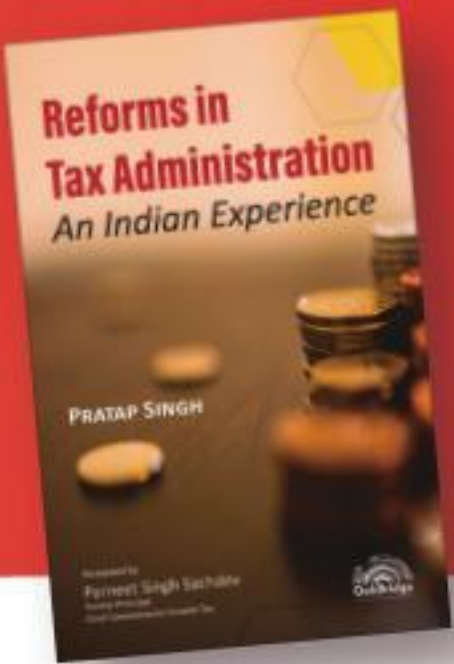

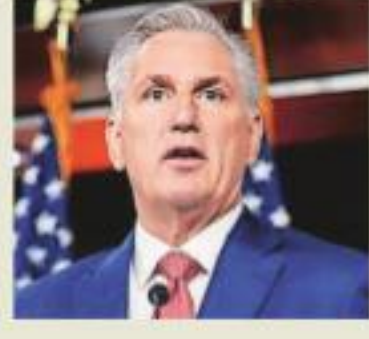

Would go back to job if asked to, says McCarthy

Washington: Less than a week after becoming the first US Speaker of House of Representatives voted out by his own caucus, Kevin McCarthy said Monday he would take the job back if asked to, as his colleagues contemplated their next move. McCarthy at a press conference stressed need for House leadership at a time of international crisis with Israel at war with Hamas militant group. But rather than putting himself forward for the top job, he said the decision should be taken by his fellow Republicans. **REUTERS**

SC issues notice to ex-Army chief, ex-ISI head

Islamabad: A top Pakistani court on Monday issued notices to former army chief Gen Qamar Javed Bajwa and ex-ISI chief Lt Gen Faiz Hameed for violating the laws for retired servicemen by allegedly distorting facts during interviews. The notices were issued after the Islamabad High Court received a petition seeking action against the two senior former officers. IHC Chief Justice Aamer Farooq issued notices to two journalists and Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority. **PTI**

'Killings' in Afghanistan: hearings begin

London: An inquiry investigating allegations that British special forces carried out extra-judicial killings in Afghanistan a decade ago will begin hearing evidence in public Monday. The independent inquiry was ordered by Britain's defence ministry last December after a BBC TV documentary reported that soldiers from the elite Special Air Service had killed 54 people in suspicious circumstances. It also came after two families, who accuse SAS of killing their relatives in 2011 and 2012, began legal action to demand judicial reviews of their cases. **REUTERS**

MALAYSIA
43 rescued from human traffickers

Kuala Lumpur: Malaysia said Monday that 43 citizens have been rescued by police in Peru after they fell victim to a human trafficking syndicate operating a telecommunication fraud. They Malaysians were involved in the so-called "Macau scam" that originates from crime syndicates in Taiwan and China. The Foreign Ministry said in a statement that Peruvian police found the 43 Malaysians after raiding a house in La Molina in the capital Lima on October 7. It said the Malaysian Embassy in Lima had visited them and found them in good condition. **AP**

Nowhere to go: Gaza braces for Israeli assault

Families stockpile food fearing that supplies will end, despite Hamas's assurances

AS ISRAEL'S military sent phone messages telling Palestinians to leave some areas of Gaza after Saturday's deadly Hamas raid, Mohammad Brais did not know where to seek safety from an assault that residents expect to be the worst they have ever faced. "Where should we go? Where should we go?" the 55-year-old father asked. He had fled his home near a possible front line to shelter at his shop - only for that to get hit in one of the hundreds of air and artillery strikes already pounding Gaza. Palestinians are preparing for an offensive of unprecedented scale on the tiny, crowded enclave, exceeding previous bouts of destructive warfare that they fear will leave survivors destitute, without homes, water, electricity, hospitals or food.

Gaza has no protected shelters designated for times of war. At the Jabalia refugee camp in northern Gaza, men clambered on a pancaked building to pull an infant's tiny body from the rubble, carrying it down through the crowd below amid remains of bombed buildings. As ambulances arrived at a hospital, workers ran out to haul in stretchers bearing the injured. Inside, a man lay next to the shrouded body of his nephew, hysterical with grief, alternately striking the floor and embracing the corpse as he screamed. Funeral processions wound down Gaza streets. In Rafah, in the south, men strode behind a body being carried on a bier, Palestinian and Hamas flags raised behind.

At the cemetery a family buried Saad Lubbad, a small boy killed in air strikes. His body, wrapped in white, was passed down to be laid on a patterned cloth before burial. The densely populated enclave's 2.3 million residents, many of them refugees descended from people who fled or were expelled from their homes during fighting when Israel was founded in 1948, have endured repeated bouts of war and air strikes before. They expect this one to be worse. Families began stockpiling food as soon as Saturday's attack began but fear that despite Hamas assurances supplies will run low. Many those who fled their homes are sheltering in UN schools. At one in Gaza City 13-year-old Israa al-Qishawi pointed to the corner of a classroom where she lays her mattress each night alongside 30 other people. Qatar in talks with Hamas to secure swap of Israeli, Palestinian hostages

QATARI MEDIATORS have held urgent calls to try to negotiate freedom for Israeli women and children seized by the militant group and held in Gaza in exchange for the release of 36 Palestinian women and children from Israel's prisons, a source briefed on the talks told Reuters.

Qatar's foreign ministry confirmed to Reuters its involvement in mediation talks with Hamas and Israeli officials, including over a possible prisoner swap. The ongoing negotiations, which Qatar has been conducting in coordination with the

United States since Saturday night, are "moving positively" said the source, who has been briefed on them. "We are in constant contact

with all sides at the moment. Our priorities are to end the bloodshed, release the prisoners and make sure the conflict is contained with no regional spillover," foreign ministry spokesperson Majed Al-Ansari told Reuters, without elaborating.

When asked to respond to the Reuters report, an Israeli official told Reuters only: "There are no negotiations under way."

But there are no signs of breakthroughs as both sides dig in. Qatar has been in touch with Hamas officials in Doha and Gaza, the source said, after the Islamist group assaulted Israel from Gaza on Saturday, storming into towns, killing more than 700 Israelis, and escaping with dozens of hostages. **REUTERS**

EU suspends hundreds of millions in aid for Palestinian authorities

THE EUROPEAN Union announced Monday that it was "immediately" suspending hundreds of millions of euros in aid for Palestinian authorities because of what an EU commissioner called the "scale of terror and brutality" during attacks on Israel by Hamas. Germany and Austria also announced similar measures. "We need action and we need it now," EU Commissioner Oliver Varheli tweeted. It also underscored strong words of EU support for Israel since the Hamas attacks started on Saturday, including that Israel had now every right to defend itself within the bounds of international law.

The surprise announcement by Varheli on development aid came just hours after EU officials stressed that no EU money whatsoever was going to Hamas in the first place and that contacts had

been frozen for 16 years. The EU considers Hamas a terror group.

After hours of uncertainty over how deep the measures would reach and whether they would possibly also affect aid to those in immediate need, EU Humanitarian Aid Commissioner Janez Lenarcic said that the most urgently needed aid to Palestinians "will continue as long as needed."

"While I most strongly condemn the terrorist attack," Lenarcic said, "it is imperative to protect civilians."

Beyond that, Varheli said that "as the biggest donor of the Palestinians, the European Commission is putting its full development portfolio under review," which he said amounted to 691 million euros (\$730 million).

Varheli said that the measures include that "all payments (be) immediately suspended. All projects put under review. All new budget proposals ... postponed until further notice." **AP**

Israel says it killed armed infiltrators from Lebanon, Hezbollah denies role

ISRAEL SAID on Monday its troops backed by helicopters had killed a number of armed infiltrators entering the country from Lebanon, raising fears fighting could spread two days after Hamas gunmen burst in from Gaza on a deadly rampage.

The prospect that fighting could spread to other areas has alarmed the region. Israeli troops "killed a number of armed suspects that infiltrated into Israeli territory from Lebanese territory," the military said, adding helicopters "are currently striking in the area".

An official with Hezbollah denied that the group had mounted any operation into Israel.

Hezbollah, a Shi'ite militant group powerful in southern

Lebanon, is backed by Iran like Hamas.

Artillery shelling and gunfire were heard at Lebanon's southern border with Israel, a correspondent for Hezbollah's Al-Manar TV said in a post on social media. 'Trauma I could never imagine': Survivors recall horror at music festival where Hamas killed 260

THE NIGHT was a getaway. Thousands of young men and women gathered at a vast field in southern Israel near the Gaza border to dance without a care. Old and new friends jumped up and down, reveling the swirl of the bass-heavy beats. Maya Alper was standing to-

ward the back of the bar with teams of environmentally conscious volunteers, picking up trash and passing out free vodka shots to party-goers who reused their cups. Just after 6 a.m., as a light-blue dawn broke and the headliner DJ took the stage, air raid sirens cut through the trap music. Rockets streaked overhead.

The open-air Tribe of Nova music festival will go down in Israeli history as the country's

worst civilian massacre. Dozens of Hamas militants who had blown through Israel's heavily fortified separation fence and crossed into the country from Gaza opened fire on young Israelis who had come for a joyous night of electronic music. Some attendees were drunk or high, magnifying confusion and terror.

THE UN Security Council held an emergency meeting behind closed doors Sunday, with the United States demanding all 15 members strongly condemn "these heinous terrorist attacks committed by Hamas," but they took no immediate action.

US deputy ambassador Robert Wood after said that "a number of countries" did condemn the attack but not all council members. UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres led the clarion call Monday. He said that over 137,000 people in Gaza - or about 6% of its population - were now sheltering in sites run by UNRWA, the aid agency for Palestinians.

"I am deeply distressed by today's announcement that Israel will initiate a complete siege of the Gaza Strip, nothing allowed in - no electricity, food, or fuel," he said.

Afghanistan quakes: Rescue workers search for survivors, bodies as Taliban put toll at 2,400

AFGHAN RESCUE workers scrambled to pull survivors and bodies from beneath the rubble on Monday, two days after the deadliest earthquakes in years hit the northwestern city of Herat and surrounding villages.

The Taliban administration said at least 2,400 people had been killed and many more injured in the quakes, which were among the world's deadliest this year after tremors in Turkey and Syria, in which an estimated 50,000 people were killed.

Periodic aftershocks continued to shake the affected areas on Monday, officials said, forcing scared people out of homes.

With nuclear-armed submarines, China near 'breakthroughs': Report

ASUBMARINE arms race is intensifying as China embarks on production of a new generation of nuclear-armed submarines that for the first time are expected to pose a challenge to growing US and allied efforts to track them.

Analysts and regional defence attaches say evidence is mounting that China is on track to have its Type 096 ballistic missile submarine operational before the end of the decade, with breakthroughs in its quietness aided in part by Russian technology.

Research discussed at a conference in May at the US Naval War College and published in August by the college's China Maritime Studies Institute pre-

dicts the new vessels will be harder to keep tabs on. That conclusion is credible, according to seven analysts and three Asia-based military attaches. "The Type 096s are going to be a nightmare," said retired submariner and naval technical intelligence analyst Christopher Carlson, one of the researchers. "They are going to be very, very

hard to detect."

The discreet effort to track China's nuclear-powered and -armed ballistic missile submarines, known as SSBNs, is one of the core drivers of increased deployments and contingency planning by US Navy and other militaries across Indo-Pacific region. That drive is expected to intensify when Type 096s enter service.

But Type 094s, which carry China's most advanced submarine-launched JL-3 missile, are considered noisy - a major handicap for military submarines. The paper notes that the Type 096 submarine will compare to state-of-the-art Russian submarines in terms of stealth, sensors and weapons. It said that jump in capabilities would have "profound" implications for US and Indo-Pacific allies. **REUTERS**

ISRAEL'S MILITARY ordered a complete siege on the Gaza Strip on Monday, halting deliveries of food, water, fuel and supplies to its 2.3 million people as it pounded the Hamas-ruled territory with waves of airstrikes in retaliation for the militants' bloody weekend incursion.

In response to Israel's bombardment, the spokesman of Hamas' armed wing, Abu Obeida, said in an audio released Monday night that the group will kill one Israeli civilian captive any time Israel targets civilians in their homes in Gaza "without prior warning".

Israeli Foreign Minister Eli Cohen warned Hamas against harming any of the hostages, saying, "This war crime will not be forgiven."

Cohen said that more than 100 people have been taken captive by Hamas. Hamas and other militants in Gaza say they are holding more than 130 soldiers and civilians snatched from inside Israel.

More than two days after Hamas launched its surprise attack, the Israeli military said it had largely gained control in its southern towns where it had been battling Hamas gunmen. Israeli tanks and drones were deployed to guard breaches in the Gaza border fence to prevent new incursions. Thousands of

CWC resolution skips reference to Hamas or terror, triggers unease in Cong

EVEN AS the Ministry of External Affairs is yet to formulate an official response on the unprecedented Israel-Hamas standoff, the Congress Monday tied itself up in knots after the resolution of the party's Working Committee reaffirmed its support to the Palestinian cause without mentioning the horrific attack carried out by Hamas on Israel.

This despite a section of the CWC asking for "condemnation" of the terror attack and party chief Mallikarjun Kharge suggesting that the meeting's focus should be on the caste census and a statement on the Middle East, if need be, could be issued later.

However, the CWC went ahead.

"The CWC expresses its dismay and anguish on the war that has broken out in the Middle East where over a thousand people have been killed in the last two days. The CWC reiterates its longstanding support for the rights of the Palestinian people to land, self-government and to live with dignity and respect. The CWC calls for an immediate cease-fire and for negotiations to begin on all outstanding issues including the imperative issues that have given rise to the present conflict," the CWC resolution said.

The statement, which formed the last paragraph of the resolution, has triggered unease

MORE THAN 16 crore voters in Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Telangana and Mizoram will elect new governments between November 7 and November 30, in what is being dubbed as the semi-final ahead of the Lok Sabha elections next year.

Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar announced on Monday that all states, except Chhattisgarh, which will vote in two phases on November 7 and November 17, will conclude their voting in a single day (see chart). The results will be declared on December 3.

All five states have seen an improvement in their electoral gender ratio, according to the Election Commission's data, with Chhattisgarh not only closing the gender gap but having more women voters than men for the first time.

While Chhattisgarh has 1,012 women voters for every 1,000 men, there are 1,063 women electors in Mizoram for every

1,000 men. In the previous elections held in 2018, Chhattisgarh had 995 women voters against 1,000 men, and Mizoram had 1,051 women. Mizoram has always had more women voters than men.

While the other states have also shown an improvement over 2018 in their electoral gender ratio, parity is yet to be achieved. Madhya Pradesh, which has the largest Assembly

Cauvery row: TN asks Centre to intervene, passes resolution

IN A significant move, the Tamil Nadu Assembly on Monday adopted a resolution urging the Union government to direct the Karnataka government to release water to Tamil Nadu in line with the Supreme Court's final judgment. The resolution, moved by Chief Minister M K Stalin, got support from all parties except the BJP, whose MLAs staged a walkout demanding its modification.

"In light of the Cauvery Delta farmers, who are the backbone of Tamil Nadu's agriculture, being recognised and protected, the Karnataka government is urged to release water to Tamil Nadu. This Assembly unanimously urges the Union government," the resolution said. Presenting the resolution, Stalin said: "Cauvery water is not

CJI bench pauses transfer of Armed Forces Tribunal Judge after Bar strike

THE SUPREME Court on Monday effectively stayed the transfer of a judge from the Armed Forces Tribunal's (AFT) Chandigarh bench to Kolkata and directed the tribunal's chairperson to submit in a sealed cover a report

detailing why the transfer was effected.

Following the transfer of Justice (ret'd) Dharam Chand Chaudhary, the AFT Chandigarh Bar Association had on September 26 launched an indefinite strike.

It also wrote twice to Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud, terming the transfer as "a direct assault on the independence of judicial functioning" of the AFT. It

alleged that Justice Chaudhary was transferred because "he refused to buckle under the pressure of the Ministry of Defence".

On Monday, a bench headed by CJI Chandrachud said that "pending further orders Justice Chaudhary shall not be required to assume charge at the regional bench at Kolkata". It also directed that "the execution petitions which have been heard by the

Paan shop to Dubai villa: Kingpins, pawns of gaming app

THE OWNER of a juice corner, a contractor-businessman, a school dropout who worked as a clothes salesman and a BCA graduate — what brought this disparate group of people together was a shared interest in the vagaries of cricket, besides a penchant for hanging out at a paan stall in Bhilai's Akash Ganga market.

The four are among the key players of the Mahadev online gaming app, which is now at the centre of a Rs 5,000-crore case of alleged money laundering that the Enforcement Directorate is investigating.

According to the investigation agency, the Mahadev Online Book App, headquartered in the UAE, provided a platform for illegal betting in a range of activities — from election results to poker and cricket. The ED has claimed

that money was transferred from the owners of the app to hawala operators in Chhattisgarh, with the trail allegedly leading up to bureaucrats and politicians.

The two alleged kingpins that the agency has narrowed in on are Sourabh Chandrakar, 28, and Ravi Uppal, 43, both Bhilai residents believed to be on the run in Dubai.

Police said it was around 2017-2018 that Uppal and

THE COUNTRY'S elite counter terror force has declared a 'war' — on an invasive plant species.

In 1986, when the National Security Guard (NSG) was granted 1,600 acres abutting the Delhi-Ajmer highway in Manesar to build its campus, there were 98 functional borewells. At present, 63 of these have gone dry. The force has now decided to take on the vilayati kikar (*Prosopis juliflora*) populating its Aravali hills campus, after it was found to be responsible,

among other reasons, for the depleting water table.

Native to Mexico, vilayati kikar was brought to Delhi by the British in the 1920s, when the national capital was being built.

The NSG has earmarked an area of 1,000 acres, spread over a 5-km stretch on campus, for the project that aims to regreen the Aravallis with local varieties of plants. More importantly, the force has begun cutting down kikar trees before planting the new saplings since the invasive species does not allow other plants to grow around it. Sources said past attempts at regreening the campus had failed

for precisely this reason. Other reasons cited for this failed attempt include poor availability of water, inadequate retention of water due to the nature of the terrain and the nilgai, the largest Asian antelope, eating away saplings of local tree varieties.

In the past couple of years, the NSG has planted nearly 10 lakh saplings of local varieties on the hills using the trench pattern of plantation to ensure judicious use of water. This pattern of plantation involves plots that are ploughed to create trench-like rows for sowing of saplings. These trenches help channel rainwater through the planta-

tion, keeping it irrigated.

A site visit by *The Indian Express* revealed that a significantly large number of these saplings had survived. NSG commandos were seen pruning and cutting down existing kikar trees before fresh plantation.

For the section of the campus that lies on the foothills of the Aravallis, the force has hired experts in Miyawaki plantation. The Japanese method relies on overcrowding the plantation area with saplings of different varieties to create competition that propels faster growth.

"The Union Home Minister has set ambitious annual plan-

tation targets for all Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs). We felt that these targets could be incorporated into a larger rewilding plan for the Manesar campus of the NSG. So a five-year plan, commencing from 2021-22, was designed to prune vilayati kikar on around 700 acres of the Aravallis (campus) and to plant local species (instead). The NSG also intends to develop forest patches in and around 300 acres of the area in the non-Aravallis stretch of the Manesar campus," NSG Director General MA Ganapathy said, adding that his aim was to make the campus "carbon neutral".

Since the Aravali hills are naturally arid with poor availability of water, barring the rainy season, the force is also dredging the range's troughs that have been selected geospatially to trap rainwater and create water bodies that will not only recharge the water table but also make water available around the year. One such water body has already been created by trapping water discharged from water treatment plants on campus.

"Our water table has been going down constantly. Apart from massive urban development around the campus over

Israel orders Gaza siege, Hamas threatens to kill hostages

Israelis were evacuated from more than a dozen towns near Gaza, and the military summoned 300,000 reservists - a massive mobilization in a short time. The moves, along with Israel's formal declaration of war on Sunday, pointed to Israel increasingly shifting to the offensive against Hamas, threatening greater destruction in the densely populated, impoverished Gaza Strip. Already, civilians on both sides have suffered a terrible toll: around 700 people, including 73 soldiers, have been killed in Israel, and 493 people have been killed in Gaza, according to authorities on each side.

when a volley of rockets fired from Gaza hit two neighborhoods - a sign of Hamas's reach. Israeli media said seven were wounded. On Monday evening, Israeli warplanes carried out an intense bombardment of Rimal, a residential and commercial district of central Gaza City, after issuing warnings for residents to evacuate. Amid explosions, the building housing the headquarters of the Palestinian Telecommunications Company was destroyed. Israeli Rear Adm. Daniel Hagari told reporters that Israeli bombing was moving from district to district to destroy buildings Israel says are being used by Hamas. Israel is planning to hit thousands of targets, he said. He said "hundreds" of Hamas militants were buried under rubble of buildings destroyed by Israel in the past 48 hours. His claims of the numbers - and his characterization of the dead as Hamas - could not be confirmed.

among the five states, has 945 women voters for every 1,000 men as opposed to 917 women in 2018. Rajasthan has 920 women voters against 914 in the previous elections. Telangana has 998 women voters against 982 last time. Kumar said that the "inclusive election" campaign was the primary aim of the poll panel, with the focus on improving the electoral roll gender ratio in all states. Consequently, 23.6 lakh new women electors have been added in these five states. Besides, the poll panel also focused on first-time voters in the 18-19 age group, enrolling 60 lakh such voters. This was largely because first-time voters had three additional windows to register themselves. In the past, they could only enroll once a year - in January. Through a recent amendment in the rules, three new such dates were added. These five state elections are crucial for the BJP and Congress, as both parties are desperately seeking wins to build momentum ahead of the general elections. The five states together send 83 members to the Lok Sabha. Given that regional parties hold little sway in Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh, the elections will be a direct fight between the Congress and the BJP. Of the five states, the Congress is in power in Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh, BJP in Madhya Pradesh, Bharat Rashtra Samithi in Telangana and Mizo National Front in Mizoram. The BJP is relying on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's popularity, the Centre's welfare schemes, and the party's organi-

Constitution benches of this court," the bench said. It directed that the AFT chairperson should inform the Supreme Court registrar by October 13 why the transfer was effected. In its petition, the AFT Chandigarh Bar Association had alleged interference by the Ministry of Defence in the transfer of Justice Chaudhary because he had initiated contempt proceedings against a senior officer of the Defence Accounts Department for non-compliance of orders related to disability pension. Arguing the matter for the Bar, senior advocate K Parmeshwar said that one prayer before the court was against the transfer order and the second was about the functioning of the tribunal. "This is a case where the facts speak for itself," he said. Parmeshwar contended that the AFT was being controlled by the Ministry of Defence. Referring to certain "covert decisions", he claimed the tribunal said "please implement our orders" five times. "Six hundred applicants are stuck before the court because the ministry doesn't implement orders," he contended. In its letter to the CJ on September 26, the Bar alleged that after measures were taken to get the orders of the AFT executed, which had been lying unimplemented for many years, "the AFT chairperson first transferred the contempt proceedings from the Chandigarh bench to himself and then transferred the judicial member who was en-

suring the compliance and adherence to the rule of law". The chairperson also transferred the execution proceedings pending in other benches of the principal bench to his own bench, it claimed. In a separate letter to the CJ on October 4, the Bar claimed that the Defence Minister had recently made certain comments at a public function of the Defence Accounts Department, giving rise to suspicion of direct interference by the ministry in the matter. The Bar said in the letter that the transfer was neither acceptable to the lawyers nor litigants and had shaken the faith of the vast population of ex-servicemen, disabled ex-servicemen and widows, who constitute the majority of litigants before the tribunal.

Cauvery water row

ensure that the people of Tamil Nadu receive their rightful share of Cauvery water, regardless of the circumstances. The Chief Minister detailed the consistent efforts of the Tamil Nadu government to ensure the state receives its rightful share of water. He highlighted the achievements in the Cauvery Delta region, where channels were systematically desilted, leading to significant paddy production. However, he complained about the artificial blockade created by the Karnataka government, which has not released the rightful water for the month. Speaking about the numerous meetings and measures taken by Tamil Nadu Water Resources Minister Duraimurugan, Stalin urged Karnataka to release the water. Leader of the Opposition, Edappadi K Palaniswami of the AIADMK, welcomed the resolution but questioned the DMK government on the measures being taken to ensure drinking water supply to 20 districts until water is received in the Cauvery. The Cauvery water-sharing conflict gains political significance since the DMK and Congress are ruling Tamil Nadu and Karnataka, respectively - two allies in the national opposition's INDIA bloc that is fighting the BJP. The Cauvery dispute between Tamil Nadu and Karnataka has its roots in two agreements from 1892 and 1924 between the Madras Presidency and the Mysore princely state. After Independence, as Karnataka expanded its irrigation network in the Cauvery basin, the dispute intensified. Karnataka has long held that the 1924 pact was "heavily in favour" of the Madras presidency.

CWC resolution skips reference to Hamas or terror

in the party. A CWC member told The Indian Express: "It is an absurd formulation. It is as if we are condoning the terrorist attack by Hamas. As if we are endorsing terrorism. There will be a backlash." Incidentally, on Saturday, PM Narendra Modi did not name Hamas but in an unambiguous message, departing from Delhi's traditional balancing act, posted on X: "Deeply shocked by the news of terrorist attacks in Israel. Our thoughts and prayers are with the innocent victims and their families. We stand in solidarity with Israel at this difficult hour." Sources said the draft resolution of the CWC had no mention of the Middle East crisis. The CWC was convened primarily to endorse Rahul Gandhi's demand for a caste census and removal of the 50% cap on quota for SC, ST and OBCs. Towards the end of the meeting, sources said, senior leader from Kerala Ramesh Chennithala demanded that the resolution should, while condemning the Hamas attack, express solidarity with the people of Palestine given the party's longstanding commitment to the Palestinian cause. Sources said a couple of lines were promptly drafted but it had no mention of Hamas or the word "terrorism." In fact, the official reaction of the Congress issued by Jairam Ramesh Sunday also made no mention of Hamas or terror while calling the attack "brutal".

NSG weeds out 'vilayati kikar'

the past few years, among the reasons (for this depletion of the water table) was also the ubiquitous vilayati kikar. Paan shop to Dubai villa: Kingpins, pawns of gaming app

Chandrakar started the app. Though they came from vastly different backgrounds - Uppal from a business family, while Chandrakar was the son of a former employee of the Bhilai Municipal Corporation - their paths crossed at the paan stall in Akash Ganga market, where they bonded over cricket scores. Earlier this year, the Chhattisgarh Police issued a lookout notice against the duo while the ED initiated the process of issuing a red-corner notice. It was Chandrakar's February wedding in the UAE's Ras Al-Khaimah city, for which he is said to have splurged over Rs 200 crore, that set off alarm bells. The ED is now issuing notices and summons to around 16 celebrities who were allegedly paid in cash for performing at Chandrakar's wedding. Those who have been called for questioning include actors Ranbir Kapoor, Shraddha Kapoor, Huma Qureshi, Hina Khan and comedian Kapil Sharma. The kingpins in Bhilai Police sources said Chandrakar worked as a salesman at a garment store in Bhilai, earning Rs 10,000 a month, before he started a juice corner, called Juice Factory. Chandrakar's alleged business partner and co-founder of the app, Uppal, came from an upper-middle-class family. Police sources said that while Uppal took up contracts for installing borewells and had an oil-related business before he moved to Dubai, he has been involved in betting for over a decade. His network of cricket bookies, they said, are spread across states - from Katni in MP to Bilaspur, Raipur, Bhatapara and Dhamtari in Chhattisgarh. It was at Akash Ganga market that Uppal would catch up with friends, mostly local punters. When he was introduced to Chandrakar there, Uppal realised the latter's strong local connections would come in handy to recruit for the app. Around 2017-2018, the duo first got in touch with makers of a similar Hyderabad-based app before taking the help of software engineers to set up their own. Much before the Covid lockdown, they began making the rounds of Dubai, where they eventually set up operations. The Uppals' bungalow in Bhilai now stands locked, with police saying the family recently left the city. The place where Chandrakar ran a juice centre has been taken over by another person. Salesman strikes big While Chandrakar and Uppal ran their operations from Dubai, the face of the app in Bhilai was Raja Gupta alias Raj, a 29-year-old whose fortunes are said to have changed overnight since he started working for them. He, too, is believed to be in Dubai. A school dropout, until 2016,

Raj worked as a salesman in a garment shop in Akash Ganga market, earning Rs 1,600 a month, before he took to betting - and later accepting bets - on cricket. Said his friend: "We both used to lose money on bets but we were addicted. One day he said that if we accept bets, we will make more money. Then, Raj was introduced to Sourabh (Chandrakar) who told him that he would make him rich." Not much later, says the friend, Raj's lifestyle underwent a drastic makeover. He bought an i20 car and an iPhone, wore gold ornaments, and had a flamboyant presence on social media - leading many in Supela to believe he was the app's owner. When The Indian Express visited Raj's bungalow in Bhilai, his father refused to talk. His sister said Raj has not come home in two years. Investigators say Raj's job was to allegedly recruit youngsters from Chhattisgarh and take them to Dubai for selling customer login IDs for several lakhs to operators. While the app owners kept the lion's share of profits, punters such as Raj got around 20 per cent. Bhilai to Dubai Police say a key part of the betting operation involved youngsters tasked with handling the back-end operations. Many of these 150-odd youngsters - from UP, Bihar, MP, Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand - were taken to Dubai for "training". While some stayed on, the others were sent back to India to handle operations here. Among those who went to Dubai is a 29-year-old from Bhilai who spoke to The Indian Express on the condition of anonymity. A small-time bookie, he says that after he lost a "few lakhs" on the bets he placed through Raj, the latter offered him a "job" in Dubai. "I desperately wanted money to repay my debts so I went to Dubai in December 2021. There were around 70 of us from Chhattisgarh. I was paid Rs 40,000 a month," he says. In May 2022, he returned to Bhilai. "A few months later, the police arrested me... The court released me, but my life is a mess," says the 29-year-old, who now sells papdi bhel for a living.

Starting Oct 11, HC to begin live streaming proceedings

THE DELHI High Court will begin live streaming of court proceedings from Wednesday (October 11).

For now, Court 1 which is presided over by Chief Justice Satish Chandra Sharma will be live-streamed 10.30 am onwards in an identified manner. The live streaming will be conducted on a case-to-case basis as per the HC's directions.

"The live streaming link is available on the home page of the official website of Delhi High Court, <https://delhihighcourt.nic.in>, under the title - LIVE STREAMING," the HC said.

The court has also said the contents of live streaming are for information purposes only and the live streaming/archival data shall not "constitute the official record of the court proceedings".

The court has further said that no person/entity including print, electronic media and social media platforms other than the authorised entity shall record, share and or disseminate live-streamed proceedings or the archival data.

In January, the HC had notified the "Live Streaming and Recording of Court Proceedings Rules of the High Court of Delhi, 2022", in order to imbue greater transparency, inclusivity, and foster access to justice. The rules were notified and came into force after it was published in the official gazette on January 13.

The definition of live streaming/live streamed is inclusive i.e., it includes a "live television link, webcast, audio-video transmissions via electronic means" or other arrangements through which any person can view the proceedings as permitted under these rules.

NO RAIN SO FAR THIS MONTH
Max temp above normal on all days, October this yr is warmer than usual

WITH CLEAR skies, no rain and high humidity levels, Delhi has been warmer than usual so far this October.

The maximum temperature has remained above normal on all days of the month so far, albeit marginally on two days. On Monday, the temperature was recorded at 36.7 degrees Celsius, which is three degrees above the normal for this time of the year, at the Safdarjung weather station. The highest maximum temperature recorded in the city on Monday was 38.4 degrees Celsius at Pitampura.

On Sunday, the maximum temperature at Safdarjung was 36.5 degrees, two notches above the normal, while it was 35.5 degrees on Saturday, when the normal from October 3 to 12 is 34.2 degrees, based on India Meteorological Department (IMD) data from 1991 to 2020. Similarly, the minimum temperature of 24.4 degrees early on Monday was three degrees above the normal, while the minimum on Sunday was 23.1 degrees, two notches above the normal.

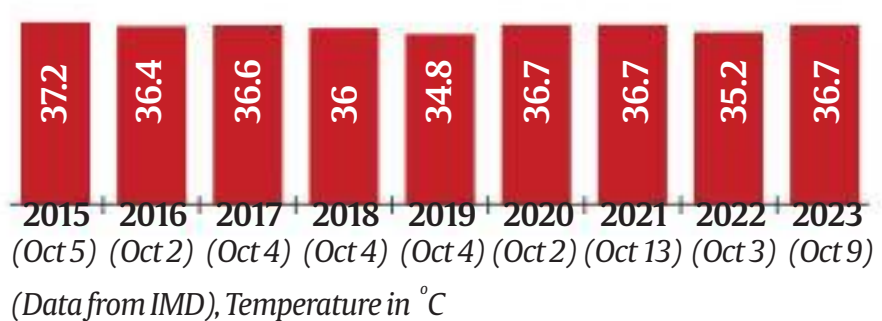
According to an IMD bulletin Monday evening, the maximum humidity level over the past 24 hours was 92%, as against 90% recorded Sunday.

Close on the heels of a deficit in rainfall in August and September, Delhi has seen no rain so far this month. In its forecast for the month of October, the IMD had said that most parts of the country could receive below normal rainfall, and see normal to above normal maximum temperatures.

At an IMD briefing on September 30, IMD Director General Mrutyunjay Mohapatra had said that in El Nino years, cold day and cold wave conditions,

which are seen later in the winter, could be less intense. El Nino conditions refer to a warming of equatorial Pacific Ocean waters.

Monsoon withdrew from Delhi on September 30, a little after the normal withdrawal date of September 25. On Monday, IMD said that monsoon has withdrawn from the remaining parts of northwest India.

IMD scientist Kuldeep Srivastava said, "Clear skies and westerly winds have been contributing to above normal temperatures. A western disturbance is also approaching, which means that the westerly component in the winds is more dominant. These winds are coming from land areas where temperatures are high."

Srivastava said that western disturbances have not affected Delhi so far this month, with one such system having affected only

Jammu and Kashmir. "With the approaching western disturbance, we may have a drizzle at one or two places in Delhi-NCR on Tuesday," he added.

He explained that temperatures are expected to fall only once the western disturbance passes through; there is significant snowfall over the Himalayan region, and the wind direction changes with winds hitting Delhi from the Jammu and Kashmir, and Himachal region. "Climatology wise, the temperature in Delhi falls by around 3 degrees in the last week of October, compared to the first week," he added.

The IMD forecast indicates that there is likely to be no significant fall in temperatures over the next six days. The maximum temperature is likely to be around 35 or 36 degrees, while the minimum temperature could range from 21 to 24 degrees.

Grounds of arrest not supplied till today, NewsClick founder tells HC

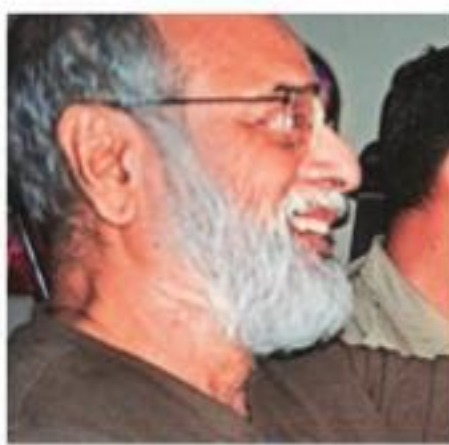

NEWSCLICK FOUNDER and editor-in-chief Prabir Purkayastha told the Delhi High Court Monday that "even till today", the grounds of arrest have not been supplied to him.

The High Court was hearing pleas moved by Purkayastha and NewsClick's HR head Amit Chakraborty challenging their arrest and remand in a case under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA).

A single-judge bench of Justice Tushar Rao Gedela, after hearing the parties for over two hours, reserved orders in the matter. Regarding the challenge to the UAPA FIR, the high court said that when orders are pronounced, it will issue a notice if required.

Appearing for Purkayastha, Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal argued that the affidavit filed by the Delhi Police in response to his client's prayers for interim relief contained only the arrest memo. He said that the arrest memo only contained reasons which are "different" from the grounds of arrest, adding that the reasons were also general and there were no specific

grounds as to the facts and allegations of the case.

Chakraborty's counsel argued that his client is suffering from "59% disability" and he is not a journalist or an editor but only performed certain administrative tasks. He said "throughout the arrest and remand process, I have been clubbed together" with Purkayastha. He further said that there has been no separate application of mind as to his client's role and the remand application makes no mention of his client's physical disability.

On the other hand, appearing for the Delhi Police, Solicitor General of India Tushar Mehta argued that the allegations state that a huge sum comes from a person in China with the pur-

pose of ensuring that the integrity of the country is compromised. He said that he is conscious of the distinction between informing and supplying grounds of arrest as sought by petitioners. "He was informed about the grounds of arrest and this fact is not disputed. He was not supplied and this is also an admitted fact," Mehta said, adding that as per Section 43B, UAPA does not require supplying but informing of grounds of arrest.

With respect to the Supreme Court's order last week in the M3M directors Pankaj Bansal and Basant Bansal's case, Mehta said that although it was pronounced on October 3, it was uploaded on the Supreme Court website on October 4. He added that the investigating agency in that matter was the Enforcement Directorate and the Delhi Police was not a party and so were unaware of the Bansal judgment.

The Supreme Court last Tuesday passed the order in a plea by Pankaj Bansal and Basant Bansal, directors of M3M real estate group, who had challenged an order of the Punjab and Haryana High Court which declined to set aside their arrest by the Enforcement Directorate un-

der the PMLA. He also said that in the Bansal judgment, the ED had requested the apex court to make the order prospective and thus the apex court order said that "henceforth a copy of grounds of arrest is furnished to the arrested person as a matter of course...". He also informed the high court that a review plea is being filed against the Bansal judgment in the Supreme Court.

Sibal countered that Bansal's judgment "henceforth" would not amount to having a prospective effect as it is a declaration of law where the whole point was that the grounds were not provided in writing. Sibal said that the Bansal judgment was pronounced in open court, and the law applies from October 3 for the whole country. He further said that the review being filed does not change the law and concluded by saying that the provisions of arrest were "pari materia (on same subject/matter)" in the UAPA and PMLA.

On October 4, Purkayastha and Chakraborty were remanded to seven-day police custody. Both were arrested following allegations that the news portal was given money to spread pro-China propaganda.

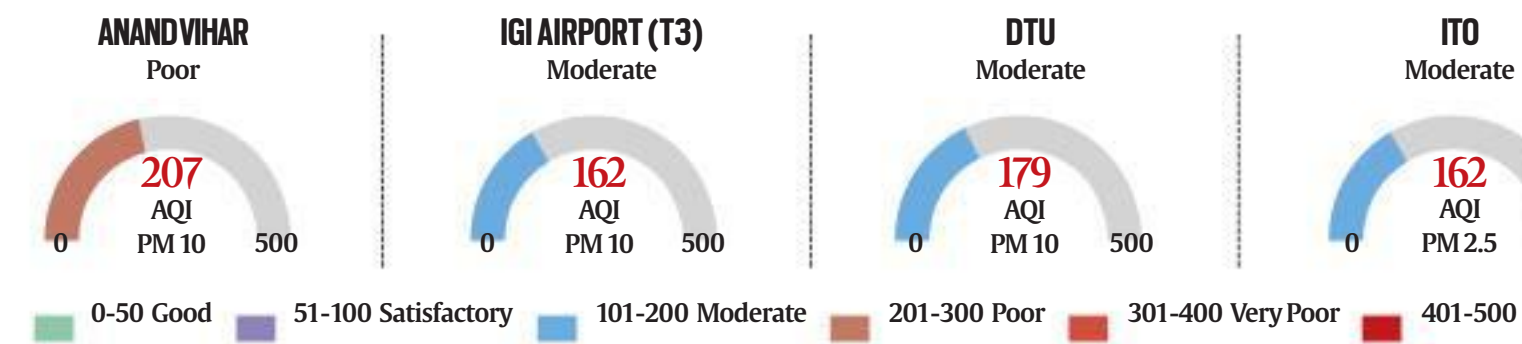

GURGAON DEPUTY COMMISSIONER ISSUES ORDER 'Unfit for habitation': Residents of 5th tower at Chintels told to vacate

MONTHS AFTER Tower H at Gurgaon's Chintels Paradiso society was found unfit for habitation by IIT-Delhi, residents have been asked to vacate the building in 15 days.

In an October 6 order, Deputy Commissioner Nishant Kumar Yadav, also the chairman of the District Disaster Management Authority, stated that he was informed that in a joint committee report received from the additional district magistrate's office, IIT-Delhi declared the tower unsafe for human habitation.

Over the past few months, four other towers of the 9-tower society — D, E, F and G — were ordered to be vacated after a portion of a sixth-floor apartment in Tower D collapsed all the way to the first floor, killing two women and injuring a man, in February.

In July, after IIT's structural audit report was released, the district town planner (enforcement)

wrote to Chintels India Private Limited that Tower H should be vacated. IIT-Delhi's report said, "There is rapid and widespread corrosion of reinforcement almost throughout the structure... In the current condition..., the structure is not safe for habitation."

The deputy commissioner said in his order that the joint committee was of the view that Tower H should be permanently

closed. "... (I) hereby order inhabitants residing in Tower H of aforesaid society to vacate their respective premises and hand over vacant possession... to M/s Chintels India Pvt. Ltd. within 15 days from passing [of] this order... The matter of payment of compensation to inhabitants/flat owners by developer (i.e. M/s Chintels India Pvt. Ltd.) is being dealt with separately by the SIT constituted

in this matter and accordingly M/s Chintels India Pvt. Ltd. is directed to settle all claims of all the allottees of Tower H in a time-bound manner," the order read.

ADC Hitesh Kumar Meena said they are also awaiting the report of Tower J to ascertain the degree of damage. "A private institute has done an audit and we have sent it to IIT-D. Towers A, B, and C have been declared safe for now, and the annual assessments are for ensuring this does not repeat," he said.

Meena said though the Tower H report came out months ago, they didn't issue an order soon after considering the time needed for residents to relocate. "Through meetings, we had informed residents they should vacate. Now, we have invoked the Disaster Management Act (DMA) for expediting as some people have not left. However, 80% of vacation at towers Gand H is complete now while the other three towers (D, E and F) are completely empty," he said.

Residents, meanwhile, raised issues with the process.

Nidhi Sharma, a Tower H resident, said there is little transparency: "We plan to write a letter asking for rehabilitation and time to move out. The report came out in July and the authorities wrote to the builder; the latter informed us about this via email by attaching the letter sent by authorities. Earlier, when the IIT-Delhi report was released (for the other towers), a meeting would be held, after which a DMA order would come out, but the whole process would take months. We thought we had time as we were still awaiting the detailed report."

Responding to the order, VP of Chintels India JN Yadav said, "We have already extended the settlement offer to all residents of Phase 1 of Chintels Paradiso. We welcome the administration's decision to ask them to vacate... our priority has always been residents' safety. We have already settled with 118 residents which are in various stages — 56 have received 100% monetary settlement, 43 have received 10% and 19 have signed consent forms."

AAP ready to contest MP, Rajasthan & Chhattisgarh elections, says CM Kejriwal

SOON AFTER the Election Commission announced the dates of Assembly polls in five states, AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal said the party is fully prepared to contest elections in full strength in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan. He said the names of the candidates will be announced soon.

The announcement, meanwhile, has raised questions on the opposition INDIA alliance which the AAP and Congress are part of. Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan are currently ruled by the Congress.

Senior AAP leaders told *The Indian Express* that the alliance at the national level is independent of its decision to contest in states. There was no immediate response from the Congress.

However, Congress leader Alka Lamba, quoting a video clip where Kejriwal is saying his party is prepared, posted on X, "These are the same 3 states

where Congress formed its governments in 2018 by defeating BJP in a direct contest and gaining majority. This time too, Congress is going to form the government on its own by defeating BJP in a direct contest..."

According to AAP Rajya Sabha MP and National General Secretary Dr Sandeep Pathak, "The AAP is fully prepared for the assembly elections. The party will contest with full strength in Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh and Rajasthan. The public has repeatedly given chances to all the

parties, and now the public has made up its mind to give a chance to AAP. This election is going to be very decisive."

Pathak said AAP has a party committee in every village in these three states. We are taking the good governance model of Delhi and Punjab to the public. 24x7 electricity, free education, health system, good governance and water will be the party's main agenda for the polls," he added.

Following rallies and campaigns, the party will pick its candidates and CM faces in these states.

Addressing a rally at Gwalior in Madhya Pradesh, Kejriwal had said in July: "Prime Minister Narendra Modi is very angry with me and he goes around saying that Kejriwal is distributing 'free revdis'... but why is it bothering the PM? In Delhi, I have provided seven 'free ki revdi'."

In August, during a town hall meeting in Satna, the Kejriwal had announced 10 major guarantees to the citizens of Madhya Pradesh including electricity, education, healthcare and employment.

Peering into lift shaft to check flooding, plumber killed by moving elevator

IT WAS a regular work call for Sanjay, 30, a plumber by profession — the Rajeev Camp resident was called to look into a flooding issue in a lift shaft at a commercial building in West Delhi's Naraina Monday. But as Sanjay, who went by only one name, entered the lift and peeped down into the shaft, the elevator started moving all of a sudden, injuring him in the process. He was rushed to the hospital where he was declared dead.

DCP (West) Vichitra Veer said, "There was some issue of waterlogging in the lift area, for which he was called. While he was examining the area, the lift began moving and he got stuck. Further facts are being examined and legal action will be initiated."

Police said the incident took place between 12.30 pm and 1

pm. "As per the information available so far, it appears that someone pressed the lift button while he was peeping down at the floor of the lift shaft, causing this incident," said an officer.

A senior officer said an employee of one of the firms operating out of the building, who pressed the lift button, will be questioned, based on which subsequent action will be taken. He has been identified through CCTV footage and efforts are on to nab him. "We are also questioning the building owner as there has been negligence on part of the operation of the lift," said the DCP.

Two to three persons were nearby when this incident happened but as they were not able to get Sanjay out, a local technician was roped in, said officers.

The building in question houses two showrooms on the first two floors and a corporate office on the third floor, followed by a common terrace.

Over three months, premium vends give a fillip to Capital's liquor sales

WHILE PREMIUM liquor vends in the city constitute only a fraction of the total share — 48 of the total 625 shops — their contribution to sales is more than the normal vends, data shared by the excise department shows. These vends, however, are not along the lines initially imagined, with walk-in facilities and better displays missing.

According to the data from the past three months (July 1 to September 30), a normal liquor vend in Delhi sold 2.46 lakh bottles on average. In the same time period, a premium vend sold 3.20 lakh bottles on average. It also shows that the excise department recorded bottle sales of 1,579.03 lakh in the period — the average monthly sale is 526.34 lakh. (see box)

Following the scrapping of the new excise policy and the return of the old regime and the government into the liquor business, the excise department is emphasising opening more premium vends to boost revenue.

Government shops operate under four corporations — DSCSC, DTTDC, DSIIDC and DSCWC. With private players no longer allowed, the government has decided to open five premium vends per corporation that will house imported brands and offer a better customer experience. "Sale at premium vends is good because of the availability of brands as well as less rush," said an official, adding that the department has re-



ceived more applications to open premium vends.

The Indian Express, meanwhile, visited five premium liquor vends in Connaught Place, Daryaganj and Asaf Ali Road to take in the customer experience and what's on offer.

At CP, the DSIIDC premium vend located near the Bombay Life building appeared like a usual shop — there was a salesperson behind the counter while customers lined up in a narrow space on the other side.

Construction was ongoing on the property. An employee said, "Our shop is premium and work is on in the premium section. This will be aesthetically pleas-

ing with a cafe look. Once complete, customers can just walk in, select, and buy the liquor they want. There will also be cold storage for beer."

The shop located in A block, Inner Circle, was swankier and people could enter the shop to buy liquor.

At the next premium vend, connected to the one above, the shutters were down. "It is a premium shop and people could walk in. However, we saw a spate of thefts so we kept the shutter down. Two days ago, a man stole a carton of liquor worth Rs 15,000-Rs 20,000," said an employee at the vend, adding that they are open for business.

Premium vends at Daryaganj also looked similar. At Asaf Ali road, there were huge boards reading "Wine and Beer shops" but they were closed.

Some key areas where these are located are Lajpat Nagar, Saket Square Mall, Basant Lok, Vasant Kunj, Connaught place, South Extension, Khan Market, INA, Lodhi Colony, Greater Kailash and Mayur Vihar etc. At 18, the DSIIDC has the most number of premium vends.

The size of these vends varies from 400 square feet to 1,400 sqft. Those located in upscale areas, popular markets and malls are bigger — 900 sqft to 1,400 sqft.

STARTING WITH a public meeting at Northwest Delhi's Bawana this Sunday, the Congress is scheduled to crisscross the four corners of the capital in a weekly show of strength ahead of next year's Lok Sabha polls. One such event, sources said, will also take the party to the heart of Sikh-dominated West Delhi — the first such event to be held three decades after the 1984 riots.

The footfall of supporters is expected to range between 5,000 and 7,000 at each such public meeting. Said a senior party functionary, "The party is preparing to hit the ground and undertake mass public contact campaigns at each of the seven Lok Sabha constituencies of the city like never before; (Delhi Pradesh Congress Committee president) Arvinder Singh Lovely is expected to preside over 300-400 big and small public meetings till December."

"We will begin the campaign by organising large gatherings consisting of thousands of supporters at each of the capital's borders. This will be followed by at least 280 closed-door meetings at each block, with around 50 to 100 people in attendance, till the end of this year," he added.

After Bawana, party sources said the second such public meeting was scheduled at the Loni Border in Northeast Delhi's Mustafabad. This will be followed by the meeting at West

Delhi's Tilak Nagar.

There will also be rallies at Najafgarh border and Okhla. Between these, sources said, the party is scheduled to organise a grand public meeting at East Delhi's Shahdara Anaj Mandi. This, they said, was chosen specifically as it is considered to have been among former PM Indira Gandhi's preferred locations for public meetings in the city.

In July, the Congress had announced that resurrecting its grassroots cadre with appeals to those who left its flanks to return and expanding it further with "talented individuals" would form the foundation of its poll roadmap in the capital.

In an organisational resolution, the party stated that no stone would be left unturned to win all the seven Lok Sabha seats in Delhi by "thoroughly exposing the misgovernance of both AAP and BJP".

'Fake bills' worth Rs 5.9 cr: Hero MotoCorp, exec chairman booked

DELHI POLICE has lodged an FIR against Hero MotoCorp and its executive chairman Pawan Munjal for alleged cheating, forging and manufacturing of bills worth Rs 5.9 crore. Police said the offence took place in 2009-10 even as the complainant, Brains Logistics Pvt Ltd, filed a complaint in the matter on October 5.

Police said a case has been registered against the company, Munjal and other senior officers at the firm.

In the FIR, the complainant, a service provider based in Delhi, alleged that the accused committed "illegal acts of forgery, cheating and falsifying the books of accounts". The FIR further said that the accused, in collusion with each other, manufactured fake month-wise bills of a total of Rs 5.94 crore in 2009-10. The bills are signed and have a stamp of 'Hero MotoCorp Ltd', said police.

Tales of perseverance, resilience at Delhi govt's State Award event to honour differently abled

CHETAN UPADHYAY became interested in dance at a young age: His school had organised classes for differently abled children and he found himself hooked from the word go. Since then, Upadhyay has performed on India's Got Talent, the popular reality TV show, in 2008, and in the Commonwealth Games in 2010. Along with his dance troupe Nav Utthan, he performs Bharatanatyam, Bhangra and Sama — a form of Sufi dance.

Upadhyay was among several differently abled people who were conferred the State Award by the Delhi government Monday at an event held at Shah Auditorium, Civil Lines.

While addressing the awards ceremony, CM Arvind Kejriwal said, "The story of each individual who has received the awards is extremely inspirational. All these people have converted their disabilities into their strengths."

The CM said the Delhi government is with all individuals with disabilities, highlighting the schemes the government has rolled out for the elderly and the differently abled. He assured that if more plans are needed, the government would not hesitate in creating them.

Upadhyay, the dancer, dreams

of becoming Asia's first wheelchair motocross skater. He realised that his troupe's acrobatic acts were a big hit with audiences and wanted to take it a level up. While surfing through YouTube he came across wheelchair backflip tricks. "That fascinated me so much that I felt I had to learn it," said Upadhyay. "I have no

coaches, I simply learn through the internet... and by falling and getting hurt," he said with a laugh. Specialised wheelchairs are hard to come by but Upadhyay has managed to learn to install shock absorbers and front fork suspensions on his wheels that are especially fragile to falls and 4-foot dead drops.

According to Mallikarjuna Ithya, another award recipient, people with disabilities are equipped with robust survival skills. They have attributes such as a risk-taking temperament, perseverance and patience that could turn them into good entrepreneurs, he said.

Hailing from AP's Kurnool, Ithya runs Inclusive Divyangian Entrepreneur Association (IDEA) — a chamber of commerce aimed to incubate start-ups launched by differently abled entrepreneurs. So far, he has helped over 750 entrepreneurs across four states set up their businesses and aims to facilitate 10,000 jobs and 5,000 entrepreneurs.

Ithya's goal in life is to make

people with disabilities realise that they are not a burden but people with unique abilities and talents who can contribute to the economy as well. "We cannot achieve a 3 trillion or 5 trillion economy until all sections of society can become a contributing part," he said.

Another recipient of the award is Sagar Parasari who used to work with the NCERT and conducts motivational speeches for students in his free time. According to him, he has addressed over 25 lakh students across India. Hailing originally from Tripura, Parasari moved to Delhi at a young age. When he was 12, he suffered a cerebral attack that rendered him paralysed. "I never let that stop me," Parasari said. "I don't consider myself any less than an Olympic athlete — I've worked that hard," he said.

Parasari has written four books espousing his personal philosophy of putting an end to "manufacturing of war and weapons", and allocating money to healthcare and education instead.

JUDICIAL JUGGLE

VIRTUAL COURTS have made hearings accessible not just for litigants but also for sought-after advocates. Senior lawyer Kapil Sibal had two crucial cases lined up on Monday — one before the Delhi High Court and the other before a bench headed by the Chief Justice of India in the Supreme Court — on top of the board as item number 1. He first appeared via video-conferencing before the Delhi High Court at 10.30 am in the case challenging the arrest of NewsClick editor-in-chief Prabir Purkayastha under UAPA. Once the CJI's bench in SC finished hearing urgent listing requests by 10.45 am, Sibal quickly passed the baton to other lawyers in the NewsClick case and argued in person for NCP leader Sharad Pawar in the Maharashtra Assembly disqualification plea.

SPECIAL MENTION

IN THE latest list of BJP candidates for Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh, the party has mentioned 'MP' in front of the names of the Members of Parliament it has fielded. In an earlier list in which it named three Union ministers alongside some other MPs for the Madhya Pradesh Assembly polls, the BJP did not mention who the MPs were, leading to calls from journalists to sources in the party in Madhya Pradesh and Delhi to get the precise number and names. This time, the list has been made easy with the special mentions, including 'ex-IAS', after the names of candidates who retired as IAS officers, perhaps in an attempt to showcase administrative experience.

MISSING MINISTER

THE RURAL Development Ministry is learnt to have cancelled its Chintan Shivir, which was supposed to be held on October 5-6 at Surajkund in Faridabad. Officials from Centre and states were supposed to participate in the event. There is no clarity on when it will be organised now. It is learnt that the event was cancelled because of the non-availability of Rural Development Minister Giriraj Singh, who was occupied in his constituency, Begusarai, for several days last week. He was not even present during the high-voltage drama that unfolded when a Trinamool Congress delegation protesting in Krishi Bhawan was ousted from the premises on October 3. In his absence, junior minister Sadhvi Niranjan Jyoti tried to handle the situation.

In first list for Rajasthan, BJP fields seven MPs; two loyalists of Raje lose out

HOURS AFTER the Election Commission (EC) Monday announced that Rajasthan will go to polls on November 23, the BJP released its first list of 41 candidates, fielding seven sitting MPs and denying tickets to some old-timers. At present, the party holds only one of the 41 seats — Vidhyadhar Nagar — but there too it replaced its incumbent MLA.

The party's move to field seven of its 24 MPs from the state is similar to its strategy in neighbouring Madhya Pradesh, where incumbent MPs have been asked to contest the Assembly elections. The two big names denied tickets from their usual constituencies are Vidhyadhar Nagar MLA Narpat Singh Rajvi who is the son-in-law of former Chief Minister and Vice President Bhairon Singh Shekhawat, and former Jhotwara MLA Rajpal Singh Shekhawat. Both of them are counted among the loyalists of former CM Vasundhara Raje.

From Vidhyadhar Nagar, the

BJP has fielded Rajsamand MP Diya Kumari who is a member of the erstwhile royal family of Jaipur. Rajvi was continuously elected as MLA from Vidhyadhar Nagar since 2008. The BJP has fielded Jaipur rural MP Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore from Jhotwara in place of former MLA from the constituency Rajpal Singh Shekhawat. Shekhawat represented the seat in 2008 and 2013 but lost in 2018.

Among the other big names on the list are Rajya Sabha MP and the party's tallest tribal leader in Rajasthan Kirodi Lal Meena who has been fielded from the Sawai Madhopur in eastern Rajasthan, a region where the saffron party performed poorly in 2018. By fielding Meena, who has a formidable following in the region, the BJP hopes to improve its performance in districts such as Sawai Madhopur where it presently doesn't have a single seat. Sawai Madhopur has four Assembly constituencies. In 2018, the BJP

won only one of the 24 constituencies in the eastern Rajasthan districts of Bharatpur, Dausa, Dholpur, Karauli, and Sawai Madhopur.

Incumbent Alwar MP Baba Balaknath has been fielded from Tijara in Alwar district. Among the other MPs who will contest the Assembly elections are: Jhunjhunu MP Narendra Kumar from the Mandawa seat (Jhunjhunu district), Ajmer MP Bhagirath Choudhary from Kishangarh (Ajmer district), and Jalore-Sirohi MP Devji Patel who will be in the fray from Sanchoore (Sanchoore district).

Gujjar leader Vijay Bainsla who is the son of the late Colonel Kirori Singh Bainsla, the face of Gujjar quota agitation, will contest on a BJP ticket from the Deoli-Uniara in Tonk.

Another important name in the list is former MP Subhash Maharia who has been fielded from Lachhmangarh in Sikar district whose incumbent MLA is state Congress president Govind Singh Dotasra. Maharia was an MP from the BJP before switching to the Congress and returned to the BJP in May.

The BJP has lost to the Congress eight of the nine elections held since 2019 — eight by polls and one election to an Assembly seat delayed by a month — and faces an uphill task in the state.

3 more MPs in Chhattisgarh BJP second list, riot victim's father gets poll ticket

THE BJP released a second list of 64 candidates for the Chhattisgarh Assembly polls on Monday, hours after the Election Commission (EC) announced that the elections will be held in two phases on November 7 and 17. With this, the party has named candidates for 85 of the 90 Assembly constituencies in the state.

The BJP named three more sitting MPs on its list, fielding its state president and Bilaspur MP Arun Sao from Lormi in Bilaspur district. The other two parliamentarians on the list are Raigarh MP Gomati



Sai who will be in the fray from Pathalgaon in Jashpur district, and Sarguja MP Renuka Singh from Bharatpur-Sonhat in Koriya district. In its first list, the BJP fielded Durg MP Vijay Baghel against CM Bhupesh Baghel from Patan.

Of the party's 13 MLAs at present, all except Beltrara (Bilaspur) legislator Rajinish Singh found their names on the list. Among those again in the fray are former CM Raman Singh (Rajnandgaon

in the district of the same name) and former ministers Brijmohan Agrawal (Raipur City South) and Ajay Chandrakar (Kurud in Dhamtari district).

The party also pulled a surprise by giving a ticket to the father of a man who was killed during a communal riot in Biranpur in April. The BJP had targeted the Congress over the murder of 23-year-old Bhuneshwar Sahu who died during the violence triggered following the death of a father-son duo from a minority community. Ishwar Sahu will contest from Saja in Bemetara district that is currently represented by minister Ravindra Choubey.

Cong sets its poll line, bats for caste census

CWC meeting reiterates caste census as a 'powerful step' for emancipation of poor, cites Bihar caste survey report

AS THE Election Commission (EC) announced the schedule for the Assembly polls in five states, the Congress strategy was clear Monday — test the caste gambit in these elections, and amplify it later for the Lok Sabha.

After a Congress Working Committee meeting, the party asserted that if elected to power, it will hold a caste census and remove the 50% ceiling on reservations for SC, ST and backward classes through a legislation, to give them representation according to their population. This came days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi turned the slogan voicing this, "Jitni aabadi, utna haq", first given by Rahul Gandhi during the Karnataka Assembly elections, to attack the Congress.

The high-stakes state elections are crucial pit-stops for both the Congress and BJP before the Lok Sabha elections in April-May 2024, especially for the main Opposition party, as a win in the two states it holds and coming to power in another would help it position itself as the dominant player within the INDIA alliance, and strengthen its hands in the seat-sharing sweepstakes.

The party seems to be banking hard on the OBC card, projecting caste census as a "powerful step" for the emancipation of the poor, which would "open a new paradigm for development". Attacking the "Jitni aabadi, utna haq" slogan, Modi had said that for the BJP, the only caste is the poor.

The CWC — whose meeting coincided with the EC poll schedule announcement Monday — spent most of the time sharpening the Congress's social justice plank. A resolution passed at the meeting said that if voted to

power at the Centre, the party will conduct a nationwide caste census as part of the normal decadal Census, which was due in 2021 but has been postponed.

The party also said it will "implement 33% reservation for women in the Lok Sabha and state Assemblies at the earliest, while ensuring adequate representation for women belonging to SCs, STs and OBCs". It said the "obstacles" imposed on the Census and Lok Sabha seat delimitation by the Modi government will be removed. Besides, the party said, it "will remove the cap of 50% through legislation for the reservation of OBCs, SCs and STs, in line with the commensurate share of population".

Earlier, the CWC, at its meeting in Hyderabad on September 15-16, had called for increasing the existing upper limit of reservations for SCs, STs and OBCs.

Addressing a press conference after the CWC meeting, where the party's four chief ministers were present, Rahul Gandhi stressed that three of them are from OBC communities, while pointing out that the BJP has only one OBC CM (among 10). "And he (Shivraj Singh Chouhan) won't remain CM in a few days," he said.

Rahul claimed PM Modi is incapable of getting a caste census done, as he does not work for the welfare of OBCs. "The RSS and Modi have put in place a system to distract attention of OBCs, Dalits and tribals from the truth regarding their representation. And Modi is the main instrument... Unka yahi kaam hai ki Bhaiya, OBC ki bhagidari na ho... dhyani idhar-udhar jaata jaaye (His job is to ensure that the attention of OBCs is diverted, so that they don't get their due)".

The CWC resolution said: "The Modi government has cheated the OBC communities and other

deprived sections of the country by not releasing the data of the 2011 Socio Economic and Caste Census and not carrying out a fresh caste census. It has also failed in its constitutional duty by inordinately postponing the decadal Census that ought to have been conducted in 2021 or soon thereafter."

It said the final figures of the Bihar caste survey have revealed the disparity between share in population and representation, and highlighted the urgent need to take effective steps to ensure social justice. A nationwide caste census, it said, will reveal an accurate picture of the socio-economic position of communities across the country, and provide a sound, data-driven basis for policies to strengthen the foundations of social justice, and ensure inclusive development.

Addressing the CWC, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge asked party workers to work in tandem, with discipline and unity, and put in all their might to win the Assembly elections. While supporting caste census and the need for representation for OBC communities, sources said a couple of members — including Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury and Jitendra Singh — urged the party to be careful, as the ruling BJP could try and portray that the party was indifferent to the interests of other castes. When one member pointed out that the party should talk about the situation of SCs and STs, Rahul pointed out that the party is not against anyone, and that the census is for all.

He admitted that some parties in the INDIA alliance may have a "slightly different position" on caste census. "That is fine, we are flexible... But I'm confident the majority of the alliance is going to support a caste census," he said.

Zoramthanga aims for 2nd tenure, but ex-cop's party stands in way

MIZORAM CHIEF Minister Zoramthanga's Mizo National Front (MNF) will be looking to retain power in the coming Assembly elections, going up against a rising Zoram People's Movement (ZPM) and a Congress hoping to bounce back from its 2018 poor showing.

Mizoram will vote on November 7 for its 40-member Assembly and the contest in this small border state — with just 8.5 lakh voters — looks considerably different than the ones in the other four states heading to elections that month.

Since the formation of Mizoram in 1986, the government has swung between the MNF and Congress. When Zoramthanga took charge as CM in 2018 after the MNF won 27 seats and 38.4% of the votes, it was his third term in power and marked a return to the top job after 10 years. He had led two successive MNF governments from 1998 to 2008 but then came the two tenures of the Congress led by Lal Thanhawla.

While the MNF will be hoping for the two-term pattern to continue, for the last few years the party has been harnessing sociopolitical forces affecting members of the broader Mizo-Kuki-Chin or Zo ethnic group to cultivate an image of a wider leadership. Going against the Centre's directives, the Zoramthanga has wel-

comed and sheltered Chin refugees from Myanmar since the military coup in the neighbouring country and they are estimated to number well over 35,000. This year, the Mizoram government has sheltered more than 12,000 Kuki-Zomi people displaced from Manipur. With the breakdown in the relationship between Manipur's 10 Kuki-Zomi MLAs and the N Biren Singh-led government, Zoramthanga has met these legislators multiple times. And then, with an eye on the elections, the state government declared last month that it would ignore the Centre's orders to collect biometric data of "illegal immigrants" from Myanmar in the state.

But the MNF is looking at a tough fight against the ZPM, which, as an unregistered party in 2018, bagged eight seats and emerged as the second-largest party in the Assembly. Under the leadership of former MP Lalduhoma, an ex-IPS officer, the ZPM, which will be contesting all 40 constituencies, will look to consolidate its gains. It will particularly look to build on its strong performance earlier this year in the municipal election in Lunglei, Mizoram's second-biggest town, where it won all 11 seats.

Assemblies in the five poll-bound states met for less than 30 days a year, says report

AS FIVE states go to polls, data compiled by a think tank showed that these state assemblies — Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Telangana, Chhattisgarh and Mizoram — met for less than 30 days a year and the number of sittings have been going down over the years.

The Rajasthan Assembly met for 29 days in a year on an average and the Telangana Assembly for 15 days, according to a report by PRS Legislative Research.

Between 2019 and 2023, average sittings of the Chhattisgarh House was 23 days a year, with average sitting time being five hours.

The Madhya Pradesh Assembly had sittings for 16 days, around four hours a day on average, and the Mizoram Assembly sat for 18 days, with each sitting being around five hours, it stated.

According to the PRS Legislative Research report, the Rajasthan Assembly had the highest number of sittings among these five states — around 29 days per year, and each sitting lasted for around seven hours.

In four of the five states for

which long-term data is available, sittings have reduced over time, it stated.

In their first 10 years, the Rajasthan Assembly, on average, met for 59 days a year, while the MP Assembly met for 48 days a year. In the last 10 years, the average annual sitting days have declined to 29 in Rajasthan and 21 in Madhya Pradesh.

Telangana had its highest sittings in 2017 — 37 days. However, in every year since then, it met for less than 20 days.

Around 48 per cent of Bills in these state Assemblies were considered and passed on the same

day or the day after introduction. Mizoram passed 57 Bills during its current term, all on the same day or the day after introduction.

Citing examples, the report stated that in 2020, the Chhattisgarh Assembly passed 14 Bills in a single six-hour sitting. In Madhya Pradesh, 13 Bills were introduced and passed over two days in 2022, and both sittings together lasted for five hours. A large number of ordinances were also issued by these states.

Between 2019 and 2023, Madhya Pradesh issued 39 ordinances, followed by Telangana (14) and Rajasthan (13).

AMID TALK of a chill in relations between the BJP central leadership and Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan's government, the party on Monday released the fourth list of 57 candidates — all MLAs — for the coming elections.

The list features Chouhan and 24 of his ministers, including seven who are seen as loyalists of Union Minister of Civil Aviation Jyotiraditya Scindia. In total, the list accommodates eight of Scindia's loyalists. This is a strong signal that the central leadership has placed its faith in the Union Minister despite several leaders from his camp switching over to the Congress in the last couple of months.

Chouhan will contest from his home ground Budhni — a seat in Sehore district that he has represented five times. State home

Role Of Pharmacies In Stigma Related To Mental Health Treatment

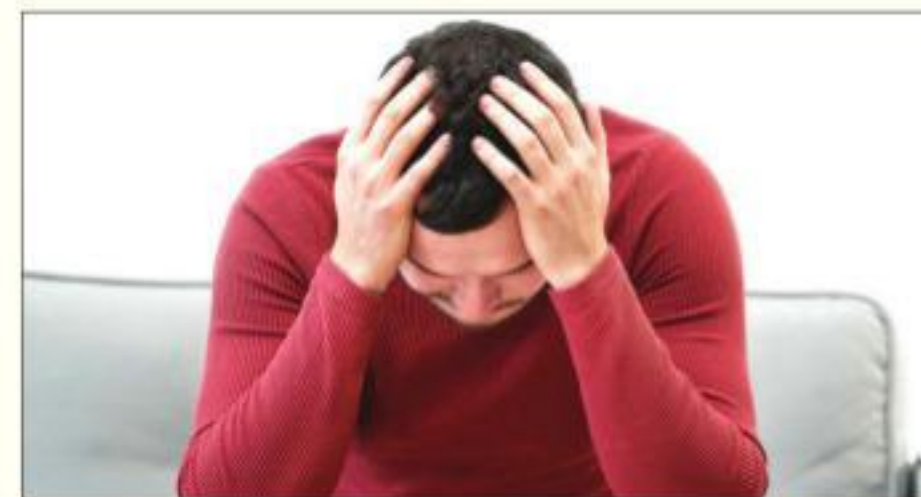
On this World Mental Health Day, I would like to request Pharmacy Owners who are an important pillar of Healthcare system not to dismiss mental health issues lightly. There is already a certain degree of stigma attached to mental illnesses. Some loose comments from a person whom a layperson believes to possess better knowledge about health than themselves, can create serious barrier to seeking or continuing with treatment for potentially fatal mental illnesses. It is a common occurrence that patients come to us after a suicide attempt (after discontinued medications) because a Pharmacy Owner told them that the medication is risky or unnecessary. Sometimes they are refused a medication despite having a valid prescription. Mental illnesses are just like physical illnesses and can be well managed in majority of cases. It is better to take medicine and live productively rather

than suffer or commit suicide. Government agencies may also ensure that persons without any professional training are not permitted to interact/deal with patients at Pharmacy (even if they are the owner) and medicines are dispensed only by a trained Pharmacist.

46L Kudumbashree women 'back to school'

OVER THE next two months, more than 2,000 schools will open their doors on weekends for the 46 lakh women enrolled in Kerala's flagship poverty alleviation mission, Kudumbashree. Back in school, the women will attend classes on adapting to the digital age, as the mission seeks to reorient itself.

Launching the "back to school" programme at an event in Palakkad district's Thrithala on October 1, Kerala Local Self Government Minister MBRajesh said the Kudumbashree mission has made great strides in over the last 25 years.

"The next target of the mission is not poverty alleviation, but enhancing the income of households. Kudumbashree will undergo a transformation in its content and functioning. They will get training in financial transactions and entrepreneurship," he said. The minister said the programme would empower members of Kudumbashree's neighbourhood groups to take up new

projects "in tune with emerging opportunities, apart from strengthening the three-tier system of the mission".

The classes will be taught by 15,000 trained resource persons. Five topics for the classes are "organisational strength—lessons from experience, vibrancy of NHG, community—life security, livelihood ideas and digital age".

The programme began on October 1 and will go on till December 10. All the women, part of Kudumbashree's neighbourhood groups, will get to attend classes for at least a day, thus enabling all 46 lakh women to attend the programme by the end of the initiative.

On October 1, on the day of launch, four lakh women attended classes held in 870 schools across the state. The students' names will be displayed in front of the classrooms.

Kudumbashree Mission's 19,470 area development societies and 1,070 community development societies are also involved in the "back to school" programme. At district level, there will be a 10-member team of resource persons to run the programme.

Faizal to remain Lakshadweep MP as SC stays Kerala HC order

THE SUPREME COURT on Monday stayed the Kerala High Court order which refused to suspend the conviction of Mohammed Faizal, the disqualified NCP MP from Lakshadweep, in an attempt to murder case.

Issuing notice on Faizal's appeal challenging the October 3 High Court order, the bench of Justices Hrishikesh Roy and Sanjay Karol directed that the Supreme Court's August 22 order by which the matter was remanded back to the High Court while allowing him to continue as an MP will become operational.

This means that Faizal, who was disqualified as MP following the High Court order, will remain MP during the pendency of the appeal before the Supreme Court. For Faizal, senior advocate Kapil Sibal argued that it was a fight between the Congress and NCP workers and that the witnesses were all Congress workers and no inde-

pendent witnesses. He contended that there was no weapon of offence in the FIR initially but it was introduced later. Sibal pointed out that Faizal's tenure would end in May 2024 and the seat should not be allowed to go unrepresented.

Additional Solicitor General K M Nataraj, who appeared for the Union Territory administration, urged the court not to grant any interim relief.

On January 11 this year, a Kavaratti sessions court sentenced Faizal and three others to 10 years in jail and imposed a fine of Rs 1 lakh on each of them for attempting to kill Mohammed Salih, son-in-law of the late Congress leader and former Union minister P M Sayeed, during the 2009 Lok Sabha polls. Two days later, the LS Secretariat notified Faizal's dis-

qualification as an MP under the Representation of the People Act.

On January 25, the Kerala High Court suspended Faizal's conviction and sentencing, noting that the Lok Sabha elections were only one-and-a-half years away and a bypoll at this juncture would lead to wasteful expenditure.

The Union Territory of Lakshadweep and the man whom Faizal was held guilty of attempting to kill appealed against the High Court order and it was heard by a bench of Justices BV Nagarathna and Ujjal Bhuyan on August 22. The bench raised doubts over the High Court suspending the conviction only on the grounds of the prospect of elections. It said the High Court had not considered the true position of law concerning how an application for a stay on conviction must be considered.

It set aside the August 22 order "on this short ground alone" and remitted the matter back to the High Court, which on October 3 refused to suspend his conviction.

Delhi High Court seeks Centre's response on Chinese incursions

THE DELHI High Court on Monday sought the Centre's stand on a plea by former Rajya Sabha MP Subramanian

Swamy seeking information under the Right to Information Act on Chinese incursions into the Indian territory.

A single-judge bench of Justice Subramonium Prasad sought response from the respondents, including the Ministry of Home Affairs, and listed the matter for hearing in January 2024.

The plea states that on November 10, 2022, Swamy filed an RTI application with the MHA seeking information on the number of times and dates on which the Chinese military made illegal incursions into the Indian territory across the mutually agreed upon Line of Actual Control (LAC) between the two countries since 1996.

Among other points, the RTI plea sought information on the extent of India's sovereign land, which has been "ceded" to China due to creation of "no man's land" across the mutually agreed upon LAC in 1996.

The RTI application was transferred between various departments which continued even after the expiry of the timeline for receiving the reply to the plea. Thereafter, he moved a first appeal on January 12, which was also transferred between various departments without effective resolution. He filed a second appeal in March with the Central Information Commission (CIC).

"Shortly after the second appeal was registered, the petitioner sent a letter to the CIC, requesting him to hear the second appeal expeditiously, vide letter dated March 27, 2023. The petitioner never received a response [to the letter]. The second appeal is pending with the respondent number 1 till date, without having been heard even once," the plea states.

Delhi Police summons Gehlot's OSD in phone-tapping case

The Delhi Police have summoned Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot's Officer on Special Duty (OSD) Lokesh Sharma for questioning Tuesday in connection with the phone-tapping FIR based on Union Jal Shakti minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat's complaint in March 2021.

With the summons coming within a couple of hours of the Model Code of Conduct coming into force, sources close to Sharma questioned its timing, saying, "It seems they were waiting for the MCC to kick in." The matter has already been listed before the Delhi High Court for October 11.

Sharma, who was recently appointed as one of the three co-chairpersons of Congress's Central

Act, 1885 and the IT Act, 2000.

The Delhi Police have issued several summons to Sharma in connection with the case, and he has appeared four times, and has faced interrogations of around 20 hours in total.

Last time, the Delhi Police questioned him on March 20 this year for 9 hours. Sharma has denied recording any phone calls, and claimed that he had come across the audio clips on social media, and shared them when he heard that "the persons in the audio clips are planning to topple a democratically elected government".

In 2020, an audio tape leak allegedly involving one Gajendra Singh, Sanjay Jain, as well as Congress MLAs Bhanwarlal Sharma and Vishvendra Singh led to a political crisis in Rajasthan.

FIRST LEVEL CHECKING OF EVMs

SC rejects plea challenging Delhi High Court order

THE SUPREME COURT on Monday junked a plea seeking disclosure of the Unique Identity Number of EVMs to be used in the Lok Sabha elections for First Level Checking (FLC) of the machines, saying "the process (FLC) is very detailed, parties have faith in it" and "it's been replicated across India".

A three-judge bench presided by CJI DY Chandrachud was hearing the petition by Delhi Pradesh Congress Committee chief Anil

Choudhary challenging the Delhi High Court order dismissing his plea. The bench, also comprising Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, however, pointed out that the appellant had not participated in the FLC process despite being invited. "We don't want to enter into it. This will completely delay the election schedule," said CJI Chandrachud.

The counsel appearing for Choudhary contended, "So far as time constraint is concerned, the rule provides that the FLC process should be complete at least 90 days prior to the elec-

tion... They say they have done it for Delhi, Jharkhand, and Kerala. For other states, it has not even commenced."

Choudhary said the Election Commission (EC) had conveyed to him "in July that they are starting and asked me to come and join". "I tell them I am willing to join but please give me unique identity numbers of all machines (Electronic Voting Machines). They gave it after the FLC. I say give me the number ahead of the FLC," he said.

The counsel submitted that "no parties joined (in the FLC). It

is the Congress which came forward and said we are willing to join. There is no communication from any other party".

The CJI said, "Possibly the fact that other parties, as you said, didn't join is an indicator that there is faith in the outcome."

The counsel said, "These machines are dispensed either from the Electronics Corporation of India or Bharat Electronics... When these machines are dispensed... they prepare the UIN of each machine. While dispatching, the UIN of each of these machines is sent along

with the despatch." "What happens on the way we do not know. Machines are received in the godowns here in Delhi. While receiving, the EC doesn't tally the numbers that are sent and what is received. Then they bring these machines to the FLC hall. What they expect us to do is to participate and then in the end they will supply the UIN," said the counsel. "When it's done for other states, you can participate... We are not casting any cloud on that process. The process is very detailed... Parties have faith in it," the CJI said.

Minor abducted, raped in Rajkot; three neighbours arrested: Cops

AN EIGHT-YEAR-OLD girl, who was found dead in Bhaktinagar Railway Yard in Rajkot on Saturday, was gang-raped and murdered by three men who were her neighbours, police said on Monday. The three accused have been arrested.

While she was playing outside Friday evening, one of the accused lured the girl to bushes where two others were waiting, said the police.

The three men raped her, and then killed her by hitting her with stones in the head, Vidhi Chaudhary, Additional Commissioner of Police told reporters.

She said the accused hail from Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and Rajasthan, aged 24, 25 and 38.

Two of them were working in a factory in Rajkot while the other one was a casual labourer.

The girl's body was found near Bhaktinagar railway station on Saturday. WITH PTI INPUTS

Domestic services now available on UP govt app

EVEN AS several companies with online presence provide a range of domestic services and skilled professionals, the Uttar Pradesh government's department of labour and employment has now rolled out 'Sewa Mitra' services in urban as well as rural areas across all 75 districts.

People can avail themselves of the services by logging on the 'Sewa Mitra' portal, installing the Sewa Mitra mobile application or simply making a call on a helpline number.

The 'Sewa Mitra' initiative provides professionals at home and offices and the list of services are available on the portal, app and conveyed by the helpline executive. Apart from the various domestic services, it also provides doctor on call, nursing help and service of priests for religious rituals.

According to the department, the 'Sewa Mitra' promises having registered over 788 service providers and over 4,076 professionals providing over 3,500 services.

Using the mobile app, the user can search for the required service professional based on geo-location and the app would suggest the professional available within 5 km. The portal-gives options of service providers along with the price.

The initiative was planned at government level when thousands of labourers and professionals had returned from different states to their native places during the first wave of Covid-19 and they had no jobs here. The Sewa Mitra service was launched to generate employment opportunities and engage skilled and semi-skilled workers in day's work jobs. The service was initially started on a trial basis in 25 districts.

Atiq Ahmed's sister gets custody of his two minor sons

THE CUSTODY of two minor sons of gangster-turned-politician Atiq Ahmed was handed over to their aunt on Monday following a directive from Prayagraj's Child Welfare Committee (CWC).

Ahmed's two sons have been at the Children Protection Home in Prayagraj since March 2 following the murder of Umesh Pal in which his father and elder brothers were accused.

While father Atiq Ahmed was shot dead under police escort on April 15 while on the way to a hospital for a medical test, mother Shaista Parveen, an accused in the Umesh Pal murder, is on the run.

District Probation Officer (Prayagraj) Sarvajeet Singh said that on the CWC's direction, the custody of Ahmed's minor sons has been given to their aunt (Ahmed's sister) Parveen Ahmed.

Following the murder of Umesh Pal, Shaista Parveen had filed an application in a Prayagraj court alleging that police had "illegally" detained her two minor sons on February 24 evening.

Prayagraj police told the court that the two minors were sent to a child protection home on March 2 after they found them in the Chakia Kasari Masari area.

No sleeveless attire, ripped jeans at Puri temple: Committee

DEVOTEES WEARING ripped jeans, half pants and sleeveless will not be allowed to enter the Puri Jagannath Temple. The Niti sub-committee, the highest-decision making body for rituals of the 12th century shrine, took a unanimous decision Monday. The rule will come into force before next year.

The Shree Jagannath Temple Administration (SJTA) requested the devotees to wear decent attire during their temple visit. Official sources said the SJTA will now make the devotees aware about the new rule. "Many times, it has been seen that devotees do not wear decent attire while visiting the temple. It denigrates the

temple's dignity...it also harms the religious sentiments of the place," said Ranjan Das, the temple's chief administrator, adding that children aged below 12 can wear half-pants.

Stating that every religion has such rules, including that of wearing decent attire while visiting their respective religious places, the SJTA chief administrator said they also need to protect the dignity of the shrine.

The Jagannath Temple Police and Pratihari servants will check if the devotees are following the rule, said SJTA sources.

In October 2021, the SJTA had made the dress code compulsory for the servants of the temple while offering puja.

71 booked, 1 held after stone pelting outside mosque in Hazaribagh

Hazaribagh Police have named 71 persons as accused in an FIR and arrested one of them in connection with a stone pelting incident Sunday night after "objectionable slogans" were raised outside a mosque in Katkamsandi area, injuring three.

Around 8.30 pm, the police said that a group of people returning in a bus from a VHP event in Ranchi raised "objectionable slogans" in front of Pelawal Mosque near Katkamsandi area of Hazaribagh that was met with stone-throwing by local residents. Police said that members of both communities have been booked. The injured were taken to the Sadar Hospital, the police said.

Hazaribagh Headquarters Deputy Superintendent of Police Rajiv Kumar told The Indian Express, "Seventy-one people from both the communities have been named in the FIR and one person has been arrested so far."

Hazaribagh SP Manoj Ratan Chothe told The Indian Express that the incident unfolded in front of a police patrolling team, which was in the vicinity. "The bus passengers were returning from Vishwa Hindu Parishad's Shaurya Yatra in Ranchi. It seems they were VHP workers and also from other outfits. Around 8.30 pm, they stopped the bus in front of the mosque and started raising objectionable slogans, after which the locals reacted and started pelting stones at the bus. Three people have been injured," Chothe said.

500 metres from Ironman finish line in Goa, man collapses, dies a day later

A 26-YEAR-OLD working as an associate manager at a multinational company died a day after he collapsed during a triathlon endurance race on Sunday.

Police said Kamakhya Siddharth, who hailed from Ranchi, was participating in the individual category of Ironman 70.3 Goa—a triathlon endurance race that involves a 1.2 mile swim, a 56-mile cycling ride and a 13.1-mile run. The race, which has participants from over 50 countries, was flagged off by Goa Chief Minister Pramod Sawant on Sunday morning.

Siddharth, who worked in the technology strategy sector,

died of multiple organ failure at a private hospital on Monday.

In a statement on their Facebook page, Ironman 70.3 Goa wrote, "We are saddened to confirm the passing of a race participant during Sunday's triathlon. At approximately 500

metres from the finish on the run portion of the race, the athlete required medical assistance. Emergency medical personnel and an ambulance positioned on the run course for the event provided immediate medical support before transporting the athlete to a nearby hospital, where they sadly passed away today".

"We appreciate the quick work of on-site safety personnel and first responders to provide the athlete with medical support. Our heartfelt condolences go out to the athlete's family and friends, whom we will continue to offer our support," the statement added.

A police officer, requesting anonymity, said: "As per preliminary information, he died of

multiple organ failure on Monday afternoon. His family has not filed a complaint so far."

Police said that in the days leading up to the race, Kamakhya had taken some training in Goa in open waters for swimming.

On his social media profiles, he described himself as an adrenaline junkie, a mountaineer, traveller and a "triathlete under training". In the past few weeks, he had been documenting training routines for the race on his Instagram account. He had completed a half-marathon earlier this year in Ranchi.

Police said that after completing his schooling from Ranchi, he pursued engineering, before moving to Gurgaon for a job at a consulting firm in 2019.

Appointment of Manipur HC CJ to be notified soon, Centre tells apex court

THE CENTRE on Monday told the Supreme Court that the notification for appointment of a new Chief Justice of Manipur HC Court will be issued shortly.

The government told a bench of Justices S K Kaul and Sudhanshu Dhulia that the file has been cleared and the rest of the process will follow soon.

The bench was hearing two petitions filed by the Advocates Association, Bengaluru, and another by an NGO seeking contempt of court proceedings against the Centre for alleged delay in deciding on the recommendations of the Supreme Court Collegium in the matter of appointment and transfer of judges.

Hearing the matter on September 26, the apex court had flagged its concerns over pendency of the recommendations, including the one on July 6 to appoint Delhi High Court judge

Justice Siddharth Mridul as Chief Justice of Manipur High Court.

On Monday, Attorney General R Venkataramani submitted a note to the court which said that 14 of the 26 pending files for transfer of High Court judges have been cleared while the rest are being processed.

Justice Kaul said the Law Ministry had forwarded to the Supreme Court Collegium names sent by the High Court Collegium, adding: "So in that respect there is no pendency. So far as CJ of Manipur HC is concerned, they said they will shortly issue a notice. So far as transfer is concerned, they have sought some time."

He said that 70 names pending before the ministry starting from November 2022 have landed before the collegium. "We are processing them and will try to finish them before October vacation. Will have to speak with consultee judges," he said.

Justice Kaul said the government may have reservations on

some of the names which are then examined and processed by the Supreme Court Collegium. Where the government has raised an objection and the Collegium overrules it, the government has a right to send it back, he said. "If the names have been sent back but the names have been reiterated, then appointment must take place," he said.

Senior Advocate Arvind P Datar and Advocate Prashanth Bhushan, appearing for the petitioners, suggested that the court should treat reiterated names as deemed appointments.

But the court said that the AG won't be able to convince the government to do that and added that there are bound to be practical complications as well. "How does a deemed appointment work? There has to be notification to be issued by the Government of India. There are practical complications," he said.

The court will now hear the matter on October 20.

More troops, gear for Sikkim search op, focus on restoring connectivity

THE ARMED Forces Monday continued search operations for 105 missing people in the debris in the aftermath of the devastating flash floods in Sikkim last week. So far, 34 bodies, including those of 10 army jawans, have been recovered.

The Indian Air Force (IAF) has already deployed Garud commandos, and bolstered the search operation with Chinook and MI 17 V5 helicopters with communication gears, fuel, medicines, and search and rescue equipment.

The helicopters are ready to transport stranded tourists and locals to safer locations when the weather conditions improve, IAF's Eastern Air Command posted on X.

Army's Trishakti Corps is carrying out operations to restore connectivity in villages in Sikkim as a defence spokesperson statement said. "The operations are focussing on restoring connectivity to north Sikkim through Chungthang,

which was the worst-affected during the devastating flood." Air evacuation of tourists has already started on Monday.

The statement added that the troops have reached the isolated village of Rabom, North West of Chungthang, and are in the process of rescuing 150-200 civilians.

All tourists and locals in the areas of Chaten, Lachen, Lachung and Thangu in North Sikkim have been accounted for, and a list of 2,000 tourists including 63 foreign nationals has been compiled. The statement also said that a log bridge over Lachen Chu connecting Chungthang to Pegong has

been completed by Army troops along with ITBP and locals. "Efforts are underway to restore OFC based communication till Lachung and Lachen after which the BTS of BSNL can start working and mobile communication will be restored in north Sikkim," the statement added.

Shah to NCDC: Set Rs 1L crore disbursement target yearly

THE NATIONAL Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) should set a target of achieving Rs 1 lakh crore yearly disbursement in the next 3 years along with targets for every quarter, Union Home Minister Amit Shah said Monday, while addressing the 89th General Council meeting of the NCDC.

As per an official statement, Shah also said that NCDC should explore avenues for borrowing at lower rates and lend to the cooperative sector at low interest rate.

"The initiatives aimed towards ease of doing business include computerization of PACS, model bye laws, widening the functioning of PACS to undertake more than 30 business activities like dairy, setting up of godowns, LPG/Petrol/Green energy distribution agency, banking correspondence, PACS can provide more than 300 services as Common Service Centres and preparation of an updated data repository of cooperatives," the statement said.

Manipur video shows man on fire; same day as stripping incident: Police

A VIDEO showing a man's body set on fire in Manipur dates back to May 4, a day after ethnic clashes broke out in the state, and is part of the same violence during which mobs stripped and sexually assaulted three Kuki-Zomi women, police have told *The Indian Express*.

The seven-second video started doing the rounds on social media and WhatsApp on the evening of October 8. It shows a man in a black shirt and camouflage print pants lying motionless outdoors, with wounds on his face and his body on fire. Voices of several people speaking in Manipuri can be heard — though their faces cannot be seen and only two pairs of legs appear in the frame — asking that no photos or videos be taken. Loud gunshot-like sounds can be heard in the background.

The incident took place under the jurisdiction of Nongpok Sekmai police station in the Meitei-dominated Thoubal district, a police official said. Police also said that an FIR had been registered in connection with the case at the time, and the victim was identified as 37-year-old Laldenthanga Khongsai, a resident of Haokhongching village in Kuki-Zomi-dominated

Kangpokpi district. On Monday, Kuldip Singh, security advisor to the Chief Minister, said that the case has been handed over to the CBI and that Khongsai's body is currently at the morgue at Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences in Imphal East.

In July, a video had surfaced showing two women from the Kuki-Zomi community being paraded naked by a mob of men and being sexually assaulted, drawing widespread outrage across the country. That incident too had taken place in Thoubal district on May 4, under the jurisdiction of Nongpok Sekmai police station. A senior Manipur police official said the video of the man being burned is from the same series of violent incidents that had gripped that region that day. Police had arrested seven people in connection with the incident of women being stripped.

Ethnic strife had gripped Manipur on May 3, starting in an area at the border of Kuki-Zomi dominated Churachandpur district and Meitei-dominated Bishnupur district and quickly spreading to other parts of the state. On May 4, a mob went on a rampage in this area of Thoubal following rumours of the rape of Meitei nurses in Churachandpur Medical College, which then DGP P Doungel had on May 5 stated

were fake. While internet services have been either completely or partially suspended in Manipur since May 3 — apart from a brief three day window between September 23 and 26 during which mobile internet services had been restored — photos and videos throwing light on crimes committed during the course of the conflict have been surfacing at regular intervals, keeping the state on the boil.

The video showing the assault of the two Kuki-Zomi women surfaced on July 18, prompting Prime Minister Narendra Modi to make a public statement on the conflict. The Opposition had also introduced a no-confidence motion against the central government in the Parliament.

On September 25, two photographs emerged that confirmed that two Meitei youngsters who had gone missing on July 6 had been killed.

The photographs set off protests in the state's Meitei-dominated valley areas, and in clashes with security forces, multiple students received serious injuries. Four people were eventually arrested in connection with the death of the two students. In both cases, it was only after the images surfaced that law enforcement authorities took action against the accused.

Uttarakhand: Day after illegal madrasa shut, CM orders inspection of all

A DAY after an illegal madrasa was shut down in Uttarakhand's Nainital district after 24 children there were allegedly found living under deplorable conditions, Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on Monday took cognizance of the incident and directed the Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Home, to immediately start an inspection all madrasas running in the state.

Dhami issued a statement that immediate legal action is to be taken wherever any "unethical work" is being carried out. The home department has issued instructions to all the District Magistrates on this matter.

On Sunday, acting on a complaint lodged by a parent of a child studying at the Nainital madrasa, a team formed by the district administration searched the premises and shut it down. The children living there were allegedly found to be living under

unhygienic conditions, with no medical facility. According to the district administration, some of the children accused the madrasa chairman's son of "misbehaving with them, touching them inappropriately, and beating them up".

Haldwani City Magistrate Richa Singh said the madrasa had been running since 2010 but was not officially registered. After the findings, an FIR was registered under relevant sections of the IPC, Juvenile Justice Act and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act against the madrasa owner and his son.

The madrasa owner denied the allegations and said they were providing good education and living conditions to the children, but some of them might have lodged complaints. "We change their beds every year, we boil the drinking water. The allegations of children being beaten up are false. We provide medical treatment to children," he said.

UP Cong launches Dalit outreach with Kanshi Ram as campaign face

THE UTTAR Pradesh unit of the Congress on Monday launched its Dalit outreach campaign — "Dalit Gaurav Samvad" — on the occasion of BSP founded Kanshi Ram's death anniversary. The nearly two-month-long campaign, which will conclude on November 26, is aimed at knowing the demands and aspirations of the Dalit community through "Dalit Adhikar Mang Patra".

The party plans to hold 4,000 night chaupals (10 in every Assembly segment), 10 yatras at the divisional level, and at least 80 big dialogues (one in each Lok Sabha constituency) as part of the campaign aimed at holding direct dialogues with at least one lakh prominent Dalit personalities.

The target of the campaign is also to distribute at least two lakh Dalit Adhikar Mang Patra in which people from the Dalit community would be asked to fill in their five

that the BSP did not do what it should have done for the Dalits. "Because of them (BSP) Kanshi Ram is being forgotten, Kanshi Ram ji was a leader of a movement and we are going to remember him at every step of this campaign" Rai said.

Kerala caregiver in Israel was on call with husband when got injured

AN INDIAN caregiver in Israel sustained injuries after an airstrike in Ashkelon, a coastal city in the southern part of the country Saturday.

Sheeja Anand, 41, a native of Kerala's Kannur district, sustained injuries when a missile hit the courtyard of the house, where she was working as a caregiver. Sheeja, who has been a caregiver over the last seven years, is out of danger, said her family members in Kannur.

Sheeja's sister Shiji said, "The incident happened when she was on a video call with her husband, Anand. During the call, she indicated that there could be an air strike. Anand cautioned

her. Suddenly, the call was disconnected with an alarming sound in the background, leaving us in a state of panic. On Sunday, her colleagues told us she was injured in the missile strike," said Shiji.

Amal Geroge, an Indian caregiver in Ashkelon over the last two years, said those in the coastal regions have only six seconds to rush into a bunker after the siren goes off. "Sheeja sustained multiple injuries from the missile strike, but had a miraculous escape. She has undergone an emergency surgery at a hospital in Ashkelon. Her employer, an elderly woman, also sustained minor injuries," he said.

Amal said sirens were repeatedly heard on Monday afternoon as missiles pounded Ashkelon, one of the most vulnerable cities.

"Although we are used to missile attacks, such a magnitude has never been seen before. What worries us are the infiltrators, who killed hundreds of people. Local employers are reassuring us that the conflict will be over in a few days," he said.

Expatriates said normal life prevailed during the earlier bouts of conflicts in recent years. But the situation is now different because of massive casualties as people remain confined to homes or have to spend hours locked inside the bunkers. In Gaza, the situation is grim on the third day. "At least 200 caregivers in Gaza are from Kerala. We were getting some distress messages from Gaza, where the military has taken control. They are facing problems of supply and communication," said Arun K, who runs a business in Tel Aviv.

India gave me birth, Israel gave me life: Udupi nurse

IT WAS around 8.30 pm in Israel on October 7 and nurse Prameela Prabhu, 41, had just finished dinner at her home in Tel Aviv-Yafo when she heard the emergency siren blaring through the night.

She immediately rushed to the bunker situated in the basement of her apartment complex. Since the violent conflict erupted between Hamas and Israel on Saturday, she has done so thrice.

A native of Udupi district in Karnataka, Prameela has been working in Israel for six years and says she has never seen the violence escalate so much.

"I live in Tel Aviv-Yafo which is the least affected in this war. However, there were



bombings on Saturday as close as one kilometre from my place. Every house, commercial and government establishment here has bunkers and you can find it in public places as well. Once the siren turns on, there will be bombings in 15-20 seconds and we will need to get into bunkers," she tells *The Indian Express* over the phone.

Israel and the Gaza strip have been reeling under incessant strikes since the militant group Hamas launched the biggest attack on the Jewish land in decades. Over 1,100 people have already been killed on both sides.

Omar: EC taking directions from BJP to delay J&K Assembly polls

A DAY after the National Conference emerged as the single largest party in the Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC) polls for Kargil, party vice-president Omar Abdullah blamed the Centre as well as the Election Commission of India for delaying J&K polls.

Referring to CEC Rajiv Kumar's statement at a press conference on Monday where he remarked J&K elections will be considered "at an appropriate time", Omar said, "It is unfortunate that even today, they are saying that they need to consider other factors. I want to ask them what are these factors? We feel that there is only one factor, which is fear." Abdullah said that the BJP was earlier hiding behind the Raj Bhawan and is now using the EC as a shield. "Instead of taking their decisions independently, the EC is taking directions from the BJP," he said.

Abdullah also questioned the state of security in J&K and said, "Since August 5, 2019 it has been projected that the situation has turned around in Kashmir. If this is true, then let us know what are the factors responsible for denying the people of J&K their democratic right to a government."

SC to hear Sharad Pawar faction's plea for action against rebels on Oct 13

DISPUTE OVER NCP NAME: EC SETS NEXT HEARING ON NOV 9

New Delhi: The Election Commission (EC) on Monday heard the claims of the Ajit Pawar-led faction of the NCP over its claim on the party's name and poll symbol, even as the Sharad Pawar-led group contended that there were discrepancies in the documents submitted by its rival.

The EC fixed November 9 as the next date for hearing the warring factions of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) led by Sharad Pawar and Ajit Pawar over their claims to the party's name and election symbol. PTI

gued that the facts of the present matter are entirely different from the Shiv Sena matter.

FACE THE CLIMATE

It's not just farmers. Businesses and economic policymakers also need to incorporate climate change into growth models

THIS YEAR HAS seen India record its warmest ever February and the driest August since time-series temperature and rainfall data became available from 1901. On top of these, rains were well above normal in March, April and May, while the southwest monsoon arrived a week late on June 8, but covered the entire country six days ahead by July 2. With three months still to go, the current year seems on course to set new benchmarks in the annals of climate change. Its effects are no longer confined to just damaging the wheat crop weeks away from harvesting or delaying the pace of kharif sowings. Climate change, according to a report in this newspaper, is now being flagged as the "single biggest business risk" by even consumer good firms. Unseasonal showers during the last summer season cramped demand for ice-cream and cold beverages as well as sales of air-conditioners and refrigerators.

For farmers, coping with the vagaries of the monsoon is a challenge probably as old as agriculture itself. But climate change isn't simply about monsoon failures. Instead, it has to do with fewer rainy days and extended dry spells, interspersed with intense precipitation and also extreme temperature deviations. While these have already become the new normal in agriculture, non-farm businesses are also beginning to feel the pinch. In the past, bad monsoons basically impacted rural incomes and, in turn, sales of tractors, two-wheelers and fast-moving consumer goods. But milder summers, shorter winters and unseasonal rains do much more, by creating less-manageable uncertainties for companies used to planning production and building stocks based on established demand patterns. They may need to rethink that framework a tad: Don't pin hopes on cola sales during the summer that may not be as hot as one would have thought. Likewise, diversify product portfolios to ensure there's always enough of something to sell through the year. If a "season" turns out good, treat it as a bonus.

It's not farmers and businesses alone. Even economic policymakers need to incorporate climate change into their growth and plan models. There has to be more investment in knowledge about all potential outcomes and probabilities of occurrences with regard to extreme weather events across sectors. Such knowledge generation, extending to breeding of temperature stress-tolerant or drought-resistant crops and timely forecasting of large storms and heat waves, is essential in a world of both adaptation and mitigation of climate change. And since climate change isn't sparing anyone, including the big FMCG players, and adaptation is something that's of more immediate interest, it makes sense to get everyone on board. Let government, industry, meteorologists, agricultural scientists and disaster management specialists together draw up a national climate adaptation strategy for India.

FIVE TO GO

Results of impending assembly polls will provide larger lessons and learnings. The stage is set

THERE IS NO established correlation between the outcomes of assembly elections and the vote for the Lok Sabha, even when the former closely precedes the latter. In 2018, for example, the Congress won three of the five states that are set to go to polls in November, but the BJP ended up doing much better in them in the subsequent general election. Yet, the results of the assembly polls — the electoral calendar for Mizoram, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh and Telangana was announced by the Election Commission Monday — will inevitably be parsed for what they say about the prospects of the major players in 2024. They will be read for the indications of which way the political winds might blow nationally.

Significantly, in three of the five states going to the polls, BJP and Congress are in a head-to-head contest. For Congress, which narrowly won MP last time (defections subsequently led to a BJP government), swept Chhattisgarh and had a comfortable win in Rajasthan in 2018, the current campaign will be judged on whether its organisational changes at the top and Rahul Gandhi's attempt at crafting a new political idiom through the Bharat Jodo Yatra translate into electoral success. After the Karnataka win, it will also be another major test for Mallikarjun Kharge's leadership — his ability to manage differences within the Congress, especially in Rajasthan where CM Ashok Gehlot has been long at loggerheads with Sachin Pilot, will be watched. The party has also doubled down on the neo-Mandal agenda: It has announced a caste census in Rajasthan and promised the same in MP and Chhattisgarh. It is still an open question whether that politics will have a resonance on the ground with the 60.2 lakh first-time voters in all five states.

The BJP in its current avatar relies overwhelmingly on the PM's popularity to win elections, often at the expense of state-level leadership. This strategy has not always yielded dividends, as in Karnataka earlier this year. In the poll-bound states now, the party is likely to draw attention to the Centre's and PM's successes and policies — G20, women's reservation Bill, increased subsidies on LPG cylinders, etc. However, the uncertainty about CM candidates may prove to be a hurdle: Vasundhara Raje has looked discontented in Rajasthan and, in MP, Shivraj Singh Chouhan is running a personality-centric campaign but has not been announced as the party's CM face. Most significantly, as the BJP locks horns with the Congress in the context of the comeback of Mandal in a new form, the polls may indicate whether and how much the OBC vote, a sizeable portion of which has been moving to the BJP, can be wooed again by members of INDIA.

DON'T FORCE FEED

Goan fish curry and rice is delicious. But making it mandatory in shacks is not the best way to popularise state's culinary heritage

THERE IS LITTLE fault to be found with the Goa government's desire to preserve and promote the state's cuisine. Goa, whose beautiful beaches, built heritage and relaxed pace of life draw visitors from all over India and the world, also has a rich and varied cuisine that deserves greater attention. Yet, the announcement by Goa's tourism minister Rohan Khaunte, that it is now mandatory for beach shacks to display and serve the state's staple meal of fish curry and rice, brings up a question: Are the menus of these shacks really the government's business?

It is true that Goa's cuisine, drawing as much from the abundance of the seas as the wealth of its land, has long been ignored by visitors. Many native Goan dishes, from the decadent bebinca and dodol to spicy vindalho and xacuti, are deservedly cherished by locals and sought after by discerning foodies from outside. But by and large, the tourists who hop from shack to shack remain ignorant of them or are just plain uninterested. The mish-mash of sizzler-pasta-fries-dal fry that most shacks serve caters to this crowd. But there is little guarantee that a mandatory fish curry-rice meal on the menus of these shacks — patronised not so much for any scintillating dining experience but for their proximity to the sea — will increase the visibility of the state's cuisine.

Examples from around the world show how this can be done without resorting to fiats — Copenhagen was successfully promoted as the centre of a "new Nordic cuisine" by encouraging restaurants to focus on local ingredients and contemporary renditions of traditional dishes. Peru, with its tourism campaign "Peru Mucho Gusto" (Peru, full of flavour), funded cookbooks and festivals that drew attention to its culinary heritage. Goan food is delicious, but making it mandatory for businesses to serve it will only leave a bad taste in the mouth.

A straw in the whirlwind

There is a way out. Hamas attack also presents an opportunity to revive the Arab Peace Initiative

THE OCTOBER 7 attack in Israel by Hamas spells a major defeat for Israel as well as for the efforts at normalisation and peace in the region. For Israel, the failure involves poor intelligence and inadequate military preparedness. More importantly, the country's reputation of military invincibility has been shattered. Israel is now resorting to a massive attack on Gaza to try to restore the deterrence it once enjoyed, yet it is far from certain that it can accomplish this even if Gaza is destroyed and re-occupied.

Furthermore, it is hard to see how Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu will survive politically given the loss of civilian Israeli lives and the large number of Israeli hostages now in Hamas's hands. Of course, the Palestinians are also losers in that this attack is not going to get them any closer to establishing their state or to lead to the destruction of Israel, which is Hamas's aim. What will happen instead is that more misery and violence will be heaped on the Palestinians in retaliation by Israel. Thus, the circle of violence continues unabated, and with greater ferocity in the Middle East, and with no winners on any side. But why did this attack happen now and what were its intended goals?

There are two immediate reasons why these attacks took place. First, Hamas has been competing with the Palestinian Authority (PA) for the leadership of the Palestinian cause and the success of these attacks is one way to achieve this. The PA is the official government of the Palestinians that signed the Oslo Peace Accords with Israel, which never resulted in the promised Palestinian state.

Furthermore, the PA is riddled with corruption and misgovernance, and because it has restricted Palestinian resistance to occupation it is seen as complicit with Israel and,

therefore, has lost much of its legitimacy. Whatever the fate of Hamas in Gaza, there is no question now that it leads the Palestinian effort of liberation and self-determination. The second reason is the effort by Hamas, and with Iran's support and guidance, to end the process of normalisation between Israel and the Gulf Arab states, especially with Saudi Arabia.

Recently, under President Joe Biden's stewardship, the Saudis and Israelis were in the process of negotiating a peace agreement. Had this been accomplished, this would have created a new alliance between the Gulf states and Israel against Iran's "axis of resistance" to Israel and American power in the region. With these attacks, and the likely devastating reprisal by Israel against Palestinians, it is unlikely that any peace agreement can be reached soon. The Saudi government will find it very difficult to make peace with a country that is pummeling an Arab population that is widely viewed among fellow Arabs as having been denied its rights and living under brutal Israeli occupation.

What all this spells, for the moment at least, is the victory of Iran and Hamas's vision of violent resistance as opposed to that of the Saudis and Emiratis, which has emphasised peace, stability and prosperity. Yet, both visions are flawed because they are each blind to an obvious reality. On the one hand, the eliminationist objective of Iran and Hamas, which is the destruction of the state of Israel, is never going to be achieved for the simple reason that Israel is too strong and is backed by all Western nations, especially the US. Note the unconditional support that America has offered in response to the attack. On the other hand, the Arab Gulf approach has not sufficiently emphasised, indeed insisted, on the creation of a viable Palestinian state as a necessary condition for a lasting peace.

viable Palestinian state as a necessary condition for a lasting peace. So long as the Palestinians live and suffer under Israeli occupation and are denied their right to self-determination, there cannot be peace. There will be spoilers, such as Iran and Hamas, who will make sure of this, as we are now witnessing.

Saudi Arabia, under the late King Abdullah, made an offer to Israel in 2002 in the name of all Arab states, which is called the Arab Peace Initiative. This offer can be the only basis for a lasting peace between Israelis and Palestinians and will require the creation of a Palestinian state on the lands Israel occupied in the Six-Day War of 1967. In return, Israel would be fully recognised and accepted. It is the rejection by Israel of this offer, especially by its present right-wing government with its annexationist aims over all the land, that has aggravated the situation and prevented a resolution of this conflict.

While understandable, the violent retaliation by Israel against Hamas in Gaza will not help resolve matters but rather it will only worsen the situation and play into the hands of the spoilers on all sides of this conflict. Cooler heads must prevail and think of the long term. This attack presents an opportunity that can be seized by the Biden administration, Saudi Arabia and the more centrist politicians in Israel. And this is to revive the Arab Peace Initiative because only by creating a Palestinian state can there be the hope of seeing this conflict end, peace prevailing, and the efforts of violent spoilers thwarted. Without this, you can be sure that there will be many more rounds of violent confrontation after this one ends.

Women's reservation bill is marred by the delay inscribed in its design

"**GOD HAS** given me the opportunity" said the Prime Minister as the women reservation Bill was tabled in the Lok Sabha on the second day of the five-day special session of Parliament. Truth be told, God had given him this "opportunity" in 2014. It was part of the Party's manifesto and it has existed for nine years. So was it about empowering women or does it have to do more with the upcoming general elections? The answer is as obvious as daylight.

Putting even the delay and intent aside, there is still a caveat to the Act. It cannot be enforced until and unless a new Census and the delimitation process is undertaken.

The issue of women's reservation is a long awaited one. There are only 78 women members in the Lok Sabha who account for less than 15 per cent of the total strength. Women account for only 14 per cent of Rajya Sabha members. Their representation is worse in the state legislative assemblies — only 9 per cent of the total number of members on average. The National Policy for Empowerment of Women (2001) had stated that reservation will be considered in higher legislative bodies.

The journey of women's reservation and increased representation in Parliament and state assemblies began in 1996. In Manmohan Singh's tenure in 2010, it did pass in the Rajya Sabha but could not in the Lok Sabha. Since then, the promise to India's women has not been kept, including in the current form that it has been cleared. The 73rd and 74th Constitutional Amendment Acts which institutionalised grass-root level democracy provided for women reserva-

tion. These Constitutional Amendment Acts were tabled in the Parliament in 1992 and came into effect a few months after their introduction.

The current version doesn't have a clear time frame for its implementation. In this case, it depends on two factors, that is, the Census and delimitation. Just to reiterate, the Bill could have been made immediately implementable like the 73rd and 74th amendment was done within six months and without linking it to Census and delimitation. So this amendment becomes, perhaps, the only one to be passed, but whose implementation is left for a future undecided date.

The last Census was held in 2011. The Union government attributed the Covid-19 pandemic for postponing the exercise and the last two notifications by the Registrar General of India did not mention any reason. Even if the Census process is carried out, the delimitation exercise could end up being a tussle between the Union and the southern states. As per a research paper (India's emerging crisis of Representation) after the 2026 delimitation, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh will have a total of 222 MPs, while the four south Indian states will have a combined representation of 165 in the Lok Sabha.

The current variant differs from its 2008 version in some ways: Ignorance of "intra-state women representation" and reserved seats to be rotated after every delimitation exercise. The 2008 bill mandated that one-third of Lok Sabha seats in each state/UT should be reserved for women. However,

the current bill does not provide any such "intra-state" reservation.

The rotation of reserved seats will happen after every delimitation exercise, according to the current Act. It takes nearly four to five years for the delimitation commission to issue its report after its commencement. The government hasn't clarified what will be the status of women's reservation when the delimitation exercise is on-going.

The issue of women's reservation had come up in Constituent Assembly debates as well. But it was rejected as being unnecessary. For instance, in 1947, noted freedom fighter Renuka Ray said, "We always held that when the men who have fought and struggled for their country's freedom came to power, the rights and liberties of women too would be guaranteed." However, in the following decades, it became clear that this was not to be the case. As a consequence, women's reservation became a recurrent theme in policy debates. For instance, the Committee of the Status of Women in India, set up in 1971, commented on the declining political representation of women in India.

A country that gave equal rights and opportunities for representation to all its citizens when the Constitution came into effect, unlike the women of the West who had to fight for their voting rights, is now having to constantly push the idea of women's representation to a later date. This is a blot on the ideas of our visionary founders.

betrayed no emotion and showed no fear as death came. "Forgive us if we have made mistakes," they said moments before they were hanged. They asked for no last-minute indulgences.

Place the child at the centre

Law Commission recommendations on age of consent sidestep key question of how to protect the young from sexual abuse, while ensuring they are not punished for consensual sexual activity with peers

THE 283RD REPORT of the Law Commission of India (LCI), which has advised against tinkering with the existing age of consent under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, is a lost opportunity. The judicial references called for reviewing the criteria for the age of consent to sexual activity, to mitigate the “gross injustice in cases of statutory rape where de facto consent is present”. The increase in the age of consent from 16 to 18 years with the enactment of the POCSO ACT, 2012, has magnified the volume of prosecutions against adolescents engaged in non-coercive consensual sexual activity with devastating outcomes, primarily for adolescents and youth from marginalised populations.

POCSO and equivalent provisions of the Indian Penal Code impose a mandatory minimum sentence of 10 years for statutory rape without regard to whether the minors, including those between 16-18, consent. The reference in *Veekesh Kalawat vs State of Madhya Pradesh* (2023), wherein a minor girl had eloped with a boy, married him and had a child, notes that a mandatory minimum sentence of 10 years for husbands results in, “... disrupting and devastating families in rural Madhya Pradesh by sending the sole breadwinner in the family to jail.... leaving his wife and children to the vagaries of social exploitation if the parents and the in-laws of the prosecutrix/ wife are not willing to keep her.”

The LCI report traces the historical origins of the age of consent in law, through to the contentious positions relating to POCSO. Positions are divided between retaining the age of consent at 16 with close-in-age exceptions for consensual sexual activity between peers, as against a blunt increase in the age of consent to 18, which was adopted by POCSO. The report outlines approaches adopted in the US, Canada, Japan, Australia and South Africa, all of which have lower ages of consent and additionally, protect adolescents from shame and stigma for consensual sexual activity through close-in-age exceptions. Its stakeholder consultations were limited, missing inputs from public health experts, gynaecologists, child psychologists, counsellors, and shelter homes, who, as first responders, offer valuable insights.

The LCI recommendations favour retaining the age of consent at 18 years, to criminalise both abuse and non-coercive consensual sex, even when this occurs between peers. By way of mitigation, it recommends judicial discretion to award less than the mandatory minimum sentence of 10 years and provides guidelines for determining types of cases that are befitting of sentence reduction.

The proposed mitigation is flawed on three counts.

First, the “close-in age” exception operates at the sentencing stage, so consensual sexual activity with a minor between 16 and 18, even where the accused is not more than three years apart, remains an offence. Had this exception been available as a defence, the accused might have had a chance of acquittal. Further, the exception

allows sentence reduction, not sentence waiver, so the taint of criminalisation and incarceration remains.

Second, a new term, “tacit approval”, is introduced to replace “consent”. Consent is defined in law, backed by jurisprudence. Consent to medical examination is recognised for victims of sexual assault who are 12 years and above in the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare guidelines. The judicial reference to the LCI was also about consensual sex, so the use of “tacit approval”, without so much as a definition, is confusing.

Third, a checklist of circumstances to guide whether or not exemption operates is provided. However, this is not limited to exploitative and coercive situations but also includes caveats that there be “no change in the social or cultural background of the child, indicating an element of manipulation or indoctrination,” which are likely references to inter-faith and inter-caste relations. Additional circumstances listed include pregnancy, marital status and family acceptance; good behaviour and absence of criminal antecedents. Together, these could be read to suggest that judicial discretion is guided in favour of underage sexual relations which are not just close-in age, but rather, those that occur within socially conforming marriages backed by familial support.

Protecting the young from sexual abuse is of universal concern, which POCSO aims to serve. Equally important is the task of protecting the young from being shamed, punished and incarcerated for exploring what is developmentally appropriate for their age. This is at the heart of the reference that LCI was to address.

The onset of puberty at 10-11 years brings with it the biological, psychological and emotional stirrings of sexuality, the desire to learn and explore. Early marriage is

a socially sanctioned response to containing the sexuality of girls within marriage to serve the socio-cultural order. The growing consensus against early marriage has resulted in it being replaced by abstinence through the fear of criminalisation. The Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC) does speak to this conflict. It places the child at the centre while recognising that persons under 18 years need differential protection corresponding to their evolving capacities, which refers to the process of “maturation and learning” through which the child progressively develops her competencies. Accordingly, CRC General Comment 20 calls for age-appropriate sexuality education, access to confidential medical counselling, and prohibits laws from criminalising consensual sexual activity with peers.

The data in India shows that criminalisation selectively strikes at the poor and the marginalised, with devastating consequences for girls. To quote *Veekesh Kalawat* (2023), “Where the prosecutrix is unemployed as is mostly the case, the options for survival are dismal, ranging from prostitution to crime. The State has no obligation under the POCSO to provide for the basic minimum required for the survival of the so-called ‘survivor’”. In other words, far from protection, criminalisation renders girls vulnerable to greater violations, and if protection is paramount, it is best secured through social security measures.

With the LCI sidestepping these issues, the matter rests with the courts to address, with sensitivity on a case-to-case basis, and the continuation of public dialogue.

Games we play

Hangzhou has shown that there are more engaging sporting storylines for India than cricket’s personality cults and franchise frictions

THE Juxtaposition was too obvious to ignore. The empty seats at Ahmedabad for the World Cup opener between England and New Zealand had the Indians making excuses about it being on a working day. Two days later, Indian shuttler Satwiksairaj Rankireddy threw his racquet into the brimming Hangzhou stands where neutral Chinese spectators scrambled to catch it after he won the Asian Games gold medal, beating Koreans.

Foreign cricketers accustomed to ceaseless adoration and full IPL stands are about to find out that Indians might no longer be as emotionally invested in non-India ODI matches as even 12 years ago, when the Subcontinent last hosted the Cup. Or, to find out that India’s affection for cricket — taken for granted all these years — might be diverted to other sports spotlighted by the Asiad that happened to roll to a close just before the World Cup fetched up.

In Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty, in Neeraj Chopra and Kishore Jena, in Sift Kaur and Ayhika Mukherjee and Sutirtha Mukherjee or in Ancy Sojan, Jyothi Surekha Vennam and Aditi Gopichand, Indians are discovering athletes across sports, whose struggles and efforts to succeed make compelling viewing.

In a world where OTT entertainment has disrupted the notions of one nation, one programming, and fragmented the sporting fan base even more, the most common excuse reeled out after Ahmedabad’s empty seats was what the non-cricketing world has been wondering forever — why does an entire country waste entire days, or seven hours at least, to watch one long match.

There simply are more engaging sporting storylines out there in Olympic sport than what this team with the tiresome Rohit-Virat intrigue, social-media toxicity surrounding every selection and IPL rivalries, offers. Chatter on Olympic disciplines is about camaraderie, and nation-unifying moments; the national cricket team, sadly, is riven by cult personalities and franchise frictions. The bizarre hate directed towards KL Rahul, singling him out after every inning, didn’t make cricket very endearing in the lead-up.

Chopra standing up for Jena who was wrongly fouled by officials, steering the Odisha newbie through the whole journey to silver, while duelling him to win gold himself with \$8.88m lit up the javelin competition for Indians. In a fiercely individual sport with his Olympic champ reputation to guard, Chopra still competed like a teammate and took Jena along for a memorable 1-2 on the podium. India’s 4x400 relay team of Muhammad Anas, Amod Jacob, Muhammed Ajmal and Rajesh Ramesh held the nation’s attention, hoping for another sub-three minute mark like the World Championships and a happy goal.

Every arrow sequence of 10s and 9s in archery team events was a crest and trough

of emotion, and you couldn’t peel your eyes away from the Indian Eight in rowing and the men’s badminton team and slumped in disappointment when they were second-bested by China’s all marauding force. It wasn’t about always winning gold and hence it might not be solely about Rohit Sharma lifting the World Cup — a Rohit-Virat partnership in a united team is what India would love to see cricket throw up.

It is more about the whole of India living those moments of sinewy effort with the athletes, getting behind a united team, and feeling their glumness and glee no matter what the result. The nation’s moods swung along ODI cricket scores once upon a time in the 1990s when cricket wasn’t even winning much. Now, the whole of India rages when Jyothi Yarraji is unfairly pulled aside for a false start, when Chopra’s first throw disappears into a void of Chinese incompetence or the boxers are handed eye-popping unfair decisions. Millions were glued to screens as Abhay Singh came from 8-10 matchball down, to pip Pakistan to the squash team for gold.

Indian hockey has had to prop up its basic benchmarks — nothing less than an Asiad gold — and Indian kabaddi is tasked with beating Iran and questioned on its sit-in protest, as the country demands top standards of behaviour.

There is exhilaration in the air when Parul Chaudhary comes from the left lane with long strides to go past the Japanese leader over the last 50m in the 5000m race. Or, when HS Prannoy endures a bad back, saving two match points, to beat Malaysian Lee Zii Jia for a precious bronze to dissolve into a tearful Gopichand’s hug. There is genuine pride and joyous disbelief when Ayhika and Sutirtha defeat the Chinese at TT to briefly silence a stadium. And a quiet, fingers-crossed acknowledgement that India’s teenaged and early 20s shooters are hot on Chinese heels, stealing away some precision golds. With her infectious energy, Sojan takes the whole country along to win silver, but it is the sight of her thumping Shaali Singh’s back in encouragement before the youngster takes off on that lonely, individual leap that feels like a team effort.

The hard-to-impress Chinese crowd, cold and hostile even, was finally won over by the exuberance and superior skills of Rankireddy and Shetty as India won its first Asiad gold in shuttle. They applauded the dancing duo, and jumped for the flung racquets. This is 14 years after Rankireddy’s father R Kasi Viswanath had been in Hyderabad’s stands for the 2009 World Championships and leapt the highest to catch Chinese doubles legend Fu Haifeng’s racquet after a World title.

India’s team, doubles and javelin golds where one Indian hauled up another’s performance, towards excellence, were precious memories of these Asian Games. Indians are suckers for a Lee-Hesh chest-bump, and sport’s enduring memories are sniffily sentimental moments, not stats about medals.

The national cricket team will have to do more than just win the World Cup if they want to stake a claim on India’s hearts. For they aren’t the only Indian team in town now, monopolising the country’s affection.

The shield J&K needs

We need greater vigilance, stronger security infrastructure, not jingoism

THE NATION CONTINUES to mourn the killing of the brave uniformed forces officers in an encounter with two Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) terrorists near a village in Anantnag district of South Kashmir in the second week of September. According to reports, the joint contingent of the Army and police was in hot pursuit of terrorists in a deep forest area on a cliff when they were ambushed/trapped by their assailants. The search operation for the LeT terrorists was apparently launched based on intelligence input. Since it was a joint operation of the Army and police, it’s not known who provided this input.

Having dealt with militancy on the ground in Kashmir and remotely from Delhi for a Central Intelligence Agency and MHA for almost a decade, I have a fair idea of the challenges of conducting anti-terrorist operations in deep forest mountainous terrains. Two kinds of intelligence inputs guide counter-terrorist operations on the ground — human intelligence and technical intelligence (humint and techint). Techint is further subdivided into communication (comint) and image intelligence (imint). While humint inputs need to be analysed very cautiously before being acted upon, techint inputs are more reliable and precise. We are not sure what intelligence input prompted the Indian Army-police contin-

gent to get on the trail of the two LeT terrorists. My guess is that it was humint.

Army units deployed in the Kashmir Valley have limited access to reliable humint for obvious reasons. They come from different regions and lack knowledge of the local language, ethos and terrain. The local police — the civil thanas and state police special branch (CID) — is better placed. In a terrain like Kashmir, it’s not easy to raise reliable human intelligence assets. There is a risk of the sources playing a double role to serve their masters from across the borders. Money and religion have key roles.

It’s for the Army commanders to lead from the front in a war situation. But in counter-terrorist operations, it is wiser to divide the force and use smaller contingents for the commander to keep watch from a safe distance. It is also not clear whether the Army officers and policemen were shielded by bulletproof vests. The Army, I am sure, will conduct an enquiry. All this is not meant to belittle the courage shown by the Army Battalion Commander. I salute the valour of the officers who laid down their lives to defend our integrity.

Let us turn to another vital aspect of terrorist violence in J&K. It is being driven, guided and financed from across the borders by the Pakistan Army and ISI at very little cost. They have struck very bold at-

tacks in the past not only in J&K, but also in the rest of the country, including Parliament and the commercial capital, Mumbai. They are known to motivate, train and infiltrate suicide squads with the help of espionage networks hiding in our country. They also pay these suicide squads handsomely. The Pakistan army and government are today under tremendous pressure because of the perilous state of the country’s economy which is being sustained by the IMF and Chinese loans.

While I share the anguish of fellow countrymen over this tragedy, I do not subscribe to the jingoistic calls to stop playing against the Pakistani cricket team. Sports should be kept away from our animosity against the Pakistani army and government. I am also not an advocate of launching air and naval attacks on Pakistan. Remotely guided rockets launching unmanned air vehicles (UAVs) is an option worth considering when LeT strikes inside our territory.

America seems to be looking the India way in the recent past. This has forced the Pakistani dispensation to turn to China. It would, however, be neither prudent nor realistic to look to foreign powers to resolve our national and internal security challenges. It would also be naïve to believe that Pakistan will give up militancy in J&K and restore peace if we talk with them. We must

strengthen our security infrastructure.

Pak ISI sleeper cells spread all over our country must be detected and neutralised. This is easier said than done, but patience and perseverance should be the name of this game. We must also deradicalise sections of the Muslim youth by releasing them from the stranglehold of mullahs in madrasas and mosques and providing them access to schooling. This could be a time-consuming exercise, but we must make a beginning and no better place to start than the Kashmir Valley where the Peer Muridi (Sufi) form of Islam has been buried under the weight of the Wahabi sect financed from overseas.

We must remain vigilant against such terrorist strikes in J&K and try our best to win the hearts and trust of the Kashmiri Muslims who stand to gain from expanding their businesses because of the increased tourist inflow into the Kashmir Valley. We must make them realise that the Pakistan-sponsored terrorist violence in their home ground is costing them dearly. We should offer more career options outside Jammu and Kashmir for Kashmiri Muslim youth willing to leave their homes to earn livelihoods.

ARKHIPOV’S FEAT

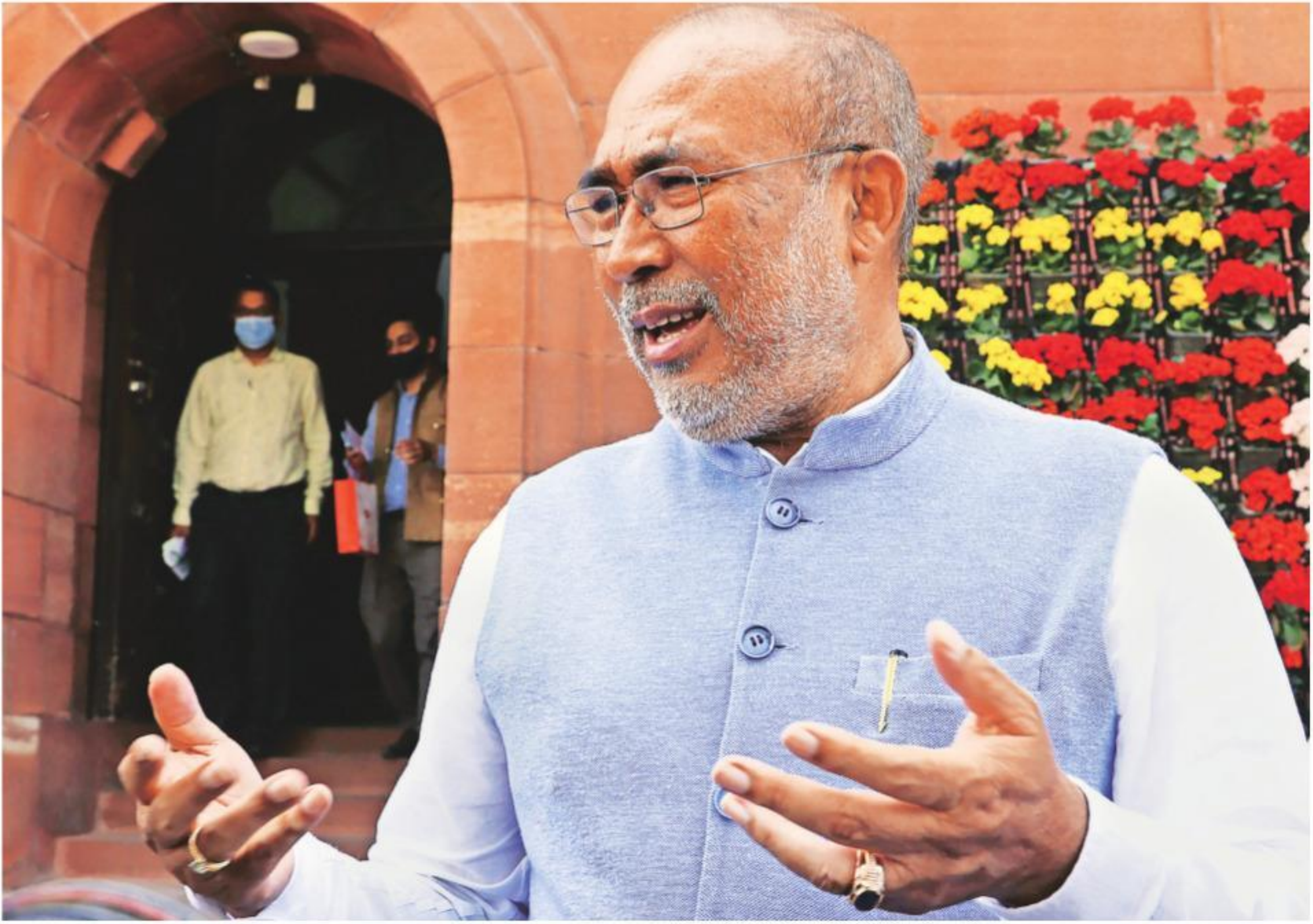

What is the message you have received from the Prime Minister and Home Minister?

For the last three to four months... morning, night, 12 o'clock, 1 o'clock... I have been constantly in touch with the Griha Mantriji (Home Minister). *Ek mere ko confidence diya hai Griha Mantriji ne, ki himmat nahin harna aur himmat se ladna* (The Home Minister has given me the confidence to never give up and continue fighting with courage). These words have helped me feel reborn again. Sometimes I was so frustrated, but Griha Mantriji always reassured me. The Honourable PM always tells me, *khyal rakhna, sabka khyal rakhna, achchi tarah se shanti jaldi laane ka koshish karo* (Take care of everyone and try to bring peace back as soon as possible).

Recently, a mob tried to storm your residence. Do you think you still enjoy the support of your constituents?

In Manipur, there are many reputable civil society organisations... that represent different communities... none of these were involved (in the incident). A newly formed group was behind it. Also, the mob couldn't even get near my house because my constituents didn't allow them. Moreover, most of the youths arrested that night belong to areas dominated by the Opposition...

In an earlier interview to *The Indian Express*, you claimed improved relationship between security forces and the public, and decreased concerns about AFSPA. Have these gains been eroded?

We have more insurgent groups engaged in talks... the Home Minister has already initiated this process. Some insurgents are in discussions, and we expect resolutions soon. Additionally, more groups are transitioning to mainstream dialogue.

What was your reaction to the video of two tribal women being paraded naked?

I was really shocked... However, I must commend the people of Manipur for their response. The two women, whose uncle and nephew were killed, were rescued by members of the same community to which the culprits belonged. While I condemn the actions of the eight individuals involved in this unlawful act, I also appreciate those who stepped in to save the victims... helped them get dressed, and sent them back home. Following the incident, it was not the police that raided the culprits' homes, but the Meitei community that mobilised and handed over the culprits to the authorities. Some of their houses were also burned down. This event is deeply unsettling for all right-thinking individuals.

You haven't met with the families of the victims. Why are there no such healing overtures on your part?

I wanted to go and console the Kuki families, but... the situation was tense, and I felt that I was being targeted and blamed by the Kukis. I'm not sure why, and I believe that ultimately it's up to God to determine who was right and wrong. However, because I didn't visit the Kuki families, I also refrained from visiting the families of the Meitei victims. I was concerned that people might perceive it as a biased gesture... *ki dekho Meitei hai isiliye Meitei ke pass jaa raha hai* (See, he's visiting Meiteis cause he's a Meitei himself)... I am facing this dilemma, which is the most challenging part for me. But I have visited relief camps of both the communities.

How would you address the concerns of the Kukis regarding your government?

You can see this in my working style. I had a principal secretary till recently, Vumlungm Vualnam, who is a Kuki one of my closest associates. I have a person in my team from the same community, Christopher Doungel, who continues to work with me. He (Doungel) is part of all our *andar ka* (internal) talks. My government recognised the 'Kuki Rising Day' to commemorate their fight with the British and I made it a gazetted holiday. I also recognised the Hun Festival and announced a holiday for it... That's why I am saying that all Manipuri Kukis love me and trust me. It's the outsiders who are threatened by my actions and are worried that they will be identified through biometric and sent back. They are ones creating a rift.

MANIPUR CHIEF Minister N BIREN SINGH spent Friday morning inaugurating a driving institute in Imphal (East), and attending the groundbreaking ceremonies of a water body and a sewage plant in Imphal (West). Later in the day, he sat down with **RTIKA CHOPRA, Chief of National Bureau (Government)**, at his Imphal office for an exclusive interview. Over the next 80 minutes, he claimed that he hadn't lost the trust of the Kukis, and accused "illegal immigrants" threatened by his "war on drugs" for exploiting "vulnerabilities" of the Meiteis to fuel unrest.

It's been five months since the violence broke out. What are your plans for reconciliation and peace?

My top priority is initiating dialogue with all the affected communities, including the Meiteis and Kukis. I have already started (conversations) through some (informal) channels... We have started the process of resettling displaced individuals and constructing prefabricated houses in both hill and valley regions. Plans are in place to rebuild damaged houses. Fortunately, in the past month, we have witnessed a decrease in hostilities. The recent video involving two missing students stirred emotions, but swift action has helped ease tensions.

Has the dialogue process started too late?

The dialogue process was initiated three months ago. We formed a (peace) committee composed of legislators, led by Hill Area Committee Chairman and MLA Dipu Gangmei. This committee started working, but internally and quietly, because the situation was not conducive at the time.

What is the one thing keeping you up at night?

I want my people to feel confident and secure again. Right now they feel unsafe... I appreciate my leaders in Delhi for treating Manipur's issue as a national issue. And I am conveying that to the people.

My goal is to restore normalcy in Manipur. Over the last six years, we have made significant progress in terms of tourism and the economy. We even hosted the Miss India pageant (shortly before the recent violence). Many businessmen started investing, and we had no disruptions like strikes, blockades, or killings, prevalent earlier.

Given Manipur's history of ethnic conflicts, how is the current situation different?

The current situation isn't a dispute between two communities. It is very clear from the report of the NIA, the highest investigative agency of our country, that there is a hand of external forces. The present crisis should have settled if it wasn't for their meddling.

See, this fight is actually between the government and the drug mafia. The government's actions were not directed at the original Kukis or ordinary citizens; our focus was on identifying and addressing illegal immigrants involved in poppy cultivation and drug smuggling. The drug mafia's true target was the government, but they couldn't succeed. Instead, they exploited the vulnerabilities of sections, such as the Meiteis in peripheral areas, to create unrest.

But the HC's order on ST status for the Meiteis clearly triggered the violence.

That is the point that I'd like to clarify. What people might not be aware of is that the High Court simply asked the government for its opinion; it did not instruct us to take any immediate action. We had the option... which could have been a 'yes' or 'no'. We had not submitted our opinion... So how can it be the point of the unrest? (The single-bench order of the Manipur High Court is currently being heard before a division bench. Additionally, a review petition is pending before the judge who passed the order.)

So what do you see as the trigger for the May 3 violence?

Manipur faces severe drug-related challenges, with 1.5 lakh drug users among a population of just three million (30 lakh). Around 90% of our state is hilly terrain, with 60% of the forests in hills being destroyed for poppy cultivation... We have even found drug factories in the hills and the valley. During my first term, I initiated a war on drugs, leading to the arrest of drug

lords, curbing of forest destruction, and action against village chiefs and drug smugglers. In 2022, we secured a majority, resumed our efforts...

We realised that most of the drugs and poppy cultivation was linked to the Golden Triangle region of Myanmar, Thailand, and Laos... While original Kukis and Naga (inhabitants of the state) are innocent... the outsiders involved in this trade had to go.

Over the last 15 years, 926 new villages emerged, primarily in Kuki-dominated areas like Churachandpur, Chandel and Kangpokpi... There was no such increase in the Naga-dominated and Meitei-Pangal dominated areas. This raised questions... With the guidance of Honourable Home Minister Amit Shahji, we formed a committee to identify illegal immigrants from Myanmar... led by Cabinet Minister Letpao Haokip, who is a Kuki friend. It also had one Naga Minister, Awangbow Newmai, and one from the Meitei community (Thounaojam Basanta Singh). In a week, the committee identified 2,480 illegal immigrants, who are now in detention centres. We also warned people against sheltering illegal immigrants. I feel these events led to the current crisis.

Did the state machinery fail to anticipate the violence?

No, I could smell something (was wrong). On April 27, I was supposed to inaugurate an open gym, but it was burned by miscreants. Right from that day, I had doubts... and I asked the DGP to take care. When I was informed about the (tribal solidarity) rally (of May 3), I inquired about its pur-

pose, and I was told it had to do with the High Court order. I was surprised since the state government had not recommended anything. At that time, the Hill Areas Committee members, all 20 MLAs, met me. They requested that I not recommend anything. I assured that we could even ask for more time from the court.

Why could the state machinery not control the violence then?

That was a surprise (to me). Throughout the day, Governor Madam (Anusuya Uike) and I were with the Vice President (Jagdeep Dhankhar), who was visiting. I didn't know what happened or didn't. I don't want to criticise... but for the day of the rally, I had requested security for all vulnerable districts. I later found out that the DGP did not provide adequate security in the Churachandpur district. He provided security in Kangpokpi and Noney districts. In Noney, the Kuki community is not even present. This will come out in investigation. I don't want to say more. (The Ministry of Home Affairs has set up a three-member commission headed by retired judge Ajai Lamba to probe the ethnic strife.)

You speak of illegal immigrants... Are they in such numbers that they can threaten to destabilise the state?

That is the biggest challenge. It represents the biggest failure of previous governments. Our 398-km border with Myanmar is unguarded, whereas our borders with Bangladesh, Nepal and Pakistan are fenced... Furthermore, we have implemented a Free Movement Regime (allowing tribes living along the border on either side to travel up to

16 km inside the other country without a visa). How will indigenous people survive? More than 3-4 lakh (immigrants) have entered.

Are these official figures?

No, but I have data to show how these new villages are coming up annually. Our border is not guarded. Assam Rifles is there but within 12 km of our border with Myanmar. It's only after the BJP came to power that we started fencing 10 km of our border with Myanmar. We now have approval for another 80 km.

But the Free Movement Regime was significant for cross-border people-to-people relationships, and also for livelihoods.

The Free Movement Regime should not have happened. Those individuals belong to another country... Who will keep track if they have gone back or settled here? Who will send them back?... Perhaps they could hold cards that they surrender upon entering and collect when they go back. There is currently no such system.

Isn't the appointment of IPS Rajiv Singh and former CRPF chief Kuldip Singh, along with the extended visits of Central ministers, a sign of the Centre's loss of confidence in the state government?

No, that is not an accurate perception. The Centre has full confidence in both the state government and me. However, the situation is viewed as a conflict between two communities, and I belong to one of those communities. If I continue and I hold the same powers... then it may be seen as an imbalance. To avoid

any perception of imbalance, the Centre may have appointed a security advisor, a new DG, and others... If the Centre did not trust me, then they always have other options.

If the Centre trusts you, should the CM not have control over the Unified Command?

That's exactly what I've clarified. As a Meitei, if I were to hold the (unified) command, it could be perceived as an imbalance. There's no bias in my heart or in my work, nor in the Centre's thinking, but people might still misinterpret it... That's how the Honourable Union Home Minister is dealing (with our issues)... *Balance dikhana hai... Meiteis our Kukis ko same tarah se deal karna hai* (We should show balance in our dealings with the Meiteis and Kukis). That's the message the Centre is trying to convey.

You are often compared to your counterpart in Mizoram, and seen as acting on behalf of the Centre rather than asserting your state's autonomy...

When the party's leadership makes a decision after careful consideration... it is my duty to obey... I have received so much condemnation, but I bear it because we can't spell out everything to the public... *Pehli baar hum gaali khaya hai, hum maanta hai* (I acknowledge that for the first time, I have been criticised a lot). I am aware of the good intentions of the Centre... Slowly, people are also realising this.

You said in the past that you would resign if asked to by the Central leadership.

As Bihar caste survey adds spring to Oppn step, can BJP led by Modi keep ahead?

Women's reservation Act hasn't given the party the boost it expected, with Bihar caste survey overtaking it. Now, PM has taken charge of the counter-attack

PRIME MINISTER Narendra Modi often says that he makes "stairs out of stones thrown at me", and his opponents need not be reminded of his astuteness in turning any attack or criticism to his advantage. He has done it now with Rahul Gandhi's "jiti aabadi, utna haq" phrase to attack the demand for caste census.

Even as the BJP is pointing to the number of Muslim groups within the EBC category in the Bihar caste survey report, which was released recently, the PM has used Rahul's phrase - first raised in the Karnataka elections - to suggest that it is the Congress leader who is being communal.

"jiti aabadi, utna haq" means that the Muslims as a minority would be deprived, Modi said at a recent rally in Chhattisgarh. He

went on to draw a contrast with what Congress leader former PM Manmohan Singh had said in a 2006 speech about minorities having "the first right to resources".

At a rally later the same day in Telangana, Modi used Rahul's phrase to suggest that the Congress didn't care enough for the South as the BJP's public posturing that the "Modi phenomenon" could lose 100 (Lok Sabha) constituencies. The prospect of that is one of the biggest concerns of the southern states.

The PM added that, for him, the "poor" were the only caste and their welfare his government's primary motive.

The PM's refrain suggests that the BJP is worried about the Bihar caste survey, and how it might help a united Opposition take away its backward class votes. This is contrary to the BJP's public posturing that the "Modi phenomenon", bringing multiple regional identities together under the PM's strong leadership, will

transcend caste and class lines again in 2024.

The caste survey held by the Mahagathbandhan government led by Nitish Kumar in Bihar puts OBC numbers at 63% of the state's population, with 36% being EBCs. This upends the various social engineering formulas worked into a successful political message by the BJP, as well as other parties, especially in Bihar and Uttar Pradesh.

For now, the INDIA bloc has not been able to find a language to take on Modi's new line of attack, though they have stuck to the caste census demand. Asked about the PM's statement that the South could lose 100 seats in the Lok Sabha post-delimitation, JD(U) national president Rajiv Ranjan Singh was evasive. "Why will there be any loss? Several southern states have been supporting the caste census. They have not opposed the delimitation process either. Besides,

will the BJP remain in power to even complete the delimitation process? Let the time come, everything will be solved," Singh said at an Idea Exchange session with *The Indian Express*.

There is some talk that the BJP might still put a rabbit out of the hat for that extra "push".

The hype generated by the sudden convening of the special session of Parliament - days after the Monsoon Session had ended - and the quick passage of the women's reservation Bill has been overtaken by the Nitish government's demand for an OBC quota within the quota for women has also dovetailed nicely with the Bihar caste survey. The fact that women's reservation will not come into force anytime soon has dulled enthusiasm too.

BJP leaders admit that the Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam has not had the impact the

party leadership expected. The party's calculation that some cracks might develop in the INDIA bloc over the Act, with parties putting conditions for their support, has also not come true. All Opposition parties, including those such as the Samajwadi Party, RJD and JD(U), which opposed women's reservation in the past, voted for the Act, while demanding an OBC quota.

BJP leaders now suggest there could be another "dhamaakedaar (explosive)" move before next polls. Several Opposition leaders continue to believe that the special session was not meant for the passage of the women's Bill alone, and that the BJP leadership had to drop its "real plans" due to some reasons.

The apprehension that one nation-one election could be on the BJP's mind has settled to some extent with the declaration of the Assembly poll schedule for five states in November. Last week, Haryana Chief Minister

Manohar Lal Khattar also seemed to pour water on this by insisting that Assembly elections in the state would be held as due, after the Lok Sabha polls next year.

Clearly, there is set to be a spike in anti-Pakistan fervour. Recently, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said that under PM Modi, India's goal was reclaiming Gilgit and Baltistan in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir. "We have only just begun walking north. The journey will end when we reach the remaining parts of (PoK), Gilgit and Baltistan," he said.

Last month, Union minister and former Army chief V K Singh said at a press conference in poll-bound Rajasthan: "Pakistan-occupied Kashmir will become a part of India on its own."

On Sunday, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said: "If Ram Janmabhoomi can be reclaimed after 500 years, why not Sindh?"

Under pressure: Israel-Hamas war casts its shadow

GLOBAL MARKETS, including India, on Monday came under pressure in a global risk-off move following the eruption of a growing conflict between Israel and the Palestinian Islamist group Hamas. The BSE Sensex fell by 0.73 per cent, or 483 points, to 65,512.39 and the NSE Nifty index fell 141 points to 19,512.35 in the sell-off. If the war persists for a long time, stocks and the rupee are likely to come under pressure, analysts cautioned. On Wall Street, stocks sank ahead of the bell on Monday as the Middle East conflict added a dose of geopolitical risk to the interest-rate and inflation concerns already facing markets. Dow Jones futures dropped roughly 0.5 per cent or about 175 points. S&P 500 futures lost about 0.6 per cent, while contracts on the tech-heavy Nasdaq 100 fell over 0.8 per cent. The Middle East conflict pushed investors toward safe-haven assets as this negative trigger is the latest in the list including the macro-economic uncertainties in Europe and China, hawkish central banks and already rising oil prices. While foreign investors pulled out close to Rs 1,000 crore from the cash market on Monday, domestic institutions led by mutual funds and insurance companies prevented a bigger fall by purchasing stocks worth Rs 2661 crore. "An unforeseen escalation in the Middle East has rekindled pessimism in global markets. Moreover, the rapid surge in oil prices

Unemployment rate drops to 6.6% in urban areas in Q1

URBAN UNEMPLOYMENT rate in April-June, the first quarter of fiscal 2023-24, slid to 6.6 per cent, the quarterly bulletin of Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) released by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) on Monday showed. Even though the unemployment rate for urban areas, which was at the lowest level since the launch of the PLFS bulletin in 2018, nearly 14 states recorded a higher urban unemployment rate than the national average. For males, the urban unemployment rate, based on current weekly status for persons above 15 years, declined to 5.9 per cent in Q1 from 6 per cent in the previous quarter and 7.1 per cent in the year-ago period. For females as well, the unemployment rate eased to 9.1 per cent in the April-June period from 9.2 per cent in the previous quarter and 9.5 per cent in the year-ago period. Employment of both males and females, however, increased in self-employed categories, such as own account worker, and helper in household enterprise.

Unemployment rate for youth for urban females in the age group 15-29 years went up to 23.4 per cent in Q1 from 22.9 per cent in the previous quarter but fell from 23.9 per cent in the year-ago period. For urban males in the 15-29 years age group, the unemployment rate went up to 15.9 per cent from 15.6 per cent in the previous quarter, but was lower than 17.4 per cent in April-June 2022. In the urban areas, states/UTs, which recorded higher than national average unemployment rate, included Himachal Pradesh (13.8 per cent), Rajasthan (11.7 per cent), Chhattisgarh (11.2 per cent), Jammu and Kashmir (10.9 per cent) and Kerala (10 per cent). States/UTs which posted a lower-than-national average unemployment rate were Delhi (2.7 per cent), Gujarat (2.8 per cent), West Bengal (4.4 per cent), Bihar (6.1 per cent), Maharashtra and Haryana (6.5 per cent each). The Ministry said that the key labour market indicators of Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR), Worker Population Ratio (WPR) and unemployment rates improved in urban areas in the first quarter for persons of age 15 years and above, compared to the pre-pandemic period. "LFPR for persons of age 15 years and above in CWS ranged from 46.2 per cent to 47.8 per cent during the pre-pandemic period. LFPR during April-June 2023 was 48.8 per cent which is higher than the labour force participation rate observed in the quarters covered in the pre-pandemic period." "WPR for persons of age 15 years and above in CWS ranged from 41.8 per cent to 44.1 per cent during the pre-pandemic period. WPR during April-June 2023 was 45.5 per cent which is higher than the worker population ratio observed in the quarters covered in the pre-pandemic period," it said. Banks to see decline in NIM on higher cost of deposits

HITESH VYAS MUMBAI, OCTOBER 9

BANKS ARE likely to see a further compression in their net interest margins (NIM) in the second quarter of the current fiscal (on a sequential basis) due to higher cost of deposits. In the April-June quarter, banks' NIM - the difference between the interest earned and the interest paid by a bank - declined on a sequential basis. Analysts expect banks to maintain a healthy profit after tax (PAT) and asset quality is likely to improve in the April-June quarter, with slippages under control. Even credit costs will remain stable, with bank credit growth expected to be in the range of 15-17 per cent year-on-year (YoY) basis and deposits rising by 12-13 per cent in the quarter. Axis Securities, in a report, said lending yields will continue to remain largely stagnant with only limited benefit flowing in from MCLR (marginal cost of funds-based lending rates) linked loan repricing, while cost of funds will continue its upward trajectory. "Thus, margin compression for banks will continue even in Q2FY24. However, for a few banks, the quantum of compression could be marginally lower sequentially," Axis securities said in its earnings preview report. With a calibrated rise in yields and rising cost of deposits, systemic NIM had peaked in the second half of FY23 and saw some decline on a quarter-on-quarter (QoQ) basis in the first quarter of the current fiscal. "While card (deposit) rates have been relatively stable, we still see upward pressure on outstanding cost of deposits due to deposits repricing and thus expect QoQ decline in NIM for Q2FY24," ICICI Securities said in a report. On a QoQ basis, ICICI Securities see up to 10 basis points (bps) decline in NIM for Axis Bank, Bandhan Bank, Yes Bank and State Bank of India and 15-20 bps dip for Kotak Mahindra Bank, Karur Vysya Bank and South Indian Bank. It expects a flattish to posi-

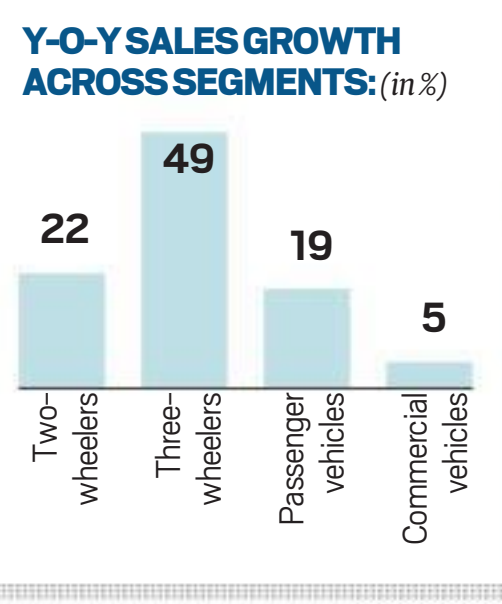

APSEZ stocks tank by 4.8% as firm readies a business continuity plan

THE STOCK prices of Adani Ports and Special Economic Zone (APSEZ), that operates the Haifa port in Israel, tanked by over 4.8 per cent on BSE, Monday. The Gautam Adani-led group firm said it is closely monitoring the action on ground and are prepared with a business continuity plan.

"We are closely monitoring the action on ground, which is concentrated in South Israel. Haifa port in northern part of Israel is operational. We have taken measures to ensure safety of our employees and all of them are safe. We remain fully alert and prepared with a business continuity plan that will enable us to respond effectively to any eventuality," a spokesperson from the firm stated. "The overall contribution of

Haifa in APSEZ's numbers is relatively small at 3 per cent of the total cargo volume. For the current financial year, we have guided for Haifa Cargo volumes range of 10-12 MMT and APSEZ's total cargo volume guidance of 370-390 MMT. In the initial six months of FY24, APSEZ's total cargo volume was 203 MMT, of which the Haifa share is 6 MMT. We stay confident of APSEZ's business performance," the spokesperson added.

Carbon reduction cannot be achieved via EVs alone: Maruti

EVEN AS Maruti Suzuki, India's biggest carmaker, looks to introduce electric vehicles in its portfolio, the company said that carbon reduction targets in the short to medium term cannot be achieved through EVs alone. "About 75 per cent of electricity is still generated by burning coal and demand for electricity is rising due to economic growth. In this decade, a mix of technologies is necessary to lower the carbon footprint," the company said in a

presentation made to investors. Maruti Suzuki is projecting a requirement of 4 million production capacity by 2031, and its product mix will include petrol cars, electric vehicles, hybrid cars, cars using CNG, cars equipped for 20 per cent or more ethanol and possibly cars operating on compressed biogas. This is in line with the technology-agnostic approach being sought by automakers such as Maruti Suzuki and Toyota Kirloskar Motor, which spells out emission objectives that manufacturers have to meet, irrespective of technology. And there are a lot of technologies to choose from. Currently, the Centre offers clear tax incentives for primarily one category of cars, with practically all other vehicular technological platforms clubbed together towards the upper end of the tax bracket. The government's electric mobility is largely focussed on battery electric vehicles as the platform of choice to replace the internal combustion engine vehicles, with Li-ion seen as the most viable battery option for now. "This mixture of technologies is necessary in the context of meeting the carbon footprint targets and taking into account the

buying power of customers, infrastructure situation, and the raw materials available in the country for generating clean power," Maruti Suzuki said. The carmaker, which has yet to launch an electric vehicle in India unlike some of its biggest competitors, expects that around 20 per cent of cars sold by the company by 2031 would be EVs. Another 25 per cent could be hybrids and the rest would use ethanol, CNG and possibly CBG (Compressed Bio Gas). With six new EV launches lined up, the carmaker's portfolio will swell from 17 offerings to around 28 models. The total capex required to aid future growth will be as much as Rs 1.25 lakh crore, the company told its investors. The company is aiming to add 2 million additional capacity in the next seven years, with work already having started at Kharkhoda in Haryana where the first line of 250,000 units is expected to go into production in early 2025 and, which could reach a 1 million capacity in 2028. A second site for 1 million units is under selection and work will start in 2024. FULL REPORT ON www.indianexpress.com

India watching military conflict in the Middle East closely, says Puri

INDIA, THE world's third-biggest oil importer, is watching the ongoing conflict in the Middle East closely, the country's oil minister Hardeep Singh Puri said on Monday.

Oil prices rose over \$3 a barrel on Monday as military clashes between Israel and the Palestinian Islamist group Hamas deepened political uncertainty across the Middle East and raised concerns about supplies. "The place where action is taking place is in many respects the centre of global energy... as we go along we will navigate through this," Puri told reporters at an industry event in New Delhi. Global uncertainties of such nature encourage people to use sustainable, cleaner fuels, Puri said, adding that \$100 per barrel crude oil prices was unsustainable. Higher oil prices typically lead to surge in inflation and hurts growth in large-scale im-

porter like India. Last week, India had urged oil producers to show "sensitivity" towards consuming countries, hit by prices largely trading above \$90 a barrel since Saudi Arabia and Russia decided to extend voluntary cuts to year-end. Talking about biofuel in India, he said, "We reached the target of 10 per cent ethanol blending five months beforehand. Now we are at 12 per cent, and the target of 20 per cent by 2025 can be achieved easily".

FM to attend World Bank, IMF meet in Morocco

FINANCE MINISTER Nirmala Sitharaman will embark on a six-day official visit on Tuesday to Marrakech, Morocco, to attend the World Bank-International Monetary Fund annual meet, along with the G20 FMCBG meeting. Besides, bilateral meetings with Indonesia, Morocco, Brazil, Switzerland, Germany and France are scheduled to take place between October 11 and 15, 2023, in Marrakech. The Indian delegation for the annual meetings will be led by the Finance Minister, and comprise officials from the Ministry of Finance and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), an official statement said on Monday. During the visit, it added, Sitharaman and RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das will co-chair the fourth G20 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors (FMCBG) meeting.

BoB hikes retail term deposit rates by 50 bps across various tenors

ENSECONOMIC BUREAU MUMBAI, OCTOBER 9

STATE-RUN Bank of Baroda (BoB) on Monday announced to increase interest rates on its domestic retail term deposits by up to 50 basis points (bps) across various tenors up to three years. These new rates are applicable on deposits below Rs 2 crore with immediate effect, the bank said in a release. The bank is offering interest rates of up to 7.4 per cent per annum for general citizens and up to 7.9 per cent for senior citizens, which includes 0.5 per cent per annum of additional interest for senior citizens and 0.15 per cent for non-callable deposits. For deposits maturing in 91 to 180 days, the lender has raised the interest rate of 5 per cent from 4.5 per cent for the general public. The interest rates on deposits maturing in 181-210 days deposits and 211 to 270 days have been revised up by 25 bps to 5.5 per cent and 6 per cent re-

spectively. The revised rate for 271 to less than one-year deposit is 6.25 per cent as against 5.75 per cent earlier for the general public. The Bank has also increased bulk deposit interest rates (for deposits from Rs 2 crore to Rs 10 crore by up to one per cent (100 bps) across various tenors. BoB is the first lender to increase deposit rates after the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) announced its monetary policy on October 6. In the policy, the central bank left the repo rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent for the fourth consecutive time. RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das said that the transmission of the 250 bps (since March 2022) increase in the repo rate to lending and deposit rates is still incomplete. The weighted average domestic term deposit rate (WADTDR) on fresh deposits of banks has increased by 233 bps in the current tightening cycle. The corresponding increase in outstanding term deposit rates is even lower at 157 bps.

DEIF, WHEELCHAIR-BOUND, SHADOWY HEAD OF THE HAMAS MILITARY WING

VIOLENCE HAS been raging ever since the Palestinian militant organisation Hamas launched an unprecedented attack on Israel on Saturday. Mohammed Deif, the leader of Hamas's military wing Izz ad-Din al-Qassam Brigades, said "Operation Al-Aqsa Storm" had been in launched in response to the 16-year blockade of Gaza, the Israeli occupation, and recent incidents that heightened Israeli-Palestinian tensions.



Deif has been the head of Hamas's military wing since 2002.

Who is Mohammed Deif?

Deif has been the head of Hamas's military wing since 2002. According to a recent profile in the *Financial Times*, he was born Mohammed Diab Ibrahim al-Masri in the Khan Younis refugee camp in Gaza during the 1960s.

The report said either Deif's uncle or father had taken part in the 1950s raids by armed Palestinians into the same area that Hamas fighters infiltrated in Israel on Saturday. Deif later went on to join the Islamic University of Gaza.

What role has Deif played in Hamas?

Hamas was founded in the late 1980s, after the beginning of the first Palestinian intifada, or uprising, against Israel's occupation of the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

According to *FT*, Deif was in his 20s around the time of the first intifada. He was later jailed by the Israelis, who held him responsible for the death of dozens of people in suicide bombings, including a wave in 1996 that killed more than 50 civilians. "Deif is said to have studied under Yahya Ayyash, a bombmaker with the

nickname "Engineer" who was assassinated by Israel in 1996," the *FT* report said. Around this time, Deif became further involved in the Qassam Brigades.

Why is he on a wheelchair?

According to the *BBC*, although he took over as commander of Hamas's military wing in July 2002, Deif had been at the top of Israel's "most wanted" list for years, and has narrowly escaped the Israeli army's efforts to kill him on several occasions.

The US State Department has designated him as a terrorist.

In 2014, Israel confirmed that it tried to assassinate Deif with a targeted strike on a house, in which his wife and seven-month-old son were believed to have been killed.

The many attempts have reportedly left him in a wheelchair after losing an arm and a leg, according to *FT*, while other organisations have claimed he has also lost an eye.

IN JANUARY 2018, Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu joined Prime Minister Narendra Modi at Teen Murti Chowk in the heart of New Delhi to pay homage to Indian soldiers who fell in the Battle of Haifa in Israel a century ago.

The chowk was renamed Teen Murti Haifa Chowk, its three statues commemorating the heroism of the lancers from Jodhpur, Mysore, and Hyderabad who were part of the Imperial Service Cavalry Brigade, and had distinguished themselves in the Sinai and Palestine campaign during World War I.

Before Haifa, Gaza

Ten months before Haifa, the lancers and Gurkha riflemen played a key role in another battle, fought south of Haifa in a land hugging the same Mediterranean coastline. The Third Battle of Gaza in November 1917 became the turning point in the Palestine campaign.

The Indians fought alongside the Empire's forces against the Ottomans under German General Kress von Kressenstein and the Yildirim Army Group led by Erich von Falkenhayn, who had been the Prussian Minister of War and Chief of the German General Staff. This Ottoman unit contained elements of the German Asia Corps.

The Imperial Service Cavalry Brigade cut through Gaza and advanced up to the north-east end of the Gaza Strip. Intense manoeuvres and engagements later, the Ottoman forces retreated.

20-lakh Patti

Indians call the Gaza Strip the Gaza patti. And it is just that — a sliver of land between Israel and Egypt, the Mediterranean to its west, home to more than 20 lakh Palestinians in an area barely 365 sq km in size, one of the most densely populated regions on the planet.

The Gaza Strip and West Bank constitute the State of Palestine, and India became one of the first countries to grant it recognition in 1988. Eight years later, India opened a representative office in Gaza, which was shifted in 2003 to Ramallah, a city in the West Bank and the *de facto* capital of the State of Palestine.

In February 2018, a month after he hosted Netanyahu in New Delhi, Modi became the first Indian Prime Minister to visit Palestine, where he was received by President Mahmoud Abbas and laid a wreath at the mausoleum of Yasser Arafat in Ramallah.

The puppet state

Occupied by the British in 1918 after the defeat of the Ottomans in the Great War, Gaza passed into Egyptian hands following the 1948 Arab-Israeli War at the end of the British Mandate for Palestine. An All-Palestine Government functioned as an Egyptian puppet regime, but that pretence ended in 1959 when it was dissolved by Gamal Abdel Nasser and Cairo's military rulers seized control of the Strip.

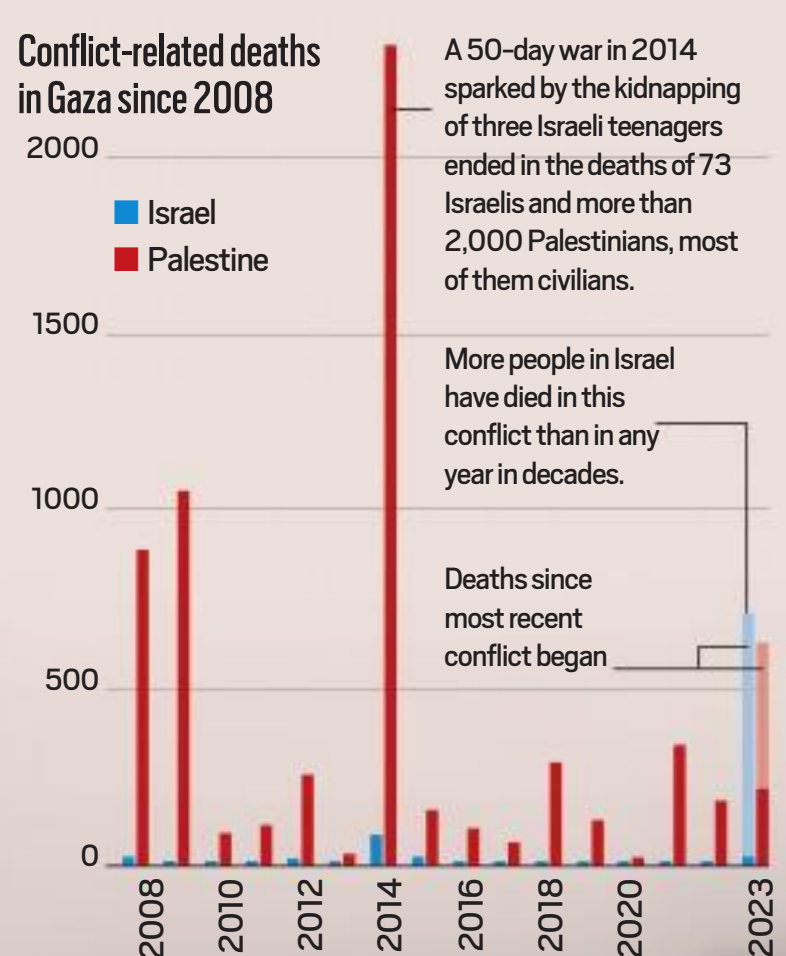
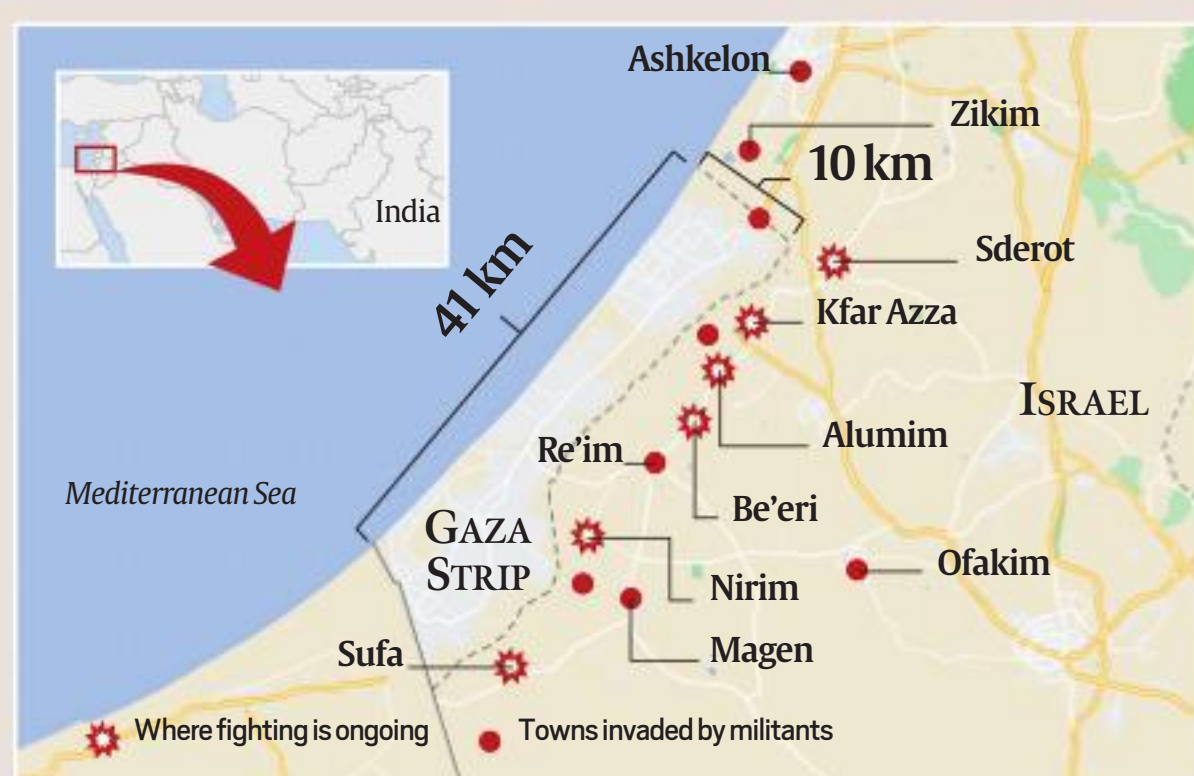

Gaza has seen many wars since then, but none as dramatic and lethal as the one that is now raging between Hamas militants and the Israeli military. Deep uncertainties lie on the road ahead

the Egyptians. It also took the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, from the Jordanians and the Golan Heights from the Syrians. The Six-Day War ended in a decisive Israeli victory.

Victory & realisation

The Yom Kippur War of October 1973, in which Israel again defeated the Arab coalition after being surprised on the Jewish holy day, was to shape the course of the present. There was realisation even in Israel that a state-of-war preparedness could not go on forever.

As the Egyptians moved out of the Soviet constellation, efforts were stepped up to negotiate a peace process. The Camp David Accords of 1978 changed politics in the region — Israel agreed to pull out of Sinai if Egypt were to establish diplomatic ties. Part of the framework of the Accords was to recognise the rights of the Palestinian people and the formation of an autonomous governing body in the Gaza Strip and West Bank.

The Accords led to the Nobel Peace Prize for President Anwar Sadat of Egypt and

Prime Minister Menachem Begin of Israel in 1978. The Egypt-Israel peace treaty followed next year, which agitated the Palestinians and prompted the Arab League to suspend Egypt. In 1981, Sadat was assassinated by the Egyptian Islamic Jihad as he watched a military parade to mark eight years of the crossing of the Suez by the Egyptians during the Yom Kippur War.

Bibi's brother

That was also the war in which Netanyahu's elder brother Yonatan, known to all as Yoni, led a special forces unit called Sayeret Matkal against the Syrians in the Golan Heights. In 1976, Yoni was killed — he was the only Israeli casualty — in the successful commando raid on Entebbe in Uganda where Palestinian and German militants were holding passengers of a hijacked Air France aircraft.

The Oslo Accords of 1993 and 1995 led to the creation of the Palestinian National Authority with the Fatah-controlled administration controlling parts of the West Bank and, until 2006, the Gaza Strip. That year, Hamas, the militant Palestinian organisation founded in 1987 with the aim of armed resistance to Israeli occupation, won the elections. A year later, they ousted Fatah — which was co-founded by Yasser Arafat in 1959 and which is now led by President Mahmoud Abbas — from Gaza, and took full control of the Strip.

Gaza exit plan

Two years before Hamas seized control, the government of Israel's Prime Minister Ariel Sharon unilaterally dismantled 21 Israeli settlements in the Gaza Strip and four in the West Bank, an action that generated considerable heat and talk inside and outside Israel.

In August 2005, Netanyahu, who was Sharon's main challenger in the Likud Party, resigned from the government as it gathered to approve the first phase of the pullout, saying he could not be part of any unilateral plan that offered nothing in return.

He told a press conference that it would embolden Hamas and Islamic Jihad to tighten their grip on Gaza and pose a danger for Israel in future.

Under the disengagement plan, Israeli settlements were dismantled, some 9,000 settlers were evicted, and the troops pulled out. Palestinians were told that under the Oslo agreements, Israel would continue to control the airspace over Gaza and the territorial waters.

The Strip had seven border crossings for movement of goods and people. Following a blockade in 2007, only the crossings at Rafah on the Egyptian end, and Erez at the Strip's northern end with Israel, can be used by people. Israel has rejected criticism that it has turned the Strip into an open-air prison.

The uncertain road

The Hamas raids inside Israel, the killings and the rocket barrage over the weekend, have turned the spotlight on Netanyahu and his government. While Israeli aircraft have been carrying out strikes in Gaza as troops and armour mass, what remains to be seen is how far the Israel Defense Forces go.

A ground offensive could lead to considerable bloodshed and engage troops in urban warfare that may not end quickly.

The Hamas and its Al-Qassam Brigades, on the other hand, would like to widen the conflict, hoping to fire anti-Israel sentiments across the region, and derail the Abraham Accords, US-mediated bilateral "normalisation" agreements signed by Israel with the UAE, Bahrain, Morocco, and Sudan in 2020 and 2021.

INTIFADA IS an Arabic word that means to "shake off". It came into popular usage in December 1987, with Palestinians using it to describe their uprising against the Israeli presence in the West Bank and Gaza.

Palestinian-American scholar Edward Said, in a 1989 essay titled *Intifada and Independence*, described the intifada as the response of a people pushed to the wall by the "bare-knuckled" Israeli attempt to rob them of their history, land, and nationhood.

The First Intifada lasted from 1987 to 1993, and the Second Intifada from 2000-05. These were popular uprisings spearheaded by Palestinian youth against powerful Israeli settlers on Palestinian land.

Tensions between Israel and the Palestinians have continued after the end

of the Second Intifada as Israel has continued to expand its presence in Palestinian territories while Palestinian organisations such as the Hamas and Palestinian Liberation Front have stepped up terror attacks and bombings.

Many have for years predicted a Third Intifada, especially amidst the rise of the ultranationalist far right in Israel with its extreme position on Palestine. The American think tank Council on Foreign Relations has noted that "2022 marked the most conflict-related deaths for both Israelis and Palestinians since 2015, and violence has continued to escalate in 2023, with the West Bank on track for its deadliest year since 2005 amid almost daily Israeli incursions."

Israel has also carried out multiple raids of the holy Al-Aqsa Mosque in Jerusalem this year, heightening tensions and eventually leading to Hamas's latest operation, named after the mosque.

ECONOMICS NOBEL 2023

How marriage, parenthood, and the pill impact women in the workforce

CLAUDIA GOLDIN, Professor of Economics at Harvard University, has won the Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel for 2023 — popularly referred to as the Nobel prize in Economics. The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences, which adjudicates on the matter, stated that Goldin has been awarded the prize "for having advanced our understanding of women's labour market outcomes".

Before her, only two women scholars — Elinor Ostrom in 2009 and Esther Duflo in 2019 — had won this honour since 1969, when this award was instituted. This is only the 26th time when this prize has been awarded to a single laureate. The award carries a prize money of 11 million Swedish kronor (or Rs 8.3 crore).

Who is Goldin?

Winning the economics Nobel might be her biggest honour yet but Goldin has been a trailblazer in the field. In 1990, she

made history when she became the first woman to be awarded tenure in the economics department of Harvard University. Getting tenure implies having a permanent appointment as a university professor that can be terminated only under extraordinary circumstances.

Goldin has been a pioneer in studying the role of women in the economy and has written several books on the topic, such as *Understanding the Gender Gap: An Economic History of American Women* (Oxford, 1990), and *Career & Family: Women's Century-Long Journey toward Equity* (Princeton University Press, 2021).

Why has she won the award?

While explaining why the Academy chose Goldin, the jury noted that Goldin had provided "the first comprehensive account of women's earnings and labour market participation through the centuries. Her research reveals the causes of change, as well as the main sources of the remaining gender gap."

The fact is that world over, women are vastly underrepresented in the labour mar-

ket. In other words, compared with men, a lower percentage of women come out of home demanding work and a lower percentage hold jobs. Moreover, when they do join the workforce, they end up earning less than men.

What explains these results? What causes women to join the workforce and

what causes them to leave it? Is it a linear relationship between economic growth and women's involvement in the labour market? In other words, does the proportion of women with jobs always rise when an economy grows, or can it fall as well? What about the role of education, marriage and child birth? Similarly, how and why does the pay structure differ between men and women?

All these are important questions for any economy and its policymakers.

To answer these, Goldin started looking at historical data in the United States. "Claudia Goldin has trawled the archives and collected over 200 years of data from the US, allowing her to demonstrate how and why gender differences in earnings and employment rates have changed over time," said the Academy. What she found fundamentally changed the world's understanding.

For instance, before Goldin's path-breaking book was published in 1990, it was widely believed — based only on data from the 20th century — that there was a clear positive association between economic

growth and the number of women in paid employment. But Goldin's study showed this was not true.

"Goldin showed that female participation in the labour market did not have an upward trend over this entire period, but instead forms a U-shaped curve. The participation of married women decreased with the transition from an agrarian to an industrial society in the early nineteenth century, but then started to increase with the growth of the service sector in the early twentieth century. Goldin explained this pattern as the result of structural change and evolving social norms regarding women's responsibilities for home and family," said the Academy.

Similarly, Goldin demonstrated that access to the contraceptive pill played an important role by offering new opportunities for career planning.

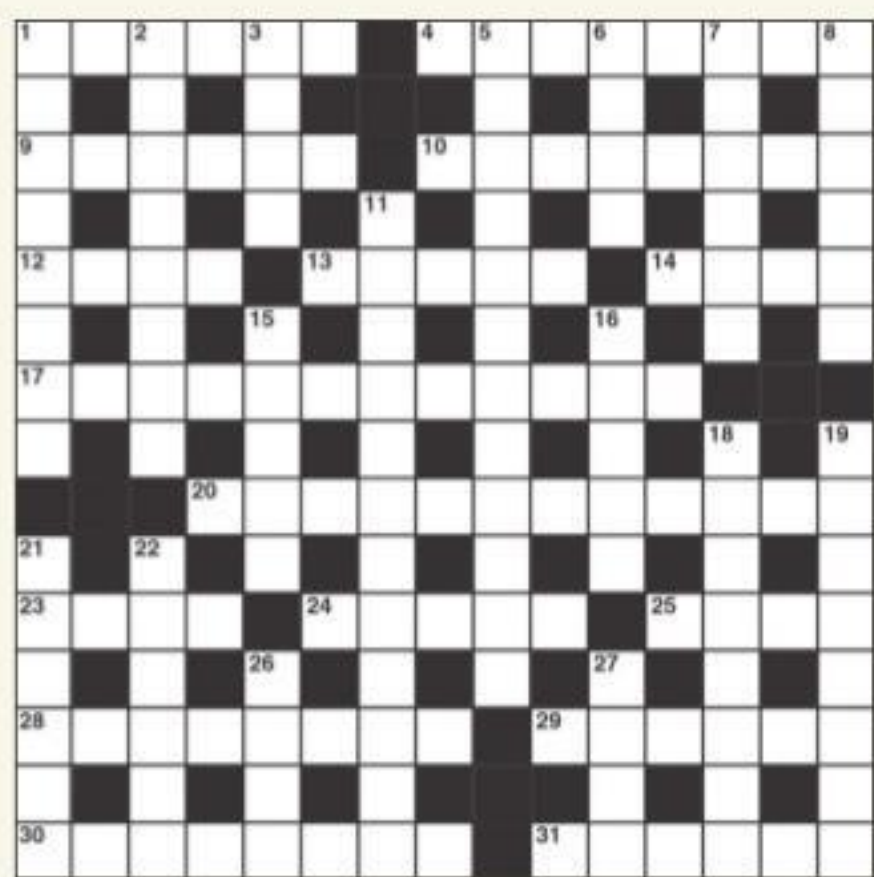
On the topic of the earnings gap between men and women, data show that despite modernisation, economic growth, and rising proportions of employed women in the 20th century, for a long period of time the earnings gap hardly closed.

"According to Goldin, part of the explanation is that educational decisions, which impact a lifetime of career opportunities, are made at a relatively young age. If the expectations of young women are formed by the experiences of previous generations — for instance, their mothers, who did not go back to work until the children had grown up — then development will be slow," the Nobel citation said.

Historically, much of the gender gap in earnings could be explained by differences in education and occupational choices. However, Goldin has shown that the bulk of this earnings difference is now between men and women in the same occupation, and that it largely arises with the birth of the first child.

"Understanding women's role in the labour market is important for society. Thanks to Claudia Goldin's groundbreaking research we now know much more about the underlying factors and which barriers may need to be addressed in the future," said Jakob Svensson, Chair of the Committee for the Prize in Economic Sciences.

HPCA blames rain and relaid grass for 'poor' outfield at venue

IT'S THE snow capped mountain behind the college end of the The HPCA Stadium in Dharamsala that most would've expected to be the lead image of the 2023 ODI World Cup arriving in town. Ahead of the second game at the venue though, it's the quality of the outfield that has become the focal point. When asked if he had any reservations about the Dharamsala outfield where his team takes on Bangladesh on Tuesday, England's captain Jos Buttler would reply, "Yeah, a few."

"It goes against everything you want to be as a team. You want to dive through a row of houses to save a run. That's obviously not ideal, the way the surface is, the outfield. We won't use it as an excuse but it's certainly going to hold yourself back from a place you want to be as a team."

Responding to the criticism, an HPCA official told The Indian Express that the state of the field has been owing to constant rains in Dharamsala in the preceding months which put the ground staff in a race against time to prepare ahead of the marquee tournament.

"(Other than IPL in April-May) This is also the best time to host the games. There were record-breaking rains in Dharamsala this time," the official said before stating that the outfield should improve by the time India play New Zealand on October 22.

The outfield at the HPCA Stadium was brought under the scanner after both Afghanistan and Bangladesh team slipped in their attempts to run after the ball in the first game at this venue.

Afghanistan's coach Jonathan Trott would term Mujeeb Ur Rahman as 'lucky' to have escaped a serious injury during his diving attempt in the deep that saw his knee get stuck.

The HPCA official responded to the Mujeeb incident: "Some 20-22 players dived before that but nothing happened. He (Mujeeb) slid on the wrong foot and got stuck. Games have been played in worse outfields than this. This is nothing. Look at the matches that were played in Sri Lanka recently. Look at the grounds in the West Indies."

Having received an 'average' rating for the game, the outfield was deemed good to go for the England-Bangladesh game after an inspection by the ICC's independent pitch consultant Andy Atkinson in consultation with the match referee for the next game, Javagal Srinath on Sunday.

"Injuries can happen anytime. But it's definitely a surface where you're going to want to be even more careful, which isn't what you want to be doing for your country. You want to put your body on the line. Guys tearing in and needing to bowl fast, they need that confidence."

"But we're professionals so we'll adapt," Buttler said. "Naturally, you see a ball, you want to dive for it. It's unique I think to be honest. I know it's going to be the same for both teams. Hopefully, fingers crossed no one on each side picks an injury."

Earlier this year, the third India-Australia Test during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy was moved from Dharamsala to Indore after HPCA had relaid the entire outfield in the lead up to the game but failed to prepare it in time for the Test.

"It was at that time that the cross marker was struck against the ground. The grass was still growing at the time and hadn't even taken roots. The entire outfield was made sand based," the local official told this newspaper.

Dharamsala is scheduled to host four more games at the ongoing World Cup and has also been named among the five venues for the India-England Test series next year.

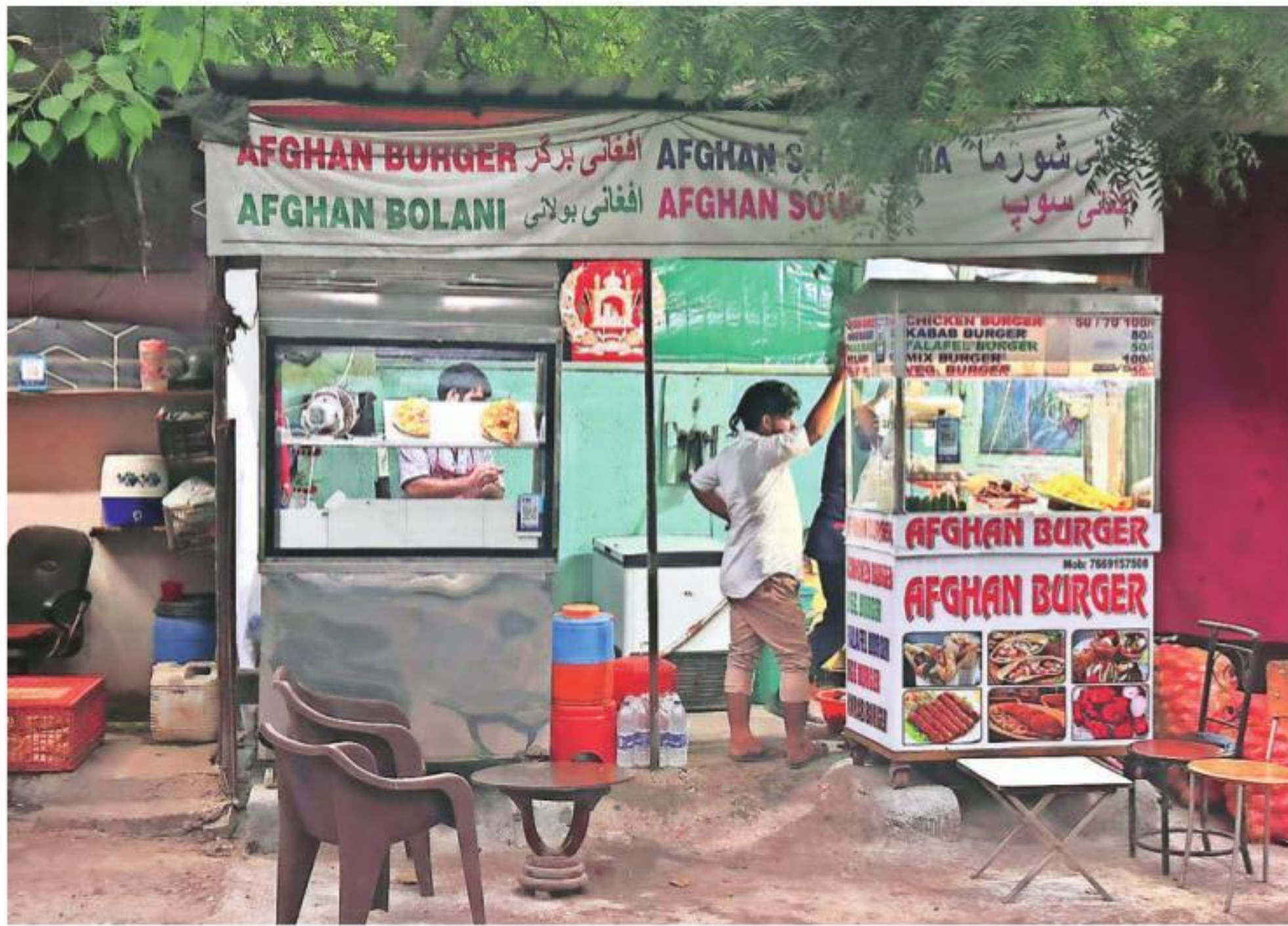
While Haseebullah is piecing together his dismantled phone his friend Mohammad Rafi shares a back story. Rafi too is an actor, he shares small roles in Akshay Kumar starrer *Housefull 3*. "He hates it when Afghanistan lose a game. He smashed his phone multiple times when Afghanistan lost a close match against Sri Lanka in the Asia Cup."

In another room at the hostel, Nazamudin Asar is drenched in sweat after playing badminton for two hours. Sipping his Afghan tea in a 12x12 ft room, he pipes up, "Are tickets available for India vs Afghanistan match? I have been trying for the past few days." He smiles as he adds, "muskil hoga nahi (It will be difficult, right?)."

Asar, 28, hails from Kandahar and has been living in India for nine years and is in the final stage of writing his PhD thesis on the India and Afghanistan trade route over the years. "I love badminton. I fell in love with the sport after I moved to Delhi in 2014. But cricket back home has grown popular because of this team. It's an emotion, a feeling, that provides entertainment to the people who don't know what the future lies for them."

Little Kabul

Mohammad Usman, a second-year Political Science (H) student from Dayal Singh College, helps his father run a grocery shop in Jangpura's Bhogal area, also known as mini Kabul, and can't wait to get a glimpse of his idol Mohammad Nabi. But he is unsure whether his abbu will allow him to go and

do a masters from JNU or Jamia and then will go for public service exams," he says with a glint in his eyes.

Usman loves Indian cricket and cricketers. He is a fan of Rishabh Pant because he hits sixes on demand and loves the aggression of Virat Kohli.

'It's a Talibani sport'

Amidst the excitement about seeing their stars in flesh and blood, there are some mixed feelings as well. Musa Khan, who runs a dry fruit shop with Haji Zahir calls it a Talibaani sport and has no interest in going or cheering for them.

"I hate cricket. It's a Talibani sport. I love football and swimming. I was in the third year of my engineering course in Kabul. Our college was run by the South Korean gov-

Newcomer Shakeel already instilling hope in Pakistan middle order

IN THE ask-the-panels forum of SAMAA TV, the agitated anchor reads out the question that has been jamming her inbox. "One good innings and people are already asking if Saud Shakeel could be the next Pakistan captain."

Shahid Afridi, one of the experts on the panel, dismissively shakes his head. Mohammad Yousof, a more restrained character, implores the fans to "leave him alone and let him focus on his batting." He tries to drill some sense: "He has had a good start in the World Cup, and let him bat peacefully. When the time for captaincy comes, we will think."

Ironically, the talk show itself is titled 'Babar versus Saud: Who is the next captain of Pakistan?'

But it's only five minutes into the 12-minute slot, after an intense debate and lament about pitches in Pakistan losing their character, that Shakeel swirls into the panel.

On Express News channel, former captain Aamir Sohail strikes a philosophical

note: "Only if you have cried for something, you will know about its value when you finally achieve it." Salman Butt takes a dig at the selection process: "In other countries, you play Tests first and then ODIs. In Pakistan, you play T20s and the ODIs. Ajeeb hain yeh."

He has been advocating picking Shakeel for some time. "If you are a good Test player, you could be good in other formats too. Look at Virat, Rahul, Babar, they are all good Test players and good in other formats too."

Shakeel has excited Pakistan, even though he is only six innings old, spread across two years, in this format.

Much of it owes to Pakistan's flimsy middle order. Since the departure of Yousof, Misbah-ul-Haq and Shoaib Malik, their middle order has looked both confused and unstable.

A raft of players flung in and out of the team, spin-bowling all-rounders Shadab Khan and Mohammed Nawaz too auditioned.

In the series against Afghanistan, they dallied with three different combinations. In the first two games, Salman Agha batted at No 5; in the third Shakeel was tried. Salman was restored for the first three

games of the Asia Cup, before they resorted to Mohammad Harris in the final match of the difficult tournament.

The crisis meant that Pakistan became a top-heavy side — between 2019 and 2023, the top three have accounted for nearly 60 percent of the runs the team has made and accounted for all the 12 hundreds in this span.

Giant shoes to fill

Shakeel has some Javed Miandad qualities — his manipulation of field is immaculate; the junctures he chooses to counter-attack are timely; the avenues he chooses are wise. He has the wits and smarts about him. But he is no Miandad.

But then, every time someone shows some promise at number four or five, Miandad creeps in subconsciously. Miandad is a high bar for any youngster to scale.

But given the shortage of quality middle-order batsmen the country has produced in recent times, the hype around Shakeel is understandable.

Little wonder then that many, including Mohammed Rizwan, believe he is a superstar in the making. "If Saud maintains

the hard work he's doing, Pakistan will have found themselves another superstar," he says, with Shakeel beside him on a couch.

The latter shuts his eyes and looks down, expressionless, as though he was deaf to the praise.

In their match-defining stand against the Netherlands, picking up Pakistan from 43/3, the trait that impressed Rizwan the most was Shakeel's shrewdness. In the 22nd over of the game, Shakeel spotted that there was an extra man outside the ring.

He did not point this out to the umpire then, because he knew that if didn't, he couldn't be given out even if he got out, for the ball would be judged a no-ball.

So, he chipped down the track and lifted Roelof van der Merwe for a four between long-on and midwicket. Then, he had a chat with the umpire, who signaled a no-ball and free-hit. He duly despatched it into the stands.

"The awareness he showed is what I liked the most about him," Rizwan would say. He would again talk up his superstar potential: "He has gifts that make him a different kind of superstar!"

PCB asks Pak govt to get involved to redress visa delays for scribes, fans

WITH PAKISTAN set to play their second World Cup fixture against Sri Lanka on Tuesday without any journalists or fans from their country, the government in Islamabad has been asked to get involved in the matter to expedite the visa process.

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) has called on the country's foreign secretary to step in and solve the ongoing impasse. According to PCB spokesperson Umar Farooq, the board's management committee chairman Zaka Ashraf met Pakistan foreign secretary Syrus Sajjad, raising concerns about the visa delays faced by their journalists and fans for their travel to India.

This meeting comes three days after the PCB first wrote to the International Cricket Council (ICC) flagging concerns about the delay faced by journalists and fans from

Pakistan. "The chairman also requested the Foreign Secretary to take up the issue with India's Home Ministry through the Pakistan High Commission Office in New Delhi. PCB is extremely disappointed to see that journalists from Pakistan and fans are still facing uncertainty about obtaining an Indian visa to cover Pakistan games in ICC World Cup 2023," Farooq said in a statement to *The Indian Express*.

Pakistan are playing their first tournament in India since the 2016 T20 World Cup. Back then, *The Indian Express* had reported, quoting Home Ministry officials, that they would be issuing 250 visas for each match for Pakistani fans. Since Pakistan played their matches only in Kolkata and Mohali, a multi-city visa was issued for their fans who could provide match ticket and accommodation details.

Last week as it became evident that no Pakistani journalist would be able to travel to Hyderabad for their opening fixture

against the Netherlands, the PCB had written to the ICC about the delay in visas being issued and cited the Members Playing Agreement (MPA) signed by the cricket boards for the World Cup, which mandates issuing visas for travelling journalists and fans.

It is learnt that the PCB had reminded the ICC about their obligations and members' agreement last week.

This paper reported that Mohammad Bashir, better known as Chicago Chacha in cricket circles, was the only Pakistan fan at the Rajiv Gandhi International Cricket Stadium in Hyderabad for the team's warm-up game against Australia. Bashir holds a US passport.

Official response

When asked about the delay in visas being issued to journalists from Pakistan and the MPA, an ICC spokesperson said, "This is an obligation of our host (India) and they are

working hard on it with our full support. Every effort is being made to get this sorted."

The *Indian Express* reached out to the Ministry of External Affairs and the Ministry of Home Affairs, but hasn't received a response yet.

A top BCCI official told this paper that a communication channel was open with the government on the 'visa issue' for Pakistan journalists and fans.

"The BCCI is following up on visas to fans and journalists with the Indian government. We are hopeful a solution will be found soon," the BCCI official said.

It is learnt that around 60 journalists from Pakistan have been granted accreditation by the ICC. "Since e-visas are not given to Pakistani journalists, most of us applied for the visa (after submitting the passport) in the first week of September," a senior journalist from Pakistan told *The Indian Express*. "But so far, we have not received any confirmation from the Indian High

Commission here. Hopefully, we will receive it next week."

As Pakistani journalists could not travel, they had to cancel hotel bookings in Hyderabad and air tickets.

Even before the World Cup began, the Pakistan team faced visa issues which led to them cancelling their two-day boot camp in Dubai. They received their Indian visas 48 hours before they were to travel for the tournament.

Journalists from Bangladesh also initially faced delays in procuring visas.

"This sort of delay has never happened," a senior journalist from Bangladesh, who has travelled to India multiple times in the past said. "We had to write to the Indian High Commission 6-7 times, which has never happened in the past. Eventually, the Bangladesh Cricket Board, with the help of our foreign ministry, put in a request on October 1 and on October 3 evening, few of us got the visas," the journalist said.

Cricket, squash all set to be included at 2028 Olympics

CRICKET IS one of the five sports that have been recommended to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) for approval by the Los Angeles 2028 Organising Committee, as reported on the Olympic Games official website on Monday.

The recommendation will first be considered by the IOC's Olympic Programme Commission, and after approval will then be sent to the IOC Executive Board. If the EB accepts the recommendation, the proposal will be sent to be ratified at the 141st IOC session, set to take place from October 15-17 in Mumbai.

Apart from cricket, the other four sports recommended for inclusion are baseball-softball, lacrosse, squash and flag football.

The *Los Angeles Times* reported that the sports are likely to be approved. "In building the Olympic sport programme, we were willing to challenge the status quo and think differently about what's possible for the Games in Los Angeles," LA28 CEO Kathy Carter said in a statement.

"We've landed on a bold and balanced proposal that will energise the Games with culturally-relevant competition and boundless possibility."

Of the five sports, three have never been included in an Olympic programme. Flag football, squash and lacrosse would make their Olympic debuts, if approved. "We are one huge step closer to a monumental milestone for our sport and international community," said World Lacrosse, the sport's governing body, in a statement. "We are on a path of ascendancy, and will be a great partner for LA28 and the IOC."

Cricket would return after appearing once at the 1900 Games, following the tremendous success for women's cricket at the 2022 Commonwealth Games. "Whilst this is not the final decision, it is a very significant landmark towards seeing cricket at the Olympics for the first time in more than a century," International Cricket Council Chairman Greg Barclay said in a statement.

Michael Payne, a former marketing and broadcast rights director of the IOC, had earlier told *The Indian Express* that the IOC was looking to tap into the Indian market and felt cricket would be the ideal vehicle.

Kiwis crush Oranje to pulp

Santner and Ravindra give New Zealand great all-round strength as Dutch outclassed by 99 runs

JUST BEFORE the toss, in the sweltering heat of Hyderabad, Kane Williamson strolled into the ground for a pitch-peep. The scant crowd went wild, yelling wildly to gather the attention of the Sunrisers Hyderabad captain. Williamson acknowledged with a warm wave and their day was already made. The buzz then was whether the recovering-from-injury captain would feature in the match. He did not.

But for New Zealand it did not seem to matter, as they rolled over the Netherlands without much strain, trumping them by 99 runs, headlined by Mitchell Santner's all-round heroics.

Suddenly, with two thumping wins in as many games, hopes of them walking one step further than they had in the last two editions is swelling. It is not a mere illusion. For, they are getting stronger by the day, even without Williamson and seamer Tim Southee. Against the Dutch, came back their middle-over enforcer and death-over destroyer, Lockie Ferguson. Returning from a niggles that confined him to the bench against England, he reproduced the usual bark and bite.

Though he went wicketless, he looked the most penetrative of New Zealand's seamers, pounding the deck as hard as he could. He mostly shaped the ball into the right-hander, but made the odd ball seam away, much to the dread of the Dutch batsmen. After repeatedly being beaten, they started throwing the bat at him, crease-tied, and were beaten for pace.

Even without Southee, the pace firm looks fearsome. Trent Boult swung the new ball both ways, bowled the left-handed Vikramjit Singh with a corker that bent in before holding the line; Matt Henry hustled them with extra bounce and pace. Southee's spot, even if he is fully fit, would be uncertain. Were there ever any doubt about the quality of this attack, skilled and experienced as they are?

A more pressing concern would have been the form of the spinners. The only specialist is Ish Sodhi; Mitchell Santner is the typical utilitarian bowler-batsman; Rachin Ravindra is more a batsman than a bowler, though his coaches in Wellington swear that he is a more natural bowler than he is a batsman.

Both are typical economy-over-strike rate bowlers, their first purpose is to save runs rather than purchase wickets. Neither have eye-popping variations. Santner has the standard left-arm orthodox spinner's away-spin-

ner, an undisguised arm-ball (just watch the arm-speed and release). The carrom-ball that he christened "crack" has hardly been spotted these days.

But he does his job, keeps tight length, shuffles pace, keeps the batsman glued to the crease and on surfaces with an ounce of help, he could make the ball grip off the surface. He would later elaborate on his craft: "You could be a bit more aggressive on these tracks with a bit more help, especially with the field settings. I had a mid-up for most of the time. The lines too was more attack-

ing than I would have back home. It's about adjusting."

In his first spell—which began in the ninth over—he coerced considerable side spin. The textbook double-bluff fetched the first of his five wickets—he would spin a few away from the New Zealand-born Max O'Dowd and then rip in the snappier arm ball. O'Dowd merely planted his front-foot and was duly adjudged leg before the wicket. Deception does not come easier.

But thereafter, before the wicket-flurry at the death, Santner lost his fabled control that reflects on his overall economy rate of 4.86, often erring on the shorter side. He leaked 5.9 runs an over, but he would swap it any day for a five-wicket haul. Besides, he had held himself firmly against a progressive England (2/37 in 10 overs). But like two friends standing up for each other in duress, Rachin Ravindra bowled thriftily and pumped pressure at the other end.

He is considerably quicker (with a quicker action too) and flatter than Santner, gets more skid but less side-spin than him. If he was wayward against England, conceding 76 in his 10 overs.

The pair furnished ludicrous balance to the team. Rachin bats at No 3, has scored a hundred and half-century in two innings, bowled 10 overs in both games and snared three wickets.

Santner has picked seven wickets in two games, besides crunching a rope-a-dope 17-ball 36 not out that included a pair of sixes in the last two balls.

One breathes top-odor stability, the other offers death-over ballast. Williamson would not wait to make his comeback—he would be jumping on his bed, Santner chimes in—and weave a net of invincibility around them. The captain would make one more appearance to thank the ground from the boundary ropes.

Behind success of Satwik-Chirag: Un-pushy parents and clever coaches

FOR CHANDRASHEKHAR Shetty, his son Chirag had made him absolutely proud, the day he won the Nationals. His friends in Mumbai often told him badminton was no sport to make a great career in, there was only cricket. But a young Chirag absolutely adored badminton, so the father decided he would support that hobby, without ever pressuring him on the ambition to be a world-beater. The National title brought contentment to the Shettys.

The World No 1 ascent on Tuesday - October 10 official rankings - will be a culmination of international title wins accumulated over the past year.

"Everything above the National title is a bonus for me as a parent. He was good for me the day he won Nationals. Chirag and Satwik have been doing well for themselves for 3-4 years now. The Asian Games gold was for India. My son wanted to play doubles badminton so I backed his decision and supported him," Chandrashekhari Shetty tells this newspaper.

For Satwiksairaj Rankireddy, the most challenging phases of his journey were when he was rehabbing his way out of injuries, missing the Asian Mixed Team event even. Biding his time as the bones and tendons

healed, he would slip into darkness whenever he was away from the sport. A bout of covid during the pandemic had also dragged him down, as he slowly learnt to cope with resting, when away from the adrenaline of the sport.

It got tough when he was alone in the Hyderabad home, dealing with an injury at the start of the year. His parents Kasi Viswanath and Rangamani would travel from Amalapuram and keep him company to get through those phases. His brother Ramcharan is his bouncing board ahead of tournaments, and is known to cook his comfort food when he first lost and subsequently won the French Open in the course of this journey.

National coach and mentor Pullela Gopichand has often talked about how Kasi Viswanath, himself a state level player and international umpire, ceded the crucial decision-making to Satwik's coaches, never interfering and trusting him when he told the father that his son ought to play doubles, not singles.

Gopichand had his hunch that Satwik had the game for the long haul in doubles, and the conviction to persuade Viswanath that it was the right decision - this at a time when Saina, Sindhu and Srikanth were at the top, and the visible posters.

Through personalised attention in their physical strengthening which is a bedrock of their game at the turn of their 20s, and by

getting them the right technical expertise, the coach also knew when to step back, and let Mathias Boe, take over.

Lasting piece of advice

While Boe is the brains and backbone behind the duo and they acknowledge the sacrifices he makes by staying away from Denmark to accompany them, the Malaysian coach Tan Kim Her left a lasting piece of ad-

vice too besides bringing them together. Chandrashekhari Shetty recalls, "Coach Tan told them very early that they need to be friends off-court first before their on-court chemistry kicks in, and that has stayed with both," he says. They worked on the bonding with meals together, and sharing rooms and trading music and food tastes, getting past the early language barriers.

While Satwik was shepherded towards

doubles early by Gopichand, Chirag's start of the doubles journey saw coach Uday Pawar keep him in the right lane. The Mumbai coach even sent an inimitable and stern message to Shetty after the semifinal win at Hangzhou, when the World No 1 was almost confirmed and they were celebrating entering the gold medal final. "They looked far too happy after the semis, lying down and hugging and I told Chirag the final is yet to be won. So don't relax, stay focussed and keep the fire," he recalls.

Pawar would also text Boe urging him to stay on till he made them 'complete players', not merely winning the World Championships or Olympics.

He had waited until 4-5 days after they returned from World Championships without a medal, to connect with Shetty. "I messaged him, Call me when free. And he rung up in 30 seconds. We talked about different conditions in Europe," he says, about honest debriefings that kept the two on their toes.

Till 15, Chirag hadn't won much in juniors, but what struck Pawar was just how much of a belief he had in himself. He might be all fiery and fire on court, but the boy was calm and courteous off it. "He's always been a fighter with great self-belief. There's no hero worship in him, and he's never in awe of anyone which made him a good player even back then."

Pawar recalls a junior meet in Panchkula

where Shetty had progressed deep in u17 singles, u17 and u19 doubles. A match against Chirag Sen, Lakshya's brother, saw Shetty tire out, and he would lose the u17 doubles to a UP pairing.

"After the Maharashtra state selection, I had asked him 'are you happy being quarter-finalist in singles' as he was ranked No 8. But playing all those singles matches left him stiff and tired for doubles. After losing in singles quarters, I told Chirag to come to practice courts 45 minutes before the u19 doubles and start their knocking. They went on to beat top seeds and I convinced him he would have to work thrice as much harder to win singles titles. So he shifted."

Shetty wasn't sure initially of moving to Hyderabad as Coach Tan wanted him and partner, MR Arjun from Kerala, to camp at one centre. Pawar would persuade him to try for six months. The next important decision was swapping partners as Tan felt two tall, strong guys with skills could wind up into something massive and 'SatChi' came into being.

The duo overcame a lot of jagged edges and jarring notes to make it work. On the final ascent, Boe has bolstered their defense, made their attack premium, and taught them the endgame sorcery - for there were matches they once lost from 20-17 up. They barely needed to hit the high gears winning Asiaad gold, but the Olympics will see the Indonesians and Chinese strike back.
