Google recently started producing its Chromebook laptops in India through a partner-EXPLAINED

ship forged with HP, in a major boost to the country's electronics manufacturing ambitions.

The move puts Google among the most high-profile names to kickstart manufacturing in India as companies across the world look to diversify their supply chains in the wake of turbulent geopolitical times.

The Chromebooks — laptops that run on Google's Chrome operating system will be manufactured at the Flex facility near Chennai, where HP has been producing a range of laptops and desktops since August 2020. The production has started from October 2 and will cater to the demand for affordable PCs in India, mainly from the education sector.

Chromebooks are among the most popular laptops used in educational institutions worldwide, but are yet to find mainstream traction in India, where laptops running on the Windows operating system continue to rule the roost.

The move will help Google compete more effectively with Windows computers from companies such as Dell, Lenovo, and Asus.

Why local electronics manufacturing is important for India

The development is in line with India's ambition to establish itself as a "trusted partner" in global supply chains, especially at a time when companies, especially from America, are looking to diversify from China – the traditional hub of such manufacturing for decades.

While India has a big domestic demand for laptops and computers, almost all of it is currently being fulfilled by imports from China, something New Delhi wants to change as soon as possible.

India has seen an increase in imports of electronic goods and laptops/computers in the last few years.

During April-June this year, the import of electronic goods increased to \$6.96 billion from \$4.73 billion in the year-ago period, with a share of 4-7 per cent in overall im-

The highest share of imports is in the category of personal computers, including

laptops and palmtops, under which imports from China stood at \$558.36 million in April-May this year as against \$618.26 million in the year-ago pe-

China accounts for roughly 70-80 per cent of the share of India's imports of personal computers, laptops.

As the window for the Centre's production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme closed in August, over 40 companies including Dell, HP, Asus, Acer and Lenovo — applied to participate in the programme to manufacture laptops, computers and servers in India.

Apple has opted to skip it. The government is expected to clear applications of around 30 companies soon, a majority of whom will start production from next April, it is understood.

Beyond manufacturing

Even as India has turned towards incentives to kickstart a manufacturing industry that has traditionally not existed in the country in a meaningful way, it has also adopted policy changes to discourage imports from China.

In August, the government had attempted to impose a licensing requirement on the import of laptops and computers, but was forced to delay the directive's implementation till October 31 after strong pushback from the industry. **FULL REPORT ON** www.indianexpress.com

DABUR INDIA RECEIVED A TAX DEMAND OF OVER ₹320 CRORE

As GST notices pile up, FMCG, auto, insurers face the brunt

DABUR INDIA on Tuesday became the latest entrant to the steadily expanding list of companies receiving tax notices, with a goods and services tax (GST) demand of over Rs 320 crore, a charge that the consumer goods company said it will challenge before the relevant authorities.

Over the last few months, companies in sectors ranging from fast-moving consumer goods (FMCG) to automobiles to mattresses makers and insurance companies have received a spate of show cause-cum-demand notices from the GST authorities for issues relating to "short payment" of taxes, "wrongful availment" of credit and mismatch of details in their returns dating back to 2017-18.

Insurance companies such as LIC, Bajaj Allianz, ICICI Prudential, ICICI Lombard, Star Health and Allied Insurance along with other companies such as Maruti Suzuki, Akzo Nobel, Sheela Foam are among those that have received GST show cause notices in the last few months. This is in addition to the notices being sent to various online gaming companies and casinos for alleged under-



Experts said these notices will now translate into further demand and appeals, marking the start of a long legal battle.

payment of GST.

Experts said most of these notices have been sent as the time limitation period of three years for sending notices for financial year 2017-18 was coming to an end this fiscal. The limitation period begins after the filing of annual returns for the year to which the demand is related. Deadlines for filing annual returns had got repeatedly extended during the initial GST implementation phase and later during the Covid-19 pandemic, hence, the limitation period for 2017-18 came to an end in September this year. GST authorities have sent out a spate of notices before this deadline for the year 2017-18, which was the first year of the indirect tax

regime after its rollout in July

"With approaching normal period of limitation for FY2017-18, there was a general expectation of notices being issued on the matter. Industry has been evaluating the said ruling on their specific facts and taking an appropriate view also keeping in mind that a similar matter is pending disposal at Supreme Court," Abhishek Jain, Indirect Tax Head and Partner, KPMG

Also, as there were teething troubles in the initial period of implementation of the GST, many such notices have risen out of mismatch between GSTR-1 and GSTR-3B, the returns reflecting sales and the summary

of all transactions including GST paid and input tax credit availed, respectively. "For cases pertaining to 2017-18 and 2018-19, authorities are listening to responses by companies. However, if there are repeated occurrences, then they are nudging for a payment of the tax demand and the penalty," another expert, who did not wish to be named, said. Service sector companies es-

pecially seem to be facing the brunt of notices from various jurisdictional authorities as they have taken multiple registrations under GST, running in number from 25-30 compared with single registration in the pre-GST phase. "If a service sector company has registrations in 25 states, it has meant fighting 25 battles in 25 states," a tax expert said. Experts said with these spate

of showcause notices now translating into further demand notices and appeals in the coming months, this essentially means start of a long legal battle for companies under GST. Dabur India in its exchange

The purchase consideration payable by the company for the purchase of 100 per cent of SMG's equity shares will be discharged by way of issue and allotment of 1.23 crore equity shares of the company having face value of Rs 5 each to SMC, at a price of Rs 10,420.85 per equity share, on a preferential basis.

Maruti shares gained 0.31 per cent at Rs 10,742.05 on the BSE on Tuesday. The board of Maruti ap-

proved the acquisition of 1,284 crore equity shares of Rs 10 each representing 100 per cent paidup equity share capital of Suzuki Motor Gujarat.

"The proposed transaction is being done at "arm's length", taking into account the valuation report issued by RBSA Valuation Advisors LLP, independent registered Valuer, in accordance with the applicable laws," Maruti said. The acquisition of purchase shares will be subject to such regulatory and statutory approvals as may be required under applicable laws including the approval of the minority shareholders of the company by way of postal

States to spend 29% more on capex in FY24, says ICRA

STATES ARE on course to spend 29 per cent more on capital expenditure in the ongoing fiscal, aided by additional central grants and market borrowings, a report said on Tuesday. The increased capex spending

will see their debt-level in relation to their gross domestic product rising to 30 per cent from 28.9 per cent in FY23, a report by Icra Ratings said. The combined capital spend-

ing of 13 major states will rise 29 per cent this fiscal to Rs 6.2 lakh crore from Rs 4.8 lakh crore in FY23, the report said. However, despite the year-on-

year growth, the capex spending is likely to be Rs 50,000 crore lower than the FY24 Budget estimates of Rs 6.7 lakh crore, Icra said.

The aggregate fiscal deficit of these states for FY24 is expected to go up by Rs 60,000 crore to Rs 8.3 lakh crore as against the budgeted estimate of Rs 7.7 lakh crore, the ratings agency said.

ing the July-September period against Rs 9,974 crore a year earlier, BFL said in a regulatory filing.

The Pune-headquartered company's total expenditure rose to Rs 8,624 crore compared to Rs 6,222 crore in the year-ago period. Its consolidated assets under management as of September 30, 2022, grew by 33 per cent to Rs 2,90,264 crore from Rs 2,18,366 crore a year ago. FinMin fixes ceiling for ad hoc bonus at ₹7,000 for govt staff

the Department of Expenditure under the Finance Ministry said non-productivity linked bonus (ad hoc bonus) equivalent to 30 days emoluments for the accounting year 2022-23 has been granted to the central government employees in Group 'C' and all non-gazetted employees in Group B', who are not covered by any productivity-linked bonus scheme.

The ceiling for payment of ad hoc bonus under these orders will be monthly emoluments of Rs 7,000, it said. The payment of ad hoc bonus will also be admissible to the eligible employees of Central Para Military Forces and Armed Forces.







Netherlands coach Ryan cooks up the perfect recipe for landmark victory

LUCKNOW. OCTOBER 17

ON TUESDAY in Dharamsala, Netherlands pulled off one of the biggest upsets in ICC Men's Cricket World Cup history, as they brought down the high-flying South Africa.

Overseeing the result was coach Ryan Cook, who did not have the greatest of starts for his stint. He got the role after the thencoach Ryan Campbell suffered a series of cardiac arrests in April 2022. In Cook's first match as a coach in June 2022, England almost breached the 500-run mark (498 for 4) against the Dutch.

But after initial turbulence, things steadied. They gave Pakistan a run for their money, only losing two ODIs by 17 and nine runs. By then, Ryan was cooking something. He has started to apply Gary Kirsten's school of thought in his coaching and the results followed. First they defeated Zimbabwe and South Africa in the ICC T20 World Cup in

Australia. The Dutch followed it with an incredible run in the ODI World Cup qualifiers, the highlight being the tied match against against West Indies that they won it in the

For Cook, it all started in 2013, when he travelled to India as an assistant coach of the South Africa U-19 team. He wrote to Kirsten, trying to understand the conditions in India. "He wrote me a big mail. Explained all the venues, and conditions beautifully. There was a very minute detail in it," Cook had told The Indian Express ahead of their World Cup campaign. "Gary was very specific about why the

players should be put first," he said. "The most interesting thing that he wrote was that cricket is a team sport and you need the brilliance of 11 to win a game. A couple of good performances should not be good enough."

Cook, whose elder brother Stephen Cook and father Jimmy Cook have played cricket for South Africa, took on board the inputs



he travelled to India as an assistant coach of the South Africa U-19 team.

given by a former Proteas superstar and India's World Cup-winning coach in Kirsten. "I worked with him for a few months in

Cape Town at his cricket academy. It was a great learning experience. I understood the importance of mental health," he said. "Ahead of the ODI World Cup qualifier in Zimbabwe, we had a mental and cultural camp in Cape Town. Every single person on the squad was asked to speak up about their aspirations. What they want to see in the team. I remember Bas de Leede saying 'let's go to India and show them we are not pushovers'."

Inspirational figure

"Scott (Edwards) is an inspirational leader. He has created a great atmosphere in the team. I personally told the boys that I want to have 11 Ryan ten Doeschate in the Dutch team. That's the goal," he added.

When asked what made the Netherlands team believe in themselves, Cook recalled the horrendous experience of the first ODI in charge against England. "They were playing book cricket. Phil Salt, Dawid Malan and Jos Buttler scored centuries but the brightest part was that our shoulders were not down. We knew we could only learn from that game," he said.

While the Netherlands are obviously short on top-flight cricket experience, they are rich in talent. Players like Edwards, Logan Van Beek, and Bas de Leede have shown that there is an abundance of talent, and many of them ply their trade in English league cricket as well. Several Dutch players like Paul van Meekeren have also played in T20 leagues.

"Let me tell you a story. When we were chasing 374 against West Indies. I told the boys at the break look we chased down the Nepal's 167 runs target in 28 overs and if we can just double our score in the last 20 overs, we have a chance. We tied the game and then Logan van Beek blasted 30 runs (4, 6, 4, 6, 6, 4) in the super over. What a match it was," he recalled.

The Dutch arrived in India two weeks before the start of the tournament. They played three practice matches against Karnataka and they didn't go well. Their official warmup games against India and Australia were also washed out. Their campaign then started with two defeats.

On Monday, when asked about the Dharamsala outfield ahead of their match against South Africa, Cook said it is better than where they train in the Netherlands. It offered a peek into the team's mindset. And as they stunned the Proteas with clinical efficiency, they did so tapping into all the attributes that Cook spoke about.

The only aim for Cook from this World Cup was that he wanted his team to rub shoulders with the best and set a lofty ambition to win three or four matches. "People often refer to us as cricket minions. We see ourselves as a cricketing nation that plays in a good style. We compete against the best teams in the world. We'll be putting everything in to get those three or four victories in our bag," he had said.

He can place one massive tick next to that particular task on his checklist.

Skipper Edwards stands tall by going low



NETHERLANDS OPENER Max O'Dowd terms his captain Scott Edwards as an "awkward, but great man". "Whether it be golf at 7:00 AM or the World Cup, he's always ready."

Being born in the South Pacific island of Tonga and raised in Melbourne before making his international debut with the Netherlands in 2017 after their first-choice wicketkeeper got injured, Edwards has always been ready for whatever assignment has come his way since his early cricketing days. Even the captaincy would come out of the blue last summer after Pieter Seelaar was forced to retire owing to a long-term back injury.

It was only fitting that O'Dowd's words resonated once again as the Dutch skipper bailed his team from five down for 82 to 245 against a redhot Proteas pace attack, before their bowlers sealed a memorable deal.

The result was no flash in the pan after the Dutch had knocked out the Proteas from last year's T20 World Cup in Australia as well.

While Edwards may have stood tall in the proverbial sense, it was the righthander stooping low to repeatedly sweep Keshav Maharaj that was the highlight of his innings. It's a shot he's known for, atypical for most tall players but not for Edwards, who seems to take a cue out of his wicketkeeping technique. Maharaj seemed clueless as the left-arm orthodox kept offering the Dutch skipper the length and line he needed - full and on the stumps. Edwards even bisected deep square-leg and deep backward square-leg fielder off a length ball pitched outside offstump.

Perhaps the high point of his sweeping displays would come in the last over of the Dutch innings when he did it off pacer Gerald Coetzee picking one of the many slower onesgetting low to pick it from outside the off-stump and hit it over short fineleg for four. **RAHUL PANDEY**

Dutch douse Protea fire

After upsetting SA at last year's T20 WC, Netherlands repeat the dose as Van der Merwe stars

ALL-ROUNDER Roelof van der Merwe had stressed ahead of the game that facing his former national side South Africa 'dragged the same weight for him' as playing any other team at the World Cup. But on Tuesday, that barely looked the case as soon as he was done bowling his first delivery. A wide-arm slider angled in from round the wicket left Proteas skipper

Temba Bavuma's middle and leg stumps top-

pled. Van der Merwe's joyous scream could be

heard reverberating around the HPCA Stadium. Most of the 10,000-plus crowd in the stands seemed to be behind the Men in Orange, perhaps with some foresight of what was to follow. A night that saw the Dutch upsetting the Proteas at a Cricket World Cup for the second time in less than a year with a 38run margin. The Netherlands, who were reduced to 82/5 and later 140/7, managed to

reach 245 in 43 overs in the rain-reduced en-

counter, before bundling out South Africa for

207. For Van der Merwe, whose decibel levels

only got higher as the Dutch turned the screws, it was a night of closure. Twelve years ago, he'd missed out on playing in an ODI World Cup in the subcontinent for South Africa. That opportunity - a second go at the dream of playing in the sport's marquee tournament - would finally come in 2023. At the age of 38, following a switch of allegiance from his motherland to his mother's land. That he was a key protagonist in scripting Tuesday's win - with both bat and ball-only felt fitting. But he wasn't the only Dutch hero on the night.

For Paul van Meekeren, who cleaned up Aiden Markram soon after van der Merwe had castled Bavuma, it was an evening of living up to his word. Ahead of the competition, when asked what the expectations were within the group going into the 10-team tournament as the only associate member, he'd proclaim, "We're here to cause chaos."

Also causing chaos was Logan van Beek, who finished with the best bowling figures on the night, and had his own moment of fulfillment at the world stage. The Christchurchborn all-rounder was also forced to relocate from his country of birth to fulfill a World Cup dream. He wasn't the first Van Beek to change colors in international cricket. Logan's grandfather Sammy Guillen had played three Tests for New Zealand having started his cricket career with the West Indies. Against South Africa, his grandson would be the first in the family to claim a World Cup win.

It was van Beek who'd remove the final hurdles in the Dutch path by dismissing both Heinrich Klaasen and David Miller, who were counter-attacking after an early flurry of wickets. A short one to Klaasen - which he hit straight to the fielder at fine leg – was followed by a delivery in Miller's arc which a swipe missed. And his third strike saw Keshav Maharaj skying the ball straight to wicketkeeper-captain Scott Edwards to cap off a memorable evening for Dutch cricket. Perhaps even more so than the one they had in Adelaide

last year. While the T20 World Cup win against the same opposition in Australia was a big outcome in itself, the Netherlands' besting South Africa in the 50-overs tournament holds more weight, given the requirements of the format. On the eve of the game, Proteas captain Temba Bavuma would emphasise that while his team remembered the result from last year, ODIs required 'more consistency' for teams to pull off

something similar. Responding to his comments, Netherlands head coach Ryan Cook stated, "The 50 overs is a format that we pride ourselves a lot in. It's a format that we play a lot. We don't play Tests, and not a lot of T20s. We understand the consistencies that come with playing 50-over

cricket for a long time." Less than 24 hours later, as he joined his players in post-match celebrations, they'd

proved their coach right. Skipper Edwards, who was also the Player of the match and is known for being a man of few words, would emphasise again that his team was not satisfied with one-off wins and was not here to just make up the numbers. "We came into the tournament where we wanted to have a chance in the semi-finals and if you want to do that you have got to beat teams, and South Africa are one of the favourites the way they are playing."

Facing the Netherlands next will be Sri Lanka, who have lost three in a row at the start of their campaign. As they look for their first win at this World Cup, they would take the Dutch lightly at their own peril.

South African fans enjoy World Cup fever and trace their Indian roots

DHARAMSALA, OCTOBER 17

Soon after landing in the Indian capital, Natalie Nel would be questioned by the lady at the immigration counter whether she really was South African? The Cape Town local makes a facepalm while sitting at the HPCA Stadium in Dharamsala as her husband

Seton narrates the incident. "She (the immigration official) kept looking at her ID. 'South African? No, you must be Indian'," he says before Natalie finally breaks from a laugh to reveal that the lady at the counter may not have been totally wrong.

It's a first Cricket World Cup experience that's brought the 41-year-old for a maiden visit to the homeland of her great-grandfa-

ther. "My maternal great-grandfather was from Surat," she shares. "Unfortunately, I never got to meet him or my grandfather. They came to South Africa and were classified as white to not Indian. So, we grew up

never really knowing about it. I was only told about it some 20 years ago. A cousin of mine did a lot of research into exactly where we come from."

Seton adds that the two could just as easily have been in France at this point of time. "Well, she gave me the option. Do I want to go to the Cricket World Cup or Rugby? But it was quite obvious that we would want to come here. It's a well known fact that Indians are the most extreme, passionate cricket supporters."

That passion is audible at the HPCA Stadium when the covers were being taken off the pitch. "That's what we want," remarks Seton, anticipating the start of the South Africa-Netherlands game which had been delayed owing to continuous showers since the morning.

For Natalie, who concedes not being a big rugby or cricket fan, the visit involves a bigger purpose. "I never knew where I actually came from. I always thought it was from my dad's side - Spanish or Portuguese. It's been really surreal exploring my roots here."

It's a trip that's cost the Nels roughly half a million in Indian currency, one that also takes them to South Africa's next game against England in Mumbai, other than visits to Delhi, Jaipur and Agra.

"We haven't really kept a check of how much we've been spending," Natalie concedes before her husband interjects, "A lot more than what the budget was, because Natalie loves to shop. You may or may not have the best cricket team but you definitely have the best salespersons."

Speaking of best, what about the cricket scenery on offer at the venue? For the two Cape Town locals, where does the Dharamsala cricket stadium stand among the most picturesque venues in the sport?

"We don't get snow on our mountain. That's maybe a point or two in their favour," Seton weighs in. But they're both beautiful and have unique factors. I feel I've been lucky to be at this venue and at Newlands."

The conversation then veers towards who has been the best team at the tournament so far, and why it's South Africa? Seton

reminisces about the scars of the past but hopes his first Cricket World Cup trip can be the lucky charm for the Proteas. "We came here not anticipating being one of the favourites. But the two performances so far...I think we have a really good chance of going all the way."

As the conversation veers towards a close the sun has started beating down on the stadium for the first time in the day. The match was about to begin after a two-hour delay. With his wife seated by his corner, a thought takes over Seton. "What if it's a South Africa-India final? Wouldn't it be just wow?"

Who'll Natalie support in her family derby? She takes a while before choosing "South Africa." Much to the delight of her partner, who pumps his fist.

"Just to keep the peace. Sports is not really my thing. I'll watch if there's a big rugby match and we have friends over or we are watching the cricket socially with friends. But my life doesn't revolve around sport that much," says Natalie, who admits being content with the bigger takeaway from her trip.

Inappropriate conduct during India game: PCB files complaint

PAKISTAN CRICKET Board on Tuesday said that they have lodged a complaint over what they termed 'inappropriate conduct' aimed at Pakistan players during their match against India at Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad.

PCB also said that they have raised concerns to the International Cricket Coucil regarding delay in visas for Pakistani journalists as well as the absence of fans from the country for the World Cup campaign.

The governing body wrote on their official social media handle, "PCB has lodged another formal protest with the ICC over delays in visas for Pakistani journalists and the absence of a visa policy for Pakistan fans for the ongoing World Cup 2023. The PCB has also filed a complaint regarding inappropriate conduct targeted at the Pakistan squad during the India vs Pakistan match held on 14 October 2023."

At the toss of the match, captain Babar Azam was booed loudly when he attempted to speak to broadcaster Ravi Shastri. Videos later emerged on social media after the match where Pakistan cricketer Mohmmad Rizwan was shown to be at the receiving end of 'Jai Shri Ram' chants as he walked back to the dressing room.

Before the highly-anticipated contest in Ahmedabad on Saturday, PCB had already called on the country's foreign secretary to step in and solve the ongoing impasse for their journalists and fans. According to PCB spokesperson Umar Farooq, the board's management committee chairman Zaka Ashraf had met Pakistan foreign secretary Syrus Sajjad, raising concerns about the visa delays faced by their journalists and fans for their travel to India. This meeting comes three days after the PCB first wrote to the ICC flagging concerns about the delay faced by journalists and fans from Pakistan.

Pakistan are playing their first tournament in India since the 2016 T20 World Cup.

After the defeat against Ahmedabad in front of an almost entirely Indian crowd, Pakistan director Mickey Arthur had said that the event did not feel like a World Cup match when asked how it felt to play in front of virtually no support. "It didn't seem like an ICC event to be brutally honest. It seemed like a bilateral series; it seemed like a BCCI event. I didn't hear Dil Dil Pakistan coming through the microphones too often tonight," Arthur had said.

AFGHANISTAN IS yet to play an international fixture at home. Lack of cricketing infrastructure and facilities means they train in the UAE. Yet the team that upset world champions England looks a well-prepared side that has been quick to adapt to conditions. It doesn't come as a surprise when one traces the cricketing journeys of various individuals in this exciting squad.

Afghanistan has a handful of players with vast experience and exposure of playing in different countries and conditions. Every T20 league around the world has a liberal sprinkling of Afghan players. Sharing the dressing room with the game's greats, learning from the best cricketing minds and using the best facilities across the globe; franchise cricket has helped shape a team of travellers.

In Rashid Khan, they have a pioneer globe-

trotter, who has played for 16 teams in 9 countries. But it doesn't end with Rashid these days. The corresponding numbers for the other key members of the squad are equally impressive. Sample this: Mujeeb Ur

Rahman (16 teams, 8 countries), Mohammad Nabi (15 teams, 6 countries), Noor Ahmad (9 teams, 7 countries), Naveen-ul-Haq (14 teams, 9 countries), Rahmanullah Gurbaz (11 teams, 6 countries) and Najibullah Zardan (12 teams, 6 countries)

Afghanistan skipper Hashmatullah Shahidi underlines the benefits of having a well-travelled team. "League cricket benefits our cricket. Like the players who played leagues, you know, that international pressure becomes a little bit less with that because they are used to being with big players," he said.

Like the West Indies in the last decade, who thrived on playing in T20 leagues, the current lot of Afghanistan players are entering a similar territory. The wealth of experience that these leagues provide is being gobbled by the national team now. Be it playing in front of huge crowds in dif-

ferent landscapes or playing in varied conditions and rubbing shoulders with the best, they are benefitting from the experience. In every edition, the number of Afghan players featuring in the IPL, Big Bash League, Pakistan Super League and Caribbean Premier League has only been increasing.

Their game against England was a perfect illustration of what they could do in conditions that suit them. Naveen, sensing the two-

paced nature of the Kotla surface, bowled the cutter that castled Jos Buttler. Mujeeb, 22, was able to read the conditions better than anyone else, using his variations with precision to leave England flummoxed.

Raw talent

As several T20 leagues begin to sprout back home in Afghanistan, several IPL scouts have their ears and cameras aligned to Kabul these days. One of them was even open to travel to Kabul to scout a couple of teenagers, but decided against it because of tensions in the region.

There is an underlying theme to why there are so many lenses on Afghan prodigies, more than on those from Sri Lanka and Bangladesh – two teams which have plenty of spinners and batsmen suited to the conditions in which IPL teams play.

"They are raw and from the trials we see one common trait among all, which is how quickly they adapt to the conditions.

Especially on the bowling front, they are able to gauge which ball will work where and when. With exposure, they only keep learning," says a T20 scout.

Last IPL, Allah Mohmmad Ghazanfar. 15. was registered in the IPL auction as more than one franchise had their eyes on the off-spinner. "Since they don't have strong foundations, most of these players before being picked are part of various teams as net bowlers or cover. And once they spend a season or two and get exposure in some



With only limited overseas spots available and multi-dimensional players having an edge in selection, Mujeeb of late has been working extensively on his batting as well. Before the Asia Cup, batting at No.9, he scored 64 against Pakistan. And against England on Sunday, he made a vital 28 to propel Afghanistan to 284.

Though the seam-bowling ranks are still a work in progress, in sub-continental conditions they are a force to reckon with. It is the reason why Afghanistan's fixtures in Delhi, Chennai and Lucknow have generated plenty of interest. In the southern metropolis, where they are set to face New Zealand and Pakistan in back-to-back matches, Afghanistan know they can cause another upset or two, provided their batting unit complements their bowlers.

Training with lighter ball helped Mujeeb

GROWING UP in the scenic town of Khost,

Mujeeb Ur Rahman barely went anywhere without a cricket ball in his hands and it's not an exaggeration, his childhood coach Mohammad Khan Zadran stresses.

"Ball haath mai hi raha hai humesha (he's always kept the ball in his hands). Whether he was at the academy, at home or traveling from one place to another," he tells The Indian Express. It shouldn't come across as a surprise that when it came to Afghanistan stunning the world champions on Sunday, it was the cricket ball addict from the Khost province who led the dismantling of the English batting in Kotla.

Zadran, who also coached the other Afghanistan protagonist of the World Cup upset in Rahmanullah Gurbaz, takes us 12 years back when he first met Mujeeb.

A boy not older 10-11, who'd lost his father at a young age with no other source of income in the family, but with an immense passion for cricket. "Bowling se mohabbat thi

usey (He was in love with bowling)," the Khost province coach recalls before sharing a choice that he gave the young spin-bowling enthusiast an early lifeline in the sport. "I told him, 'Don't worry about the fees."

We don't take it from the boys who come from poor households," Zadran shares. The investment from the regional coach proved invaluable for Afghanistan, who registered only their second win in a third ODI World Cup outing. Following his three-wicket haul against the

defending champions, Mujeeb revealed of a conversation he'd have with his skipper before they came out to defend 284 in Delhi. "We knew that dew was going to come into play later on, which is why I was asking the captain to throw me the ball in the powerplay," Mujeeb would say at the end of the game. It was a strategy that worked well for the

Afghans as their off spinner removed England's top scorer at this World Cup, Joe Root. An angled delivery that held its line kept low before rattling the off stump. It may have been the biggest wicket he registered on the eve, but it certainly wasn't his most dexterous. Despite having lost six wickets, England were still in the chase with more batting to come and tough conditions to grip the ball on offer. Enter Mujeeb for a final spell to produce a couple of rippers inside the span of two overs to get rid of Woakes and Brook

While taking the initiative with the new ball is something Zadran recalls Mujeeb has had from his early days, the long-time coach elucidates on what's made his ward good with gripping the ball under tough conditions. "He used to shuffle between the hard ball and the light tennis one. Bowling with the latter, the force being generated from your finger to turn the ball is tested. If you're able to turn the light ball, it becomes easier to do so with the hard one. Also helps that his fingers are huge," Zadran has a crack.

On the speed of the carrom ball Mujeeb used, Zadran adds, "The gripping habits of the tennis ball also help with the speed. Getting those revolutions with the lighter one helps when you switch to the hard ball which skids more."

It's now a habit that Zadran inculcates to all of his young enthusiasts. "Be it the quicks or the spinners, we ask them to train with the lighter ball atleast twice a week."

CRICKET AND THE CITY

Kenya's upset win forgotten, Pune hopes India's march continues

BOTH THE minnows and the mighty of Pune's iconic 1996 Cricket World Cup moment at the Nehru Stadium are lost to the sands of time. Neither West Indies, who were shot out for 93, nor the giant-killers of yore Kenya, qualified for this World Cup. No such crazy caper is likely to unfold on Thursday when a stuttering Bangladesh meet a rampaging India.

Pune's otherwise breezy MCA stadium, the city's newer cricket venue, instead will stir up one bubbling cauldron with India fans clamouring for another pounding of opponents like in Ahmedabad. Bangladesh has beaten India thrice in the last four meetings but their triumphs have been at home or on neutral venues.

The majority of the crowd, which is under-25 that is used to driving down to the Gahunje stadium for IPL games, weren't born when Kenya upset West Indies and will need the blue shirts, flags, face-paint and the ceaseless India-cheering frenzy to sit through the 8 hours of a format.

The Maharashtra Cricket Association hasn't needed to advertise the game with hoardings inside the city. Its officials, constantly harangued for tickets, carried creased foreheads with mobiles stuck to the ear as demand cranked up even more in the days leading up to the match.

"The MCA stadium has hosted 68 matches including IPL already, but the World Cup tends to be a pressure game for organisers. More than pressure, we are excited, given hopes from the Indian team have increased," says Maharashtra Cricket Association secretary Shubhendra Bhandarkar. Hosting organisers saw a renewed surge of requests for tickets after India beat Pakistan.

With nearly no public transport in existence ferrying the flock towards the stadium, the MCA has taken hold of 42 acres of land surrounding the stadium for parking cars. Huge blimps will fly out into the sky, numbered to help locate parking zones. Stadium boxes have a fresh coat of paint and lights are all LED now. As the World Cup branding phase took off on Monday - cutouts and mammoth cloth scrolls rolling down the stadium facades - the stadium lost its local flavour. The inner city's most iconic 'Puneri paatya' - boards with sardonic and cutting humoured instructions that dot the heart of the city and make merchants seem standoff-

ish if not entirely rude - were sorely missing. Still, in one of the narrow approach lanes, the Cup seemed to have caught on with the city's reputation and a tilted ICC board proclaimed: 'NO TICKETS sold here.' (To be read as: don't linger around unnecessarily looking for counters just because you see a gate.)

As happens with steadfastly branded international sporting events, in this World Cup also one venue remains indistinguishable from the other. So, F&B stalls are more likely to hot-sell Cajun Veg Burgers rather than the garlic-coconut chutneyed local

vada-pav. Inside, the architecture of the stadium is flaunted as utilitarian. A single concourse runs the rim of the whole arena, making access relatively easy. The entire stands are not covered, and a 2 pm start means the notorious October heat of Pune will beat down on many of the

37,406 spectator seats in the early part. But uncovered stands and only a handful

of canopies also mean no beams blocking view, and an uninterrupted action of the cricket. "The beauty of this stadium is whichever chair you sit on, first row or last, you can clearly see the boundary ropes. At other places, you need to stand up but not here," Bhandarkar says.

The sand-based ground has provisions to drain out within 45 minutes of rains stopping, even heavy rains, Bhandarkar informs. The Maharashtra Premier League final did get postponed to next day, after a severe lashing of rains in July. But the heat looks like a bigger challenge with cloudless October skies.

ICC officials trooping into the stadium

from pictures, call the Gahunje ground, 'mini Dharamshala'. A quarter of the stadium has a stunning backdrop of a couple of mesmeric hillocks. Pune's favourite hiking haunts of 'tekdis' find a fine representation at the venue. Low-rise residences and ambitious towers can be seen on the horizon on the flanks but don't pervade the open view. The hillock-facing view is quite fetching in fact, and the wide, white staircases offer great sunset vistas.

A neat DB Deodhar statue stands at the entrance. Though Pune doesn't have many cricketers of international repute, there's high hopes from Ruturaj Gaikwad. After a hat-tip to the two Jadhavs, Dheeraj and Kedar along with Hrishikesh Kanitkar, the stadium leans on its Sachin-love.

The choice of frames, mostly pre-2000 unwittingly links the natty Gahunje facility to the older Nehru Stadium. Memorable moments like Sachin Tendulkar's Astra won at Sharjah 1998 and another with Tendulkar, Brian Lara and Ricky Ponting, the OG Thrilling Three of batting, are slung along walls inside the dens. Some are captioned, and others not given an explanation in Pune's figure-it-yourself style.

The Nehru Stadium used to be a concrete

and first-timers bombarded with images of block of cramped spaces. Street noises would how pretty the Dharamshala venue looks filter in and the pokey dressing rooms were wholly make-do. It's smartened up a tad, and holds junior summer camps and nets now. The exciting cricket, the underdog upsets and giant-slayings often stepped up, to make up for the drab facilities. The Gahunje fans though will be hungry for what constitutes Youtube Team India melanges - run-fests, a six-smashathon and daddy centuries from India's Top Six. When the Indian team turned up full-strength for optional practice, the first thing they did was clear out the lower tier of stands at long on and long off, warning that sixes might rain down in training.

Fans will also zoom in on magical deliveries of Jasprit Bumrah and Kuldeep Yadav, micro-obsessing on the speed and angles and movement of the ball, and their new-age celebrations. Even Gahunje's stunning backdrop view might not detract from the onedimensional India win focus of fans, though Bangladesh, labouring to stay on track in the tournament, are expected to put up a fight.

Pune, famous for its most renowned World Cup upset, might not have an appetite for one involving India, though coach Rahul Dravid might have unpleasant memories of Bangladesh from 2007. Rohit Sharma slamming his third straight World Cup century against Bangladesh after 2015 and 2019 or Virat Kohli adding his jumpy excitable cayenne capers to the field, are more or less the predictable picture lines Pune will come to watch.
